

AGENDA 1: UCAPAN ALUAN PENGERUSI / CHAIRMAN'S ADDRESS

1.1 YBhg. Tan Sri Dato' Sri Presiden mengalu-alukan kehadiran semua ahli di Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan BAM ke-75, termasuk wakil-wakil daripada PDRM dan MSN. Ini juga merupakan kali pertama BAM mengadakan Mesyuarat Agung secara fizikal dan kehadiran maya disebabkan pandemik yang melanda negara kita. Oleh itu, kehadiranadalah amat menggalakkan untuk mesyuarat ini.

YBhg Tan Sri Dato' Sri President welcomed all members to the 75th BAM Annual General Meeting (AGM), including the representatives of PDRM dan MSN. This is the first time BAM's AGM was held both in pyhsical and virtual presence due to the current pandemic. Therefore, the attendance for this meeting was most encouraging.

- 1.2 Dalam ucapan alu-aluannya, Tan Sri Dato' Sri Presiden menarik perhatian semua ahli kepada beberapa sorotan pada tahun 2019, iaitu:
 - a. BAM telah merangka pelan strategik baru yang merangkumi pelan jangka pendek iaitu program 'Road to Tokyo (RTT)', pelan jangka sederhana yang dipanggil 'Projek 24' dan pelan jangka panjang yang melibatkan perancangan yang berbeza dan 'out-of-the box', di mana pemain-pemain muda berpotensi besar akan diberi keutamaan dan juga memupuk budaya kecemerlangan sertamentaliti kemenangan dan perasaan cintakan negara dalam skuad kebangsaandi ABM.
 - b. Selain itu, Jawatankuasa Kejurulatihan dan Latihan (CnT) telah diarah untuk bekerjasama lebih rapat lagi dengan Jawatankuasa Pembangunan untuk menggunapakai Indeks Prestasi Utama (KPI) yang sistematik bagi barisan kejurulatihan supaya hanya pemainpemain, jurulatih serta staf-staf sokongan terbaik sahaja yang berkhidmat di ABM.
 - c. Semasa Negara kita diletakkan di bawah Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan (PKP), pihak BAM kekal proaktif sepanjang tempoh sekatan pergerakan, malah latihan diteruskan di semua peringkat agar pemain-pemain dapat mempertingkatkan tahap kecergasan dan juga kompetitif mereka. Konsep latihan 'quarantine- based' telah diamalkan dengan jayanya sambil mematuhi SOP yang ketat.

In his welcome speech, YBhg. Tan Sri Dato' Sri President highlighted the following 2019 events:

- a. BAM's new strategic plan, which encompasses the short term plan named Road to Tokyo (RTT), with the objective of achieving excellence in Tokyo 2020; the medium term plan called 'Project 24' and finally, the long term plan, with the objectives to embrace unconventional methods and out-of-the-box thinking to fast-track certain players with potential and instill a culture of excellence, winning mentality with grit and a sense of national pride within the national team at the ABM.
- b. The Coaching and Training Committee was also instructed to work closely with the Development Committee to tabulate proper KPI's for the coaching teams to ensure only the best players remain in ABM. It was vital that we have the best players, coaches and support services staff members at the national badminton centre of excellence.
- c. When our nation was placed under Movement Control Order (MCO), BAM continued to be proactive throughout the lockdown and amidst that period, training sessions and various programmes were designed to ensure the players improve their fitness level and competitiveness. BAM conducted the quaratine- based training sessions with strict SOP's in place.






BAM Full Time Administration / Secretariat






BAM Coaches and Athletes

MEETINGS

Annual General Meeting (AGM)

The 75th. BAM AGM which was supposed to have been done in April 2020 in conjunction with the organising of the Celcom Axiata Malaysia Open 2020 in Axiata Arena Bukit Jalil, had to be postponed a few times up to 2021, the result of the prolonged clamp down by the government throughout the country due to escalating spread of Covid-19.

Ultimately it was finally held on 9 January 2021 at the ABM Auditorium, Akademi Badminton Malaysia, Bukit Kiara, Kuala Lumpur both on physical attendance as well as on virtual attendance following the strict SOPs imposed.

36 members with voting rights and 3 representatives from 3 Associate Members were present at the AGM.

3. ACTIVITY REPORTS

- 3.1 The start of year 2020 provided us with both good and sad shocking news.
 - 3.1.1 First, the good news We managed to organise the annual PERODUA Malaysia Masters, presented by Daihatsu 2020 brilliantly on 7 12th January with the participation of almost all top players of the world as it was the first BWF World Tour Super tournament which provided qualification points for 2020 Tokyo Olympics. As expected, world number one Men's Singles, Kento Momota of Japan came out tops beating Viktor Axelsen of Denmark for the gold. So were Chen Yu Fei (CHN WS), Kim Ki Jung / Lee Yong Dae (KOR MD), Li Wen Mei/Zheng Yu (CHN WD) and Zheng Si Wei / Huang Ya Qiong (CHN-XD). Our players, Lee Zii Jia (MS) and Chan Peng Soon / Goh Liu Ying (XD) were semi-finalists in their respective events. YABhg. Tun Dr. Siti Hasmah Mohd Ali was among the dignitaries present to award prizes to the winners.



- 3.1.2 Kento Momota, Japanese coach Yu Hirayama, physiotherapist Morimoto Akifumi and a crew of the Tournament Livescore team, Foster William Thomas of England were involved in an accident while en-route to KLIA for their flights. The driver of the van, Bavan Nageswaran from Newtoview Travel Tours Sdn. Bhd. died on the spot. The injured were transferred to Putrajaya Hospital.
- 3.1.3 We wish to thank Putrajaya Hospital authorities for their assistance in admitting and treating those injured with strict control to avoid global media harassment. BAM President, Dato' Sri Mohamad Norza Zakaria was on hand most of the time to ensure the injured received the best treatment Putrajaya Hospital could offer. Officials of the Association were also stationed at the hospital throughout.
- 3.1.4 Among the VIPs who visited the injured were YABhg. Datin Seri Dr. Wan Azizah Dr. Wan Ismail, the Deputy Prime Minister of Malaysia and Patron of BAM, YABhg. Tun Dr. Siti Hasmah Mohd Ali, wife of Malaysia's Prime Minister and former Patron of BAM, YB. Datuk Seri Dr. Dzulkifly Ahmad, the Minister of Health and YB Syed Saddiq Abdul Rahman, Minister of Youth and Sports Malaysia.
- 3.1.5 All the injured parties, including Momota and his counterparts left the Putrajaya Hospital for KLIA en-route to Tokyo and Foster Thomas to Jakarta on Wednesday morning, 15^{th} . January 2020 amidst full global media coverage.
- 3.2 On the performance of our players, Year 2020 gave us a glimmer of hope for our rising stars, both Seniors and Juniors in major international tournaments with:
 - Lee Zii Jia (MS) creating upsets in both the Malaysia Masters in January and the All-England in March, coming out as Runner-up in both Championships
 - Aaron Chia / Soh Wooi Yik (MD) and Tan Kia Meng / Lai Pei Jing (XD) were at their best at the Indonesia Masters also in January to place themselves as Runners-up.
 - Ong Yew Sin / Teo Ee Yi (MD) became Champions with Tan Kian Meng / Lai Pei Jing (XD) as Runners-up both at the Thailand Masters also in January.
 - At the Badminton Asia Team Championships in Manila in February, our Men's team came out Runners-up winning the Silver Medals and the Women's Team winning the Bronze medals, thus qualifying by merit to participate at the Thomas / Uber Cup Finals in Denmark, supposedly to have been played in October 2020.
 - At the Spain Masters (BWF World Tour Super 300) also in February, Aaron Chia / Soh Wooi Yik partnership again became Runners-Up.
 - At the Dutch Junior International GP (26 Feb 1 Mar 2020), Kok Jing Hong (MS), Arif Junaidi / Muhammad Haikal (MD) and Low Yeen Yuan /



- Muhammad Haikal (XD) all reached the Semi-Finals stage
- At the German Junior International GP (4 8 March 2020), Kok Jing Hong (MS) and Arif Junaidi / Muhammad Haikal (MD) became Champions, whilst Low Yeen Yuan / Muhammad Haikal (XD)were Runners-up.
- 3.3 The declaration by the government to impose the Movement Control Order (MCO) due to the Covid-19 pandemic starting 18 March 2020 in Malaysia (and elsewhere throughout the world), created havoc and derailed tournament calendars both locally and internationally under BWF's jurisdiction.
- 3.4 At home, major decisions had to be made both in terms of creating major activities for training as well as competition opportunities for both the senior and the junior players under strict control and SOP in ABM. The following were done:



- Senior players returned to ABM and resumed training from 5th July 2020
- U-18 players returned to ABM and resumed training from 26 July 2020
- U-15 players returned to ABM and resumed training from 16 August 2020
- To keep players in competitive atmosphere, the following competitions were created and executed in ABM as well at Stadium Juara next door:
 - i. BAM International Championships 2020 (12 16 August)
 - ii. 100Plus Junior Ranking 2020 (12 Oct 21 November)
 - iii. BAM Mixed Team Championships (23 -25 November)
 - iv. BAM Junior Mixed Team Championships (16 18 Dec 2020)

Details of the competitions and results can be found in the relevant sub-committee reports.

- 3.5 To avoid training boredom for the seniors and the RTT players, the following were organised:
 - A Motivation and Identity Camp was held in Pulau Tioman for the RTT players on 3 – 6 September 2020
 - Simulation matches of the Thomas / Uber Cup competitions between team were held on 16 & 17 September 2020 with much excitement.

Details of both activities are found in the C&T committee report.

- 3.6 A Management Committee was held on 21 July 2020 with the following matters announced, among others:
 - In a July 6th, meeting, Celcom expressed intent to continue partnership with BAM until the 2021 Olympics without adding to the sponsorship Agreement sum.
 - Coach Paulus Firman's contract was extended with him handling the Mixed Doubles squad.
 - Coach Flandy Limplele reported for duty on 27 July 2020 after completing his quarantine period to assume position as Men's Doubles Chief Coach
 - Muhammad Saqib Deen was hired as psychologist for the RTT programme and his contract tenure was extended until August 2021 due to the shift the Olympic Games.
 - Chan Chong Ming commenced coaching duties as Chief Coach of the Women Doubles squad with effect from 5 July 2020.
 - Mr. Vasigaran Vasudevan was appointed as the Honorary Secretary of Selangor Badminton Association (SBA) replacing Mr. Jadadish Chandra with effect from 23 September 2020.

- 3.7 Two Coaching & Training Committee Meetings were held on 20 July 2020 and 12 September 2020 respectively. Among decisions made were:
 - Independent players were invited to join training with the national squad from 15 July 2020 in the preparation for the Thomas / Uber cup competitions.
 - A new coaching structure for the senior team was approved with the following Chief coaches in place:

MS – Mr. Hendrawan MD – Mr. Flandy Limpele WS – Mr. Indra Widjaja WD – Mr. Chan Chong Ming XD – Mr. Paulus Firman

- Approved to pay BWF for Goh Sze Fei's Red Card penalty amounting to USD 500 after appeals were turned down.
- Toh Ee Wei has been accepted to return as a probation player to ABM and join the WD squad until end of December.
- 3.8 The Development Committee met on two occasions, 17 February & 20 July 2020, and among the matters reported were:
 - Submitted and approved by MSN the 24 players to be included in the Pelapis Kebangsaan squad.
 - Parents' meeting to be held twice a year consisting of training and academic aspects, to be done together with Regent International School.
 - Approved the National Junior Coaching structure.
 - Dato' Misbun Sedek joined the National Junior Programme as the Director of Youth Development as of 4 February 2020.
 - The new National Junior Coaching structure was put in place.
 - Coach Amelia Alicia Ancelly resigned from the National Junior set up on 21 February 2020
- 3.9 As regards the Academy Building, PSM has agreed for a long term Tenancy Agreement for up to 15 years, including the two years free rental for 2020 & 2021.
- 3.10 Ending the year on a high note, the BAM was honoured with the Japanese Foreign Minister's Commendation award as announced by the Japanese Ambassador to Malaysia, His Excellency Hiroshi Oka in December for promoting strong ties between the two countries through the sport of badminton.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The Persatuan Badminton Malaysia ("Association") is a non-profit organisation dedicated to encourage, promote and control the game of Badminton in Malaysia.

The Association is registered under the Sports Development Act 1997.

The registered office and principal place of operation is:-

Akademi Badminton Malaysia Kompleks Sukan Bukit Kiara Jalan 1/70D, Bukit Kiara 60000 Kuala Lumpur.

2. COMPLIANCE WITH FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS AND THE COMPANIES ACT

The financial statements of the Association have been prepared in compliance with the Malaysian Private Entities Reporting Standard ("MPERS") issued by the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board ("MASB").

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of Preparation

The measurement bases applied in the preparation of the financial statements include cost, amortised cost, recoverable value and realisable value as indicated in the accounting policies set out below. Accounting estimates are used in measuring these values.

The financial statements are presented in Ringgit Malaysia ("RM"), which is the functional currency of the Association.

b) Property, Plant and Equipment and Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Depreciation of property, plant and equipment is provided on a straight line basis to write off the cost of each asset to its residual value over the estimated useful life at the following annual rates:-





Long leasehold land Remaining lease period

Furniture, fittings and office equipment 20% Sport equipment 20% Renovation 20%

The carrying values of property, plant and equipment are reviewed for impairment when there is an indication that the assets might be impaired. Impairment is measured by comparing the carrying values of the assets with their recoverable amounts. An impairment loss is charged to the statement of comprehensive income immediately.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. The difference between the net disposal proceeds, if any and the net carrying amount is recognised in profit or loss and the unutilised portion of the revaluation surplus on that item is taken directly to general fund.

c) Financial instruments

i) Initial Recognition and Measurement

The Association recognises a financial asset or a financial liability (including derivative instruments) in the statement of financial position when, and only when, it becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at fair value, which is generally the transaction price, plus transaction costs if the financial asset or financial liability is not measured at fair value through profit or loss. For instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss, transaction costs are expensed to profit or loss when incurred.

ii) Derecognition of Financial Instruments

A financial asset is derecognised when, and only when, the contractual rights to receive the cash flows from the financial asset expire, or when the Association transfers the contractual rights to receive cash flows of the financial asset, including circumstances when the Association acts only as a collecting agent of the transferee, and retains no significant risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset or no continuing involvement in the control of the financial asset transferred.

A financial liability is derecognised when, and only when, it is legally extinguished, which is either when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged or cancelled or expires. A substantial modification of the terms of an existing financial liability is accounted for as an extinguished of the original financial liability and the recognition of a new financial liability. For this purpose, the Association considers a modification as substantial if the present value of the revised cash flows of the modified terms discounted at the original effective interest rate differs by 10% or more when compared with the carrying amount of the original liability.





iii) Subsequent Measurement of Financial Assets

For the purpose of subsequent measurement, the Association classifies financial assets into two categories, namely:

- financial assets at fair value through profit or loss, and
- financial assets at amortised cost.

Other than financial assets measured at fair value through profit or loss, all other financial assets are subject to review for impairment.

- iv) Subsequent measurement of Financial Liabilities
 After initial recognition, all financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.
- v) Fair Value Measurement of Financial Instruments

 The fair value of a financial asset or a financial liability is determined by reference to the quoted market price in an active market, and in the absence of an observable market price, by a valuation technique using reasonable and supportable assumptions.
- vi) Recognition of Gains and Losses
 Fair value changes of financial assets and liabilities classified as at fair
 value through profit or loss are recognised in profit or loss when they
 arise

For financial assets and financial liabilities carried at amortised cost, a gain or loss is recognised in profit or loss only when the financial asset or financial liability is derecognised or impaired and through the amortisation process of the instrument.

vii) Impairment and Uncollectibility of Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the Association examines whether there is any objective evidence that a financial asset or a group of financial assets is impaired. Evidences of trigger loss events include:

- significant difficulty of the issuer or obligor;
- a breach of contract, such as default or delinquency in interest or principal payments;
- granting exceptional concession to a customer;
- it is probable that a customer will enter bankruptcy or other financial reorganisation;
- the disappearance of an active market for that financial asset because of financial difficulties; or
- any observable market data indicating that there may be a measurable decrease in the estimated future cash flows from a group of financial assets.



For short-term receivables, where the effect of discounting is immaterial, impairment loss is tested for each individually significant receivable wherever there is any indication of impairment. Individually significant receivables for which no impairment loss is recognised are grouped together with all other receivables by classes based on credit risk characteristics and aged according to their past due periods. A collective allowance is estimated for a class group based on the Association's experience of loss ratio in each class, taking into consideration current market conditions.

d) Government Grants

The Association does not recognise government grants, including non-monetary grants at fair value, until there is reasonable assurance that the Association will comply with the conditions attaching to the grants and the grants will be received.

All government grants are recognised as income in profit or loss on a systematic basis over the periods in which the Association recognises as expenses the related costs for which the grants are intended to compensate. Any balance amount received not yet recognised in profit or loss is treated as a deferred income i.e. a liability in the statement of financial position.

e) Finance and operating leases

The Association recognises a lease whenever there is an agreement, whether explicitly stated as a lease or otherwise, whereby the lessor conveys to the lessee in return for a payment or series of payments the right to use an asset for an agreed period of time. A lease is classified as a finance lease if it transfers substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership. Title may or may not eventually be transferred. All other leases that do not meet this criteria are classified as operating leases.

f) Foreign Currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies during the financial year are converted to Ringgit Malaysia at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the statement of financial position date are translated to Ringgit Malaysia at the closing rates. Foreign exchange differences arising on translation are recognised in the income statement. Non-monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated to Ringgit Malaysia at rates of exchange ruling at the date of transactions.





g) Income Recognition

Income is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Association and when the revenue can be measured reliably, on the following bases:

(i) Income from sponsorship, subsidies and grants are recognised on an accrual basis when the Association's right to receive payment is established.

Unrestricted sponsorships, subsidies and grants received are credited in full to the statement of comprehensive income as an income item. Restricted sponsorships, subsidies and grants received are offset against the related expenditure item, except for grants for capital expenditure which are credited to a capital fund statement.

- (ii) Income from rental of properties is recognised on a time proportion basis over the lease term.
- (iii) Interest income from fixed deposits is recognised on an accrual basis.

h) Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

An impairment loss arises when the carrying amount of a Association's asset exceeds its recoverable amount.

At the end of each reporting date, the Association assesses whether there is any indication that a stand-alone asset or a cash-generating unit may be impaired by using external and internal sources of information. If any such indication exists, the Association estimates the recoverable amount of the asset or cash-generating unit.

If an individual asset generates independent cash inflows, it is tested for impairment as a stand-alone asset. If an asset does not generate independent cash inflows, it is tested for impairment together with other assets in a cash-generating unit, at the lowest level in which independent cash inflows are generated and monitored for internal management purposes.

The recoverable amount of an asset or cash-generating unit is the higher of its fair value less costs to sell and the value in use. The Association determines the fair value less costs to sell of an asset or a cash-generating unit in a hierarchy based on:

- (i) price in a binding sale agreement;
- (ii) market price traded in an active market; and
- (iii) estimate of market price using the best available information.

The value in use is estimated by discounting the net cash inflows (by an appropriate discount rate) of the asset or unit, using reasonable and supportable management's budgets and forecasts of five years and extrapolation of cash inflows for periods beyond the five-year forecast or budget.

For an asset measured on a cost-based model, any impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.



For a cash-generating unit, any impairment loss is allocated to the assets of the unit pro rata based on the relative carrying amounts of the assets.

The Association reassesses the recoverable amount of an impaired asset or a cash-generating unit if there is any indication that an impairment loss recognised previously may have reversed. Any reversal of impairment loss for an asset carried at a cost-based model is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income, subject to the limit that the revised carrying amount does not exceed the amount that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised previously.

Subsequent increase in the recoverable amount of an asset is treated as reversal of the previous impairment loss and is recognised to the extent of the carrying amount of the asset that would have been determined (net of amortisation and depreciation) had no impairment loss been recognised. The reversal is recognised in the income statement immediately, unless the asset is carried at revalued amount. A reversal of an impairment loss on a revalued asset is credited directly to revaluation surplus.

However, to the extent that an impairment loss on the same revalued asset was previously recognised as an expense in the income statement, a reversal of that impairment loss is recognised as income in the income statement.

i) Employees Benefits

(i) Short term benefits

Wages, salaries, paid leave, paid sick leave, bonuses and non-monetary benefits are recognised as an expense in the period in which the associated services are rendered by employees.

Non-monetary benefits such as medical care and other staff related expenses are charged to the income statement as and when incurred.

(ii) Defined contribution plans

As required by law, companies in Malaysia make contributions to the Employees Provident Fund ("EPF"). Such contributions are recognised as an expense in the income statement in the financial year to which they relate.

j) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents represent cash and bank balances, bank overdraft, short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.







4. CRITICAL JUDGEMENTS AND ESTIMATION UNCERTAINTIES

a) Judgements and Assumptions Applied

In the process of applying the Association's accounting policies, the management is not aware of any judgments that have significant effects on the amounts recognised in the financial statements.

b) Estimation Uncertainties

The measurement of some assets and liabilities requires management to use estimates based on various observable inputs and other assumptions. The areas or items that are subject to significant estimation uncertainties of the Association are in measuring:

• Determining the Value-in-Use

In determining the value-in-use of a stand-alone asset or a cash-generating unit, management uses reasonable and supportable inputs about sales, costs of sales and other expenses based upon past experiences, current events and reasonably possible future developments. Cash flows are projected based on those inputs and discounted at an appropriate discount rate(s). The actual outcome or event may not coincide with the inputs or assumptions and the discount rate applied in the measurement, and this may have a significant effect on the Association's financial position and results.

• Loss Allowances of Financial Assets

The Association recognises impairment losses for loans and receivables using the incurred loss model. Individually significant loans and receivables are tested for impairment separately by estimating the cash flows expected to be recoverable. All other loans and receivables are categorized into credit risk classes and tested for impairment collectively, using the Association's past experiences of loss statistics, ageing of past due amounts and current economic trends. The actual eventual losses may be different from the allowances made and these may affect the Association's financial position and results.

• Depreciation of Property, Plant and Equipment

The cost of an item of property, plant and equipment is depreciated on the straight-line method or another systematic method that reflects the consumption of the economic benefits of the asset over its useful life. Estimates are applied in the selection of the depreciation method, the useful lives and the residual values. The actual consumption of the economic benefits of the property, plant and equipment may differ from the estimates applied and this may lead to a gain or loss on an eventual disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment.

18. SIGNIFICANT EVENT

The existence and transmission of the infectious disease known as COVID-19 has been widely reported and has rapidly spread globally. This has caused increasing disruption to social, business operations and economic activity in many parts of the world.

As the result of the COVID-19 pandemic there will be an impact of the Association's profitability, liquidity position and potential impacts on future valuations of the Association's assets. The extent and duration of these impact will be highly dependent upon the timing of a recovery.

The council members of the Association are unable to reasonably estimate the financial impact of COVID-19 within the next 12 months after the financial year ended 31 December 2020. In light of the impact COVID-19 is having on the operation, the council members will continuously monitor the impact of COVID-19 on its operations and its financial performance. The Association will also be taking appropriate and timely measures to minimise the impact of the outbreak on the Association's operation. In the worst case scenario, the council members believe that they are able to obtain financial support for the Association.





19. SUBSEQUENT EVENT

On 5 February 2021, the Association had entered into a Sale and Purchase Agreement to dispose its land and building for a consideration of RM52,000,000. However, the disposal of the property is subject to the approval and consent of the appropriate authorities which has yet to be obtained.

2. NEW COACHING STRUCTURE – 1st JUNE 2020

As part of BAM's efforts to bring continuous improvement to the national squad, the management restructured the coaching setup of the national team effective from 1st June 2020.



3. PLAYERS' MOVEMENT DURING MCO

- 3.1 Training sessions at the ABM Training Centre, Bukit Kiara were temporarily halted from 18 to 31 March 2020 in accordance to the nationwide Movement Control Oder (MCO) imposed by the Government to curb the spread of COVID19.
- 3.2 The national players embarked on a period of 'active rest' at their own homes, away from the ABM Training Centre in Bukit Kiara. Players were issued with tailored individual fitness programmes to be carried out and monitored virtually by the coaches.
- 3.3 The whole complex of the ABM had to undergo detailed sanitization process with scheduled cleaning operation.

4. CELCOM AXIATA MALAYSIA OPEN 2020 POSTPONED

4.1 The Celcom Axiata Malaysia Open 2020 scheduled for 31 March to 5 April at the Axiata Arena, Bukit Jalil was postponed to an indefinite date due to the spread of Covid-19 at home and worldwide and in accordance the decision made by the government to suspend all sporting events as measures to combat the pandemic.







5. CENTRALISED TRAINING PROGRAMME 'ROAD TO TOKYO' (RTT)

All 38 badminton athletes, coaches, officials and support staff for The Road To Tokyo (RTT) 2020 programme checked in for a central training from 1st June until 30th June 2020 at Akademi Badminton Malaysia (ABM) after undergoing strict SOP's which included swab tests. All processes were done on quarantine-based approach for the duration of the 30 days, including the two weeks incubation period whereby they were not allowed to leave the training camp and had to undergo Covid-19 tests, and again with very strict SOPs in place.



5.2 This was possible after the Minister of Youth & Sport was granted permission by the government for the RTT Programme to proceed involving 265 personnel, including 57 Olympic bound athletes from various sports.

6. NATIONAL PLAYERS AND COACHES RETURNED TO TRAINING

- 6.1 All 64 players and coaches reported for training at ABM starting 5 July 2020. The Covid-19 swab tests done by all athletes and coaches were negative.
- 6.2 Strict SOPs and safety measures in accordance with the recommendations by the National Security Council (MKN) and Ministry of Health (KKM) to safeguard the health and well-being of everyone stationed at the national badminton centre of excellence were fully observed.

7. MOTIVATION AND IDENTITY CAMP

- 7.1 To avoid training boredom for the seniors and the RTT players, a 'Motivation and Identity Camp' was held in Pulau Tioman on 3 6 September 2020 with the appropriate slogan: "Together, we are stronger"
- 7.2 With the objective of fostering a genuine team spirit and the spirit of togetherness, the camp gave a psychological boost for the players and coaches as a needed preparation towards the Thomas & Uber Cup competitions in October which would have served as the first major competition since the Coronavirus Pandemic.
- 7.3 The camp was an overall success, with the players rating the camp's value as 9/10 on average (1 rating 7, 7 rating 8, 8 rating 9, and 8 rating 10). Players were happy with the bonding activities and felt more united, together, understood each other much deeper.









8. POSTPONEMENT OF THE TOTAL BWF THOMAS & UBER CUP COMPETITIONS TO 2021

- 8.1 BWF, in consultation and agreement with Badminton Denmark, had to postpone the TOTAL BWF Thomas and Uber Cup Finals 2020 which was scheduled to be held in Aarhus, Denmark. This decision came following the withdrawal of a number of participating teams a choice the BWF had to respect and acknowledge
- 8.2 The BWF promised to look into the possibility of proceeding with this important major World Men's / Women's Team Championships on suitable alternative dates in 2021.

9. PARTIAL LOCKDOWN AT ACADEMY BADMINTON MALAYSIA

- 9.1 As part of precautionary safety measures in stemming the increase in COVID-19 infection occurring nationwide, the management implemented partial lockdown in ABM from 9 October.
- 9.2 Players were allowed to move only within the compounds of the ABM and Juara Stadium. They were also barred from entering the BAM office whilst the admin staff were barred from the training hall.


10. BREAK CAMP LEAVE

- 10.1 All 54 players and coaches of the national team were given leave beginning 28 November until 5 December 2020.
- The players and coaches had to undergo similar swap tests when they returned to ABM on 6th. December. They resumed training on Monday, 7 December 2020 after being cleared of COVID-19

11. **NEW LOOK COACHING SETUP - SENIOR TEAM** (as of December 2020)

- 11.1 Three senior coaches, namely, Rosman Razak, Chin Eei Hui and Wong Pei Tty left the national coaching setup after their contracts with BAM which ended on 31 December 2020 were not renewed.
- 11.2 With the parting of the 3 senior coaches from the national coaching set up, the coaching team at the National Senior squad was readjusted with the inclusion of Tan Bin Shen, a former national shuttler, and Hoon Thien How effective from 15th December 2020.

1.4 APPOINTMENT OF THE DIRECTOR OF YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

1.4.1 Datuk Misbun Sedek joined the National Junior team as the Director of Youth Development effective 4th February 2020. Datuk Misbun was previously the National Senior Men's Singles Head Coach who was known to groom players like Datuk Lee Chong Wei, Lee Zii Jia, and many others.



- 1.4.2 Datuk Misbun first assignment was the Dutch and German Junior International in which Malaysia won two titles at the German Junior and two runners-up at the Dutch Junior. It was noted to be one of the best Junior International results for BAM in the last few years.
- 1.4.3 Datuk Misbun announced his new Coaching structure in July, and the Coaches started their new role upon returning to ABM.

1.5 JUNIOR INTERNAL RANKING

1.5.1 Implementation of a new internal ranking system based on a promotion/relegation concept. The ranking was held in January and October with four events being played – boys singles, girls singles, boys doubles and girls doubles.



• Group match – players compete within their age category.

Playoff stage – the top two players in the group to play the bottom two players of the higher age category. Eg: top two players in the 13 years vs. bottom two of 14 years

The results of the play-off matches would determine the players' final position in the group and overall ranking (13-18 years)

The results of the play-off match to determine whether the players are promoted/relegated/remain in their respective age category for the next ranking.

1.5.2 The Ranking was organized successfully despite the challenges faced during the Covid-19 situation. Even though there were no tournaments, the Ranking helped the players to remain motivated and competitive.








1.7 MOVEMENT CONTROL ORDER (MCO)

- 1.7.1 Movement Control Order (MCO) was implemented on the 18th March nationwide. The players returned to their respective hometowns on the 14th March. During this period, the players continue to train via Zoom, supervised by the strength & conditioning team and the coaches.
- 1.7.2 The sessions were aimed to ensure:
 - Players continued to remain physically and condition fit
 An opportunity for coaches to build upon the players physical strength and technique
 - Players are kept motivated; and to interact with their coaches and teammates.
 - Continuous education programs being implemented
- 1.7.3 The players were in lockdown for about four (4) months before returning to ABM in two batches.

- 1.8.1 With the objective to build the team camaraderie of the National Junior and Senior players, the entire junior team participated in the National Mixed Team Championships. - 1.9.5 The winner was Junior Avengers.





2.4.1 PERODUA Malaysia Masters 2020



BAM SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORMS

- BAM's online platforms garnered a total following of 213,939 across **Facebook** (60,220) **Instagram** (45,722) **Twitter** (5,753) and **Youtube** (102,244) as at 31 December 2020.
- On **Youtube (@BA Malaysia)**, the livestream production of the Perodua Malaysia Masters (PMM) 2020 presented by Daihatsu racked up total views of 9.28 million.

2 **ACTIVITIES**

- 2.1 The hosting of the PMM 2020 presented by Daihatsu from 15 20 January generated a global media value of USD58.9 million (RM239.05 million) as per the Overview Report conducted by the world governing body; Badminton World Federation (BWF).
- 2.2 Officials from the Media department were stationed at the Putrajaya Hospital throughout the recovery process involving world Number 1, Kento Momota from 13 to 15 January. We worked in tandem and liaised with multiple government agencies, BWF and members of the international media to ensure the seamless discharge of the individuals involved from the hospital.





- 2.3 Leading up to the Celcom Axiata Malaysia Open 2020, the BAM Media department has exercised a promotional plan centred around ground activation that include several schools and public universities, introduction of economic climate friendly ticket categories (early bird) and usage of multiple media platforms available that include radio stations. The department also worked in unison with the BWF in publishing press releases in relation to the status of the event.
- Throughout the Movement Control Order (MCO) period, the department continued to churn out content that include press releases and videos featuring BAM President and national team players. Prior to the re-opening of Akademi Badminton Malaysia (ABM), the department assisted in formulating the infographics and establishing the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) at the national badminton centre of excellence.









- 2.5 For the VICTOR Invitational Championships, The department established a comprehensive SOP for the members of the media that cover the tournament at the ABM and provided a two-court livestream on BAM's official Youtube channel, BAMTV throughout. New initiatives were taken to improve subscriber experience which include the following:
 - i. On-court commentary provided by national junior coaches; Hafiz Hashim, Vountus Indramawan and the department's Media Manager, Falah Abdullah.
 - ii. Livescore added to the livestream



- 2.6 Two officials of the department, Falah and Sabri were part of the 45-man delegation in Pulau Tioman with the view of providing BAMTV subscribers a behind-the-scenes look of the motivation camp through daily vlogs. Additionally, daily footages and visuals were provided to the members of the media to amplify the coverage of the camp.
- 2.7 The inaugural two-day President's Cup was held with the attendance of the members of the media. They were subjected to a comprehensive ABM SOP.
- 2.8 100PLUS National Junior Ranking for the national junior team garnered a solid traction with widespread coverage by the local media.

3. ADDITIONAL STAFF

On 8 June, the department welcomed the addition of a new staff, Nabilah Mohd Zubir as a Media Executive to improve the overall output. Nabilah was formerly a staff of the BAM Human Resource department for the past year. She holds a degree in Mass Communications from the UiTM.

3. Scope of Work for Academy Badminton Malaysia:

- i. Training hall of 18 courts, 2 of which will be R&D courts
- ii. An Administration Block including coaching department offices
- iii. Players' hostel, which can accommodate 200 beds
- iv. Specific facilities such as: Gymnasium, Auditorium, Rehabilitation Centre, Prayer Rooms, Resource Centre, Dining Hall, Kitchen, Physiotherapy Room, and Hostel Warden Office.

4. ABM Building Progress Report as of 31st December 2020.

The ABM building was handed over by Kementerian Belia Dan Sukan to Perbadanan Stadium Malaysia to be managed. A Tenancy Agreement between Perbadanan Stadium Malaysia (PSM) and Badminton Association Malaysia (BAM) was signed on the 31^{st of} December 2020.

This Tenancy Agreement later will be converted to Lease Agreement. The Ministry of Youth and Sports have agreed to the request by BAM to waive the rental of ABM for two years beginning from the date of signing the agreement with PSM.

JKR has chaired 6 Defect Rectification Meetings as of 31st December 2020 and the last defect meeting no. 12 was held on the 13th of January 2020. As there are numerous defects that still needs to be rectified, JKR and BAM is currently monitoring and overseeing the defects rectification work by the Contractor. The Defect Liability Period for CPO 1 ended on 30th January 2019 covering the courts and main office and CPO 2 ended on 21st January 2020 for the rest of the ABM building.


