- National men's doubles pair, Aaron Chia & Soh Wooi Yik, won Malaysia's first ever World Championships in August 2022.
- National women's doubles pair, Pearly Tan & M. Thinaah, won another Malaysia first-ever title in French Open in October 2022.
- After waiting for 8 years, Malaysia won Gold medal in the mixed team event in Commonwealth Games 2022 held in Birmingham.
- Remy Mainaky was recruited to lead the Doubles squad and Wong Choong Hann would head the Singles squad.
- The High Performance team was formed under BAM organisational structure with Michelle Chai tasked to lead the National Squad programmes and the administration of PETRONAS AKADEMI BADMINTON MALAYSIA (PABM).
- PABM opened its doors to independent players to encourage the sense of camaraderie amongst the players and officials for stronger Malaysian representation in Team events.
- BWF accorded Super 1000 status to PETRONAS Malaysia Open tournament.
- BAM signed Memorandum of Understanding for two years for strategic partnership with Badminton Association of Thailand (BAT).
- BAM retained the five-star rating accorded by the Sports Commissioner's Office in recognition of BAM's sound management and administration status.

YBhg. Tan Sri Dato' Sri (Dr.) President reminded that the players must double up their effort to perform better leading up to Paris Olympic Games in 2024. YBhg. Under the umbrella of The Olympic Council of Malaysia (OCM), BAM is ranked one of the best governed sports associations in Malaysia and to date the biggest contributor of Olympic Games medals for the country





BAM ADMINISTRATIVE STRUCTURE

3 ACTIVITY REPORT

3.1 The year 2023 saw changes in the composition of the BAM Council which resulted from changes at the respective State BA Councils, namely:

- Melaka BA has appointed Mr. Lwee One Nam and Mr. Liu Wan Swee as the President and Honorary Secretary respectively after incumbent President Datuk Senasi Annamalai and Mr. Chua Soo Hock the Honorary Secretary stepped down.
- A new Pahang Honorary Secretary, Mr. Wan Suhaimi Wan Yaacob was appointed to replace Encik Mohamad Nor Haji Omar effective 6 June 2023.
- Selangor BA has appointed Ms. Kalachelvi MS Rajoo as their Honorary Secretary replacing Mr. Vasigaran Vasudevan effective 1 June 2023.
- Johor BA has a new President in Mr. Roslan Ghani and a new Honorary Secretary, Mr. Suhaimi Isa, replacing Mr. Mat Rasid Jahilil and Mr. Mohd Fadhil Samihan respectively who stepped down.
- Sabah BA has appointed Mr. Alphonso Fiel as Sabah BA Honorary Secretary, but has still not appointed the President after Mr. Janih Bangud stepped down in mid-2023.

BAM wishes to express our thanks and appreciation to all the past members of the BAM Council for their contribution, time and sacrifices.

3.2 AFFIN Group became BAM's Official Bank partner for two years effective from January 2023, supporting wide range of BAM initiatives which included as joint sponsors of the 100PLUS Junior Elite Tour (JET).



3.3 BAM signed an MOU with the University of Cyberjaya (UoC) to collaborate in industrial training placement and services related to mental health programme awareness among our players.

3.4 BAM signed an MOU with Badminton Asia in May to encourage and facilitate advancements in the game's development in the region.

3.5 BAM signed an MOU with Yayasan Astro Kasih in November in efforts to unearth more new talents at the grassroots.

3.6 YBhg. Datuk V Subramaniam, BAM Deputy President I, was appointed to head the Junior Task Force Committee to make decisions on intake of players to the Junior Squad. A series of meeting had taken place to finalise new intake procedures.

3.7 At the Anugerah Sukan Kebangsaan (ASN) for 2022 on 17 July 2023, Badminton was well featured with the following titles:

- Anugerah Olahragawan Kebangsaan: Aaron Chia-Soh Wooi Yik (MD)
- Anugerah Pasukan Wanita Kebangsaan: Pearly Tan-Thinaah Muralitharan (WD)
- Anugerah Olahragawan Paralimpik Kebangsaan: Cheah Like Hou (Para Badminton)

3.8 Pearly Tan (WD) was accorded with '*Fastest Badminton Hit (Female)*' with a smash of 438 km/h accorded by Guinness World Records.

3.9 The National and Junior Squads won less number of titles at various senior and junior Championships throughout 2023. Details can be found in the Performance Department's Report in the book.

3.10 Director of Youth Development, Datuk Misbun Sidek's contract with BAM was not renewed. Indonesian coach, Jeffer Rosobin was appointed to head the Junior Department.

3.11 BAM Director of Coaching, Mr. Wong Choong Hann, resigned on 16 June 2023 to take up appointment in Hong Kong.

3.12 At the Badminton Asia Annual General Assembly held on 29 June 2023, our President, YBhg. Tan Sri Dato'Sri (Dr.) Mohamad Norza Zakaria was appointed as Badminton Asia Honorary President and YH Dato' Kenny Goh Chee Keong was elected as Badminton Asia Secretary General.



3.13 At the Sportswriters Association of Malaysia (SAM) Award ceremony on 27 August 2023, our President, YBhg. Tan Sri Dato'Sri (Dr.) Mohamad Norza Zakaria, was selected for the inaugural Sports Leadership Award.

3.14 Former BAM President (1993 – 2000), YBhg. Dato' Seri Dr. Abdullah Fadzil Che Wan passed

away on 6 September 2023 at the age of 78.







INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

PERSATUAN BADMINTON MALAYSIA (BADMINTON ASSOCIATION OF MALAYSIA) (Registered under the Sports Development Act 1997)

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Persatuan Badminton Malaysia ("the Association"), which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31st December 2023, the statement of comprehensive income and statement of changes in fund balance and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, as set out on pages 6 to 21.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Association as at 31st December 2023, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in Malaysia.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with approved standards on auditing in Malaysia and International Standards on Auditing. We communicate with the council members regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during audit.



**NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2023**

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The Persatuan Badminton Malaysia (“Association”) is a non-profit organisation dedicated to encourage, promote and control the game of Badminton in Malaysia.

The Association is registered under the Sports Development Act 1997.

The registered office and principal place of operation is:-

2. COMPLIANCE WITH FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS AND THE COMPANIES ACT

The financial statements of the Association have been prepared in compliance with the Malaysian Private Entities Reporting Standard (“MPERS”) issued by the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board (“MASB”).

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of Preparation

The measurement bases applied in the preparation of the financial statements include cost, amortised cost, recoverable value and realisable value as indicated in the accounting policies set out below. Accounting estimates are used in measuring these values.

The financial statements are presented in Ringgit Malaysia (“RM”), which is the functional currency of the Association.

b) Property, Plant and Equipment and Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Depreciation of property, plant and equipment is provided on a straight line basis to write off the cost of each asset to its residual value over the estimated useful life at the following annual rates:-

Building	2%
Long leasehold land	Remaining lease period
Furniture, fittings and office equipment	20%
Sport equipment	20%
Renovation	20%

The carrying values of property, plant and equipment are reviewed for impairment when there is an indication that the assets might be impaired. Impairment is measured by comparing the carrying values of the assets with their recoverable amounts. An impairment loss is charged to the statement of comprehensive income immediately.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. The difference between the net disposal proceeds, if any and the net carrying amount is recognised in profit or loss and the unutilised portion of the revaluation surplus on that item is taken directly to general fund.

c) Financial instruments

i) Initial Recognition and Measurement

The Association recognises a financial asset or a financial liability (including derivative instruments) in the statement of financial position when, and only when, it becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at fair value, which is generally the transaction price, plus transaction costs if the financial asset or financial liability is not measured at fair value through profit or loss. For instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss, transaction costs are expensed to profit or loss when incurred.

ii) Derecognition of Financial Instruments

A financial asset is derecognised when, and only when, the contractual rights to receive the cash flows from the financial asset expire, or when the Association transfers the contractual rights to receive cash flows of the financial asset, including circumstances when the Association acts only as a collecting agent of the transferee, and retains no significant risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset or no continuing involvement in the control of the financial asset transferred.

A financial liability is derecognised when, and only when, it is legally extinguished, which is either when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged or cancelled or expires. A substantial modification of the terms of an existing financial liability is accounted for as an extinguished of the original financial liability and the recognition of a new financial liability. For this purpose, the Association considers a modification as substantial if the present value of the revised cash flows of the modified terms discounted at the original effective interest rate differs by 10% or more when compared with the carrying amount of the original liability.

- iii) **Subsequent Measurement of Financial Assets**
 For the purpose of subsequent measurement, the Association classifies financial assets into two categories, namely:
- financial assets at fair value through profit or loss, and
 - financial assets at amortised cost.
- Other than financial assets measured at fair value through profit or loss, all other financial assets are subject to review for impairment.
- iv) **Subsequent measurement of Financial Liabilities**
 After initial recognition, all financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.
- v) **Fair Value Measurement of Financial Instruments**
 The fair value of a financial asset or a financial liability is determined by reference to the quoted market price in an active market, and in the absence of an observable market price, by a valuation technique using reasonable and supportable assumptions.
- vi) **Recognition of Gains and Losses**
 Fair value changes of financial assets and liabilities classified as at fair value through profit or loss are recognised in profit or loss when they arise.
- For financial assets and financial liabilities carried at amortised cost, a gain or loss is recognised in profit or loss only when the financial asset or financial liability is derecognised or impaired and through the amortisation process of the instrument.
- vii) **Impairment and Uncollectibility of Financial Assets**
 At the end of each reporting period, the Association examines whether there is any objective evidence that a financial asset or a group of financial assets is impaired. Evidences of trigger loss events include:
- Significant financial difficulty of the issuer or obligor;
 - a breach of contract, such as default or delinquency in interest or principal payments;
 - granting exceptional concession to a customer;
 - it is probable that a customer will enter bankruptcy or other financial reorganisation;
 - the disappearance of an active market for that financial asset because of financial difficulties; or
 - any observable market data indicating that there may be a measurable decrease in the estimated future cash flows from a group of financial assets.

For short-term receivables, where the effect of discounting is immaterial, impairment loss is tested for each individually significant receivable wherever there is any indication of impairment. Individually significant receivables for which no impairment loss is recognised are grouped together with all other receivables by classes based on credit risk characteristics and aged according to their past due periods. A collective allowance is estimated for a class group based on the Association's experience of loss ratio in each class, taking into consideration current market conditions.

d) Government Grants

The Association does not recognise government grants, including non-monetary grants at fair value, until there is reasonable assurance that the Association will comply with the conditions attaching to the grants and the grants will be received.

The Association also received wages subsidy from the government announced during the Movement Control Order.

All government grants are recognised as income in profit or loss on a systematic basis over the periods in which the Association recognises as expenses the related costs for which the grants are intended to compensate. Any balance amount received not yet recognised in profit or loss is treated as a deferred income i.e. a liability in the statement of financial position.

e) Finance and operating leases

The Association recognises a lease whenever there is an agreement, whether explicitly stated as a lease or otherwise, whereby the lessor conveys to the lessee in return for a payment or series of payments the right to use an asset for an agreed period of time. A lease is classified as a finance lease if it transfers substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership. Title may or may not eventually be transferred. All other leases that do not meet this criteria are classified as operating leases.

f) Foreign Currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies during the financial year are converted to Ringgit Malaysia at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the statement of financial position date are translated to Ringgit Malaysia at the closing rates. Foreign exchange differences arising on translation are recognised in the income statement. Non-monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated to Ringgit Malaysia at rates of exchange ruling at the date of transactions.

g) Income Recognition

Income is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Association and when the revenue can be measured reliably, on the following bases:

- (i) Income from sponsorship, subsidies and grants are recognised on an accrual basis when the Association's right to receive payment is established.

Unrestricted sponsorships, subsidies and grants received are credited in full to the statement of comprehensive income as an income item. Restricted sponsorships, subsidies and grants received are offset against the related expenditure item, except for grants for capital expenditure which are credited to a capital fund statement.

- (ii) Income from rental of property is recognised on a time proportion basis over the lease term.

- (iii) Interest income from fixed deposits is recognised on an accrual basis.

h) Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

An impairment loss arises when the carrying amount of a Association's asset exceeds its recoverable amount.

At the end of each reporting date, the Association assesses whether there is any indication that a stand-alone asset or a cash-generating unit may be impaired by using external and internal sources of information. If any such indication exists, the Association estimates the recoverable amount of the asset or cash-generating unit.

If an individual asset generates independent cash inflows, it is tested for impairment as a stand-alone asset. If an asset does not generate independent cash inflows, it is tested for impairment together with other assets in a cash-generating unit, at the lowest level in which independent cash inflows are generated and monitored for internal management purposes.

The recoverable amount of an asset or cash-generating unit is the higher of its fair value less costs to sell and the value in use. The Association determines the fair value less costs to sell of an asset or a cash-generating unit in a hierarchy based on:

- (i) price in a binding sale agreement;
- (ii) market price traded in an active market; and
- (iii) estimate of market price using the best available information.

The value in use is estimated by discounting the net cash inflows (by an appropriate discount rate) of the asset or unit, using reasonable and supportable management's budgets and forecasts of five years and extrapolation of cash inflows for periods beyond the five-year forecast or budget.

For an asset measured on a cost-based model, any impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

For a cash-generating unit, any impairment loss is allocated to the assets of the unit pro rata based on the relative carrying amounts of the assets.

The Association reassesses the recoverable amount of an impaired asset or a cash-generating unit if there is any indication that an impairment loss recognised previously may have reversed. Any reversal of impairment loss for an asset carried at a cost-based model is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income, subject to the limit that the revised carrying amount does not exceed the amount that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised previously.

Subsequent increase in the recoverable amount of an asset is treated as reversal of the previous impairment loss and is recognised to the extent of the carrying amount of the asset that would have been determined (net of amortisation and depreciation) had no impairment loss been recognised. The reversal is recognised in the income statement immediately, unless the asset is carried at revalued amount. A reversal of an impairment loss on a revalued asset is credited directly to revaluation surplus.

However, to the extent that an impairment loss on the same revalued asset was previously recognised as an expense in the income statement, a reversal of that impairment loss is recognised as income in the income statement.

i) Employees Benefits

(i) Short term benefits

Wages, salaries, paid leave, paid sick leave, bonuses and non-monetary benefits are recognised as an expense in the period in which the associated services are rendered by employees.

Non-monetary benefits such as medical care and other staff related expenses are charged to the income statement as and when incurred.

(ii) Defined contribution plans

As required by law, companies in Malaysia make contributions to the Employees Provident Fund ("EPF"). Such contributions are recognised as an expense in the income statement in the financial year to which they relate.

j) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents represent cash and bank balances, bank overdraft, short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

4. CRITICAL JUDGEMENTS AND ESTIMATION UNCERTAINTIES

a) Judgements and Assumptions Applied

In the process of applying the Association's accounting policies, the management is not aware of any judgments that have significant effects on the amounts recognised in the financial statements.

b) Estimation Uncertainties

The measurement of some assets and liabilities requires management to use estimates based on various observable inputs and other assumptions. The areas or items that are subject to significant estimation uncertainties of the Association are in measuring:

- **Determining the Value-in-Use**
In determining the value-in-use of a stand-alone asset or a cash-generating unit, management uses reasonable and supportable inputs about sales, costs of sales and other expenses based upon past experiences, current events and reasonably possible future developments. Cash flows are projected based on those inputs and discounted at an appropriate discount rate(s). The actual outcome or event may not coincide with the inputs or assumptions and the discount rate applied in the measurement, and this may have a significant effect on the Association's financial position and results.
- **Loss Allowances of Financial Assets**
The Association recognises impairment losses for loans and receivables using the incurred loss model. Individually significant loans and receivables are tested for impairment separately by estimating the cash flows expected to be recoverable. All other loans and receivables are categorised into credit risk classes and tested for impairment collectively, using the Association's past experiences of loss statistics, ageing of past due amounts and current economic trends. The actual eventual losses may be different from the allowances made and these may affect the Association's financial position and results.
- **Depreciation of Property, Plant and Equipment**
The cost of an item of property, plant and equipment is depreciated on the straight-line method or another systematic method that reflects the consumption of the economic benefits of the asset over its useful life. Estimates are applied in the selection of the depreciation method, the useful lives and the residual values. The actual consumption of the economic benefits of the property, plant and equipment may differ from the estimates applied and this may lead to a gain or loss on an eventual disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment.

PERFORMANCE

1 NATIONAL SENIOR TEAM


Following the decision to separate the Academy Badminton Malaysia (ABM) from the Badminton Association of Malaysia (BAM), and with the appointment of Ms. Michelle Chai as the Chief Executive of the ABM on 3 October 2022, the Year 2023 became a year where new practices and systems were incorporated with the sole purpose of increasing the level of performance of our players, both the senior and junior level.

Among the key principles that drove the actions and operations at the ABM for Year 2023 were:

- Generally, each department will be given a quota of 8 players or 8 pairs (for senior squad)
- Each player / pair will be given a minimum of eight (8) tournaments, barring any injuries or split of partnership (for senior squad)
- Increase investment on sports science and sports medicine.
- Performance evaluation to be more data driven.
- Enhanced communication amongst management, coaches and players.

1.1 SUMMARY OF PERFORMANCES

2023 saw some ups and downs with the performances of our players on the court. Among the highlights were the first BWF World Tour title by our men's doubles pair, Aaron Chia-Soh Wooi Yik, the emergence of young players such as Choong Hon Jian-Muhammad Haikal, Yap Roy King-Arif Junaidi, Justin Hoh, Wong Ling Ching as well as the extraordinary debut year for mixed doubles pair Chen Tang Jie and Toh Ee Wei.

2 TOP PERFORMERS

With one title (BWF Super 750), 3 runners-up (BWF Super 1000 and Super 750) and 2 bronze medals at major events, **Aaron Chia and Soh Wooi Yik** were our top performers in 2023. While unable to defend their World Championship title in Denmark, Aaron Chia and Soh Wooi Yik finally got their first BWF World Tour title by capturing the Denmark Open in Odense in October 2023. Further, our top men's doubles pair maintained their record having now won medals in every major tournament except the Thomas Cup.

Not to be left behind were **Cheng Tang Jie and Toh Ee Wei** who were nominated by BWF as one of the most improved pairs in the year 2023. Starting the year ranked 147, Tang Jie and Ee Wei broke into the top 10 in their first full season as a pair with steady performances throughout, featuring title wins at the 31st Iran Fajr International Challenge 2023, Orleans Masters Badminton 2023 presented by VICTOR and the YONEX Taipei Open 2023.

Towards the end of year 2023, young pair **Choong Hon Jian and Muhammad Haikal** showed their potential by winning back-to-back titles at the Syed Modi International 2023 and the Yonex-Sunrise Guwahati Masters 2023. Enroute to winning the Syed Modi International 2023, the pair, who only played their first tournament together in September 2023, beat top pairs such as Akira Koga-Taichi Saito and Ben Lane-Sean Vendy.

2.1 TotalEnergies BWF SUDIRMAN CUP FINALS 2023, 14 – 21 May, China PR

Drawn into Group C with dark horses India and Chinese Taipei as well as Australia, our players played well to top Group C, beating India 4-1, Chinese Taipei and Australia 5-0 respectively.

Our top of the group showing put us in the quarter-finals against Denmark who featured world number 1 Viktor Axelsen. Points from Chen Tang Jie-Toh Ee Wei, Lee Zii Jia and Aaron Chia-Soh Wooi Yik helped set up a last four meeting with Korea Rep as we bid to reach their first-ever final in the world's mixed team championship.

Unfortunately, our players could not maintain similar momentum in the semi-finals despite Zii Jia giving us the first point. Mixed doubles pair Chen Tang Jie-Toh Ee Wei, women's singles K. Letshanaa and men's doubles pair Aaron Chia-Soh Wooi Yik lost their matches to give Korea a 3-1 win.

Despite the defeat, we achieved our last four target and was also only the third time that Malaysia had won bronze in the Sudirman Cup since the tournaments inception in 1989 after also finishing as semi-finalists in 2009 and 2021.

3.1 Men's Singles

3.1.1 Highlights

Although the department bagged only two titles through **Aidil Sholeh** who won the XPORA Indonesia International Challenge 2023 and **Leong Jun Hao** at the Bergamot KL Masters Super 100, year 2023 saw improved performances from key players of the department, namely Ng Tze Yong and Justin Hoh before the latter was dealt with two injuries in April and November 2023.

After his breakthrough year at the Commonwealth Games 2022, **Ng Tze Yong** continued to show improvement throughout the year 2023, consistently reaching the quarter-finals of tournaments entered. It was at the Victor Hong Kong Open 2023 in September that Tze Yong overcame the quarter-final jinx as he reached the semi-finals before succumbing to Jonatan Christie. A month later, at the Clash of Clans Arctic Open 2023 powered by Yonex, Tze Yong entered his first Super 500 final, playing his part in a rare all-Malaysian final with compatriot Lee Zii Jia. His consistent performance saw him rise to a career high ranking of 14 in November 2023 and as a firm contender to

qualify for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

Transitioning from junior to his first senior year, 19-year old **Justin Hoh** picked-up exactly where he left off. His first four tournaments as a senior saw him on the podium for each of them, including winning the Uganda International Challenge 2023. His debut at a BWF World Tour circuit tournament, namely the Ruichang China Masters 2023, resulted in semi-final appearance, thus reminding Malaysians the huge potential that he has.

Unfortunately, Justin ruptured his left Achilles tendon on April 10 forcing him to miss the upcoming SEA Games 2025 in Cambodia. The 19-year old took seven months before returning again on the circuit at the Syed Modi International 2023 and the Yonex-Sunrise Guwahati Masters 2023 where he reached the semi-finals. During the semi-finals of the latter, Justin was forced to give a walkover as he sustained a right foot injury which floored him for the rest of year 2023.

3.2 Women's Singles

The women's singles department started 2023 with a clean slate and mostly new faces. With the exit of a number of players in December 2022, women's singles became the smallest and youngest department at the ABM. It started the year with five players but ended the year with four as **Tan Zhing Yi** made the swap from women's singles to women's doubles.

At 20 years old, the eldest in the department, **Letshanaa Karupathevan** (joined in March 2023) and **Wong Ling Ching** (joined in October 2022) led the way with **Siti Nurshuhaini Azman** (19 years) and **Oo Shan Zi** (16 years) making up the rest of the department.

The year 2023 was a difficult one for the women's team, no less as they crashed out of the SEA Games Cambodia 2023, suffering a shock 0-3 defeat to Philippines. Without Letshanaa whose name was not in the long list of SEA Games 2023 due to her just joining the ABM, and Wong Ling Ching who was taken ill before the match, Tan Zhing Yi and Siti Nurshuhaini were left, unsuccessfully, to carry the challenge against the Philippines.

In May 2023, the women's department saw a change of head coach, with Yogendran Krishnan taking over from James Chua. As the women's team continued their development, focus was on developing and improving the four players' strength and conditioning, as well as their body composition.

3.2.1 Highlights

While the department did not have any titles in the Year 2023, the progress of the young players was noticeable with Wong Ling Ching the top performer of the department. Starting the year ranked 317, she climbed more than 200 spots to end the year ranked 75. Ling Ching finished runners-up at the PETRONAS Malaysia International Challenge 2023 and made it to the quarter-finals at her maiden BWF Super 300 tournament, the Syed Modia International 2023.

Not to be outdone, Letshanaa showed consistency in performances to end the year as BAM's No. 1 women's singles player, ranked 60.

3.3.1 Highlights

The depth of the department was reflected as the 9 titles were won by a mixture of the elite and the back-up players, namely:

- Aaron Chia and Soh Wooi Yik with their maiden BWF World Tour title at the VICTOR Denmark Open 2023;
- Goh Sze Fei and Nur Izzuddin (3 titles): Yonex US Open 2023, VICTOR Kaohsiung Masters 2023 and Abu Dhabi Masters 2023;
- Choong Hon Jian and Muhammad Haikal (2 titles): Syed Modi International India 2023 and Yonex-Sunrise Guwahati Masters 2023;
- Man Wei Chong and Tee Kai Wun (1 title): Yonex Taipei Open 2023
- Wan Arif Wan Junaidi and Yap Roy King (1 title): Nantes International Challenge 2023
- Choi Jian Sheng and Bryan Jeremy Goonting (1 title): Maldives International Series 2023

The year 2023 also saw the brief split of then top 10 pair **Goh Sze Fei and Nur Izzuddin**. Poor performances at the home PETRONAS Malaysia Open 2023, the YONEX-Sunrise India Open 2023 and the Daihatsu Indonesia Masters 2023 convinced the two players that their future lies away from each other despite their number 10 ranking in the world and qualification to the Paris 2024 Olympic Games in the horizon.

The split didn't last long though as the pair were back together at the end of May. Having lost 4 months, the pair played 11 tournaments in the space of 5 months to claw their way back to the top 30 having dropped out of the top 50 in mid-2023.

Complementing both Aaron-Wooi Yik and Sze Fei-Izzuddin at the elite level of men's doubles is the pair of Man Wei Chong and Tee Kai Wun. Title at the Yonex Taipei Open 2023 and final appearance at the PERODUA Malaysia Masters 2023 presented by Daihatsu and the Clash of Clans Artic Open 2023 powered by Yonex saw Wei Chong-Kai Wun breaking into the top 20. Nonetheless, inconsistencies continue to plague this pair who, at the other extreme, who exited in the first round in 10 out of the 16 tournaments they participated in.

3.4.1 Highlights

Pearly Tan and Thinaah Muralitharan remained our top and most consistent pair at the elite level, reaching 2 finals (Perodua Malaysia Masters 2023 presented by Daihatsu and the VICTOR Hong Kong Open 2023) and making 3 semi-final appearances (Yonex-Sunrise India Open 2023, Daihatsu Indonesia Masters 2023, Yonex German Open 2023). The duo though could not find the form that saw them win the French Open in 2022.

A rupture in the right anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) of Anna Cheong in October 2022 kept out our second pair, Anna Cheong and Teoh Mei Xing for most of the Year 2023. While Anna focused on her rehabilitation, Mei Xing played the senior role in guiding Go Pei Kee (in women's doubles) and Hoo Pang Ron (mixed doubles).

Anna and Mei Xing eventually returned to court at the TotalEnergies BWF World Championship 2023 in August. However, 6 tournaments later, injury struck Anna again at the Kumamoto Masters Japan 2023 as the pair had to withdraw from their first round match.

With the limited number of players, injuries and movement of players between mixed doubles and women's doubles, the year saw the coach trying out various partnership as below:

3.5.1 Highlights

The mixed doubles department had an exciting year with its new pairing of **Chen Tang Jie and Toh Ee Wei** rising meteorically from 147 in January to a top 10 pair at the end of the year. Among the key highlights were titles at the 31st their only title came at the beginning of the year at the 31st Iran Fajr International Challenge, Orleans Masters Badminton 2023 presented by VICTOR and the YONEX Taipei Open 2023 as well as semi-final appearances at the KFF Singapore Open 2023, VICTOR China Open 2023, Clash of Clans Arctic Open 2023 powered by Yonex and the Korea Masters 2023. Their exploits saw them nominated for the BWF Most Improved Player of the Year Award 2023.

Similar to the men's doubles department, the mixed doubles showed that there is quality in both the elite as well as the back-up squads. Titles were won by new and young pairs at the levels of International Challenge and the BWF World Tour Super 100.



5 ROAD TO GOLD PROJECT

As we enter the year 2023, the Ministry of Youth and Sports established the "Road to Gold" (RTG) project to help the nation achieve its first Olympic gold medal. The project's scope is to assist us particularly in strengthening the services to the athletes within the program.

An RTG Committee, co-chaired by the Honorable Minister of Youth and Sports, YB Hannah Yeoh and Tan Sri Dato' Sri (Dr.) Norza Zakaria (President of Olympic Council of Malaysia and Badminton Association of Malaysia), was set-up to monitor and implement the project.

In its first meeting on 16 March 2023, the RTG Committee, confirmed seven (7) of our players in the program.

6.1.2 Highlights

As with any other year, the focus tournaments for the juniors remain the Badminton Asian Junior Championship and the BWF World Junior Championship. Following a dismal BWF World Junior Championship 2022 held in Spain, then Director of Junior Development, Datuk Haji Misbun Sidek, had indicated that our players lack match experience at the highest level.

Consequently, in preparation for Year 2023's Asian and World Junior, our elite junior players were sent to participate in a series of tournaments from January to May, including senior tournaments (International Challenge and International Series) as well as the traditional European Junior tournaments – Yonex Dutch Junior International 2023, Yonex German Junior 2023.

Strong showings by these tournaments saw our junior players held their own in the BWF World Junior ranking. Prior to the BNI Badminton Asia Junior Championship 2023 (Team Event), 7-11 July 2023, Boys Singles, **Eogene Ewe** and Boys Doubles, **Bryan Jeremy Goonting and Aaron Tai** were all ranked in the top 4 in the world.

Unfortunately, the junior players were not able to live up to their ranking at the **BNI Badminton Asian Junior Championship 2023**. In the team event, held from 7 – 11 July 2023, our team topped Group C beating India, Hong Kong and Bangladesh to qualify to the quarter-finals. While expected to beat Thailand, our young players succumbed to the pressure of being the top seeds, falling 0-3 to their opponents.

At the individual event, the following players obtained a top-four seeding as a result of their BWF World Junior ranking.

- Men's Singles: Eogene Ewe (2nd seed)
- Men's Doubles: Aaron Tai-Kang Khai Xing (top seed) and Muhammad Faiq-Lok Hong Quan (3rd seed)
- Women's Doubles: Ong Xin Yee-Carmen Ting (3rd seed)

However, the individual event did not provide the players with much respite as we failed in our target of getting podium finishes in at least 2 of the sectors. Our best achievers in each sector were:

- Siti Zulaikha, Ong Xin Yee, Ung Yi Xing (Round 16)
- Bryan Jeremy Goonting-Low Han Chen (QF)
- Ong Xin Yee-Carmen Ting (Round 16)
- Low Han Chen-Chong Jie Yu (Round 32)

Upon return of the team from Yogyakarta, the BAM Council, in its meeting on 15 July 2023, agreed on the set-up of a **Junior Development Task Force**, whose remit among others was to examine the below the par performances at the BNI and recommend remedies as we look forward to the BWF World Junior Championship 2023 in Spokane, USA.

The Task Force, chaired by Datuk V. Subramaniam (Deputy President I), consisted of the following members:

- Dato' Teoh Teng Chor
- Datuk Ng Chin Chai
- Mr. A'amar Hashim
- Mr. Mohamed Zambri Haji Bahari
- Dato' Kenny Goh Chee Keong

Following several meetings and interviews with various stakeholders including the Director of Junior Development, Datuk Haji Misbun Sidek, coaches and players, the Task Force agreed to part ways with Datuk Haji Misbun Sidek in August 2023 while entrusting the responsibilities of preparation for the BWF World Junior Championship 2023 to the existing coaches.

Preparations for the BWF World Junior Championship 2023 began with a four-week training block in August, followed by participation at the Malaysia Junior International 2023 where Eogene Ewe and the pair of Aaron Tai / Kang Khai Xing won their respective event.

For the BWF World Junior Championship 2023, we decided to send a minimal squad, preferring quality to quantity.

Both, in the mixed team event as well as the individual event, the players and coaches redeemed themselves as they returned with 3 bronze medals from Spokane, USA.

In the mixed team event, the players justified their third seeding – topping Group C with England, Latvia, Austria and Poland before beating India 3-0 in the quarter-finals before losing 0-3 to eventual champion China.

In the individual event, mixed doubles pair, Low Han Chen-Chong Jie Yu (seeded 4th) and men's doubles pair Bryan Jeremy Goonting-Aaron Tai reached the semi-finals in their respective event to bag the bronze medal.

6.2 The Future

Discussing the future of junior players at the ABM, the Junior Development Task Force, in its meeting on 27 November, agreed that in future, the ABM will only house players from the age of 16 years old and above.

Following feedback with the coaches, as well as mental health experts from the University of Cyberjaya, it was determined that it would be better for the overall development of under 16 players if they stay with their primary family who will be in a better position to provide the emotional support. Sporting-wise, this would also empower State Badminton Associations to expand their junior training programs.

However, it was also agreed that on a case-by-case basis, we would provide additional support in the form of monthly allowance and grant/financial support to participate in tournaments to talented individual players who are either below the age of 16 or who may opt to remain at home and train with their respective State/Club. In such case, the National Junior Head Coach will monitor their training programme. These potential players will be invited to train at ABM during the school holidays.

6.2.1 Talent Identification Year 2023

Following the principles above, a Talent Identification session was organized from 15 to 21 December at the ABM involving players aged 15 to 17 years old.

Criteria used to invite players for the TID:

1. Results from JET Finals – U16 category
 - Singles – Quarterfinalist
 - Doubles – Semifinalist
2. Results from National U18 Championships
 - Singles – Quarterfinalist
 - Doubles – Semifinalist

3. Recommendation by BAM Coaches
4. States to nominate – maximum one (1) male and one (1) female.

6.2.2 BAM x University of Cyberjaya Partnership

On the 7 July, BAM signed an MOU with the University of Cyberjaya (UoC) to help national shuttlers particularly the juniors to improve their personal growth, mental well-being and professional development.

The university, through the Faculty of Psychology and Social Sciences, would also help BAM in providing mental health awareness programmes, psychoeducation and improve players' well-being and resilience.

Lifestyle psychologists will be placed at ABM, on top of existing performance psychologists from the National Sports Institute (NSI) to help players, especially the juniors.


6.3 Coaches - Junior Squad

In the beginning of the year, the junior team coaching structure was split into Singles and Doubles, with Datuk Haji Misbun Sidek heading the singles department and Rexy Mainaky heading the doubles department (junior and senior).

In April, Amelia Anscelly and Ameer Amri Zainuddin were brought in place of Kwan Yoke Meng and Zhang Hong Yu whose terms had ended in March. Misbun Ramdan and Goh Giap Chin were added to the singles department in May and June respective.

With the release of Datuk Haji Misbun Sidek in August, the coaching team in the junior team was again restructured. Rexy Mainaky was appointed as the Director of Coaching responsible for both the senior and junior squad.

To assist Rexy, Jeffer Rosobin was appointed as the Head Coach of Juniors effective November 2023. He comes with a wealth of experience as a former player and coach for the Indonesian Badminton National team. Among his accolade include guiding Indonesian Women's Singles, Gregoria Mariska to the World Junior title in 2017. Jeffer has previously coached in Indonesia, Singapore, Sri Lanka and now Malaysia.




7 DATA ANALYSIS

As part of the effort to incorporate more science and data into our evaluation of players, training and tournament performance, BAM hired Siti Maryam Silahuddin in February 2023 and towards the year end, the HR count for data analysts doubled with the hiring of Muhamad Anwar Roslan.

Key to our data recording system is ARMS – an athlete records management system developed by Edge10. ARMS allow for the collection, aggregation and analysis of data, as well as controlled multiple data input point from players, coaches, sport science, sport medicine and the administration team.

There are two sources of data input, namely via our online account on ARMS and a second point via the ARMS ATHLETE mobile app.



Specifically, the use of ARMS allow us to do the following:

1. Profiling
2. Sports Medicine (Physiotherapist & Massage Therapist)
3. Player Wellness
4. Tournament Participation & Planning (Confirmed/Withdrawn)
5. Tournament Results & RAG Grading
6. Attendance & Training Performance Record
7. Heart Rate Data

7.1 SPECIFIC FUNCTION ARMS

7.1.1 Profiling: two kinds of profiling are done – physical profiling and functional movement profiling.

Aggregation of physical testing data collected throughout the years served as a basis for physical profiling baseline and current physical profiling standing. This assists coaches in identifying player's strength and weaknesses. Reports in ARMS as seen in Illustration 1 also allows coaches to compare player's data with that of others in the same age-category or department.





Illustration 1 is an example of report created from a player's physical testing which not only allows us to view the player's data but also compare player's data with other player's in the same age category or department.

Meanwhile, the Functional Movement Profiling (seen in Illustration 2) identifies deficiencies in player's movement and stability which is then taken into consideration when planning player's training programs to avoid musculoskeletal injuries.

7.1.2 Sports Medicine (Physiotherapist & Massage Therapist)

Every session of diagnosis and treatment from physiotherapists and masseurs are now recorded in ARMS. The input allows for:

- the monitoring of player's status (Fit for training/ Rehab/ Rest etc.).
- better case transfer between practitioners.
- monitor of risks and injury frequencies.

Illustration 4: ARMS is able to provide a summary of frequency of injuries by location by player and department. This allows us to identify patterns of injuries / weaknesses, if any.

7.1.3 Player Wellness

Data in this section is entered by each player every morning via the ARMS ATHLETE mobile app. Players input their daily conditions and recovery from previous training sessions, such as sleep quality, muscle soreness, mental energy and physical condition.

Prior to the morning training session, coaches will review the data input from their players and if necessary, modify their training load according to player's conditions.



Illustration 4 shows the view that the coaches see daily once prior to the day's first training session.

7.1.4 Tournament Participation & Planning (Confirmed/Withdrawn)

The calendar function in ARMS allow the administration and coaches to keep track of player's tournament plan and number of tournaments for the player. Players who are withdrawn from a tournament once registered are also recorded, as with the reasons for their withdrawal (for example, withdrawal due to injury; withdrawal due to poor performance at previous tournament, etc.). Such collection of data forms part of the player's quarterly and annual report card.

CALENDAR & PARTICIPATION

Instruction:

1. Navigate through the calendar.
2. Click on the specific tournament and scroll at the bottom of the calendar to view the players according to their participation status.
3. Do take note that some players (normally junior players) who play in 2 events, might be withdrawn from one event and not the other.

7.1.5 Tournament Results & RAG (Red, Amber, Green) Grading

A crucial element of ARMS is the ability for the system to keep track of a player's tournament results and grade them according to the KPI set before the tournaments. Player's performances are graded either red (did not meet KPI), amber (met KPI) or green (exceeded KPI).

Analysis can be done by player (Illustration 8) and/or by department (Illustration 9).

Illustration 9: Tournament performance grading by department




Illustration 10a: Tournament performance grading for each player (Summary)

7.1.6 Attendance & Training Performance Record

Attendance of coaches and players are also recorded for each training sessions and data can be viewed by HR department as well as coaches who may be away from ABM for tournaments. A report can be produced to show summary of attendances per player, ratio of days spent in training vs tournaments.




Illustration 10: blue section shows a player's daily attendance while the data in the bottom half shows the ratio of days spent in training vs tournament vs being absent with reason.

7.1.7 Heart Rate Data (Implemented for players under the 'Road to Gold' program)

To compare physical workload in training versus competitive matches, this module was created to collect player's heart rate data. The player's heart rate data is collected from the POLAR flow device worn by players during training sessions and tournaments. The collection, comparison and analysis of the data provides coaches, physiologists, strength and conditioning coaches to understand match intensity and other stimuli based on cardiovascular responses during competitive matches and thereafter, devise training programs that would mimic or simulate conditions during competition matches at training sessions.




Illustration 11: Heart rate data collected and comparison between heart rate during training vs at tournament.

8 SPORTS SCIENCE

Over the years, there has been a shift in how high-performance programmes are designed for elite athletes and elite sporting teams. Many at the elite level acknowledge the role of sports science in helping maximize performance and endurance in preparation of competitions while lessening the risk of injury.

At the ABM, the focus of 2023 was to enhance the sports science support to our players and this was done through:

- Additional manpower
- Purchase of new facilities / equipment
- Implementation of new practices based on sports science principles to enhance player performance.

8.1 Personnel

With the departure of High-Performance Director, Dr. Timothy Jones in May, we are still looking for a suitable replacement although the incumbent will now fully focus on the role of Head of Sports Science and Sports Medicine. We believe this will be the successful candidate to provide a better focus and support to the players and coaches.

Meanwhile, the sports science team saw the addition of 2 strength and conditioning (S&C) coaches with Chong Yao Seng and Syed Muhammad Murshid Syed Zubir joining Koh Weat Teck (physiologist) and Kui Wei Sheng and Tommy Pang Ze Quan (S&C coaches).

8.2 New Facilities / Equipment

8.2.1 Force Platform

Force plates are platforms which allow us to measure the force produced by our players during their jump. The device not only measures the jump height, but also the take-off force and velocity (i.e. how high the players jump and also how much time they used to perform the jump). This data allows coaches to understand the player's power when jumping and if necessary, adjustments to training program can be made if deemed that the player's speed or strength requires improvement.



8.2.2 Eccentric Flywheel

This device can improve the eccentric strength of a player which in turn can enhance athletic performance (i.e., lunging and jumping) by increasing stability, control, and force production during deceleration and change of direction. As heavy load is needed during eccentric training, the device ensured training was done in an effective yet safe manner. Eccentric training was also used in injury prevention and rehabilitation programs, by strengthening muscles and tendons to reduce the risk of injury, particularly for activities that involved sudden deceleration or high impact.



8.2.3 Sandpit

A sandpit was installed within the carpark facility at the ABM. Coaches utilise the sandpit to provide overload training intensity of badminton drills as players perform these drills on sand as oppose to on court. The sandpit sessions also assist in developing the strength of the intrinsic muscles of the ankles to prevent joint sprains and muscular strains.

8.3 New Practices

In addition to the regular sessions at the gym, the sports science team (physiologists and strength and conditioning (S&C) coaches form an important part of the support team and work closely with coaches and data analyst. Particularly, their role in the collection and interpretation of data is crucial as with working with coaches to then modify the training programs depending on the data collected.

8.3.1 Wellness questionnaire

S&C Coaches review players wellness score (e.g. sleep quality, muscular soreness

etc) at the start of training sessions. They provide the feedback to the coaches on the player's training readiness and helped to make appropriate adjustments to the training intensity. Trends in the results also allowed the sports science staff to understand how the players were responding to the daily training load to plan subsequent recovery strategies.

8.3.2 Heart Rate Monitoring

Working closely with the data analyst, the sports science team monitor the intensity during training of the senior players and these were compared with the heart rate data obtained during match play. This allowed the coaches to strategically adjust the intensity to match or surpass that observed during competition. With the heart rate sensor, the sports science staff were also able to prescribe the training intensity with better precision during individual cardiovascular training sessions.

8.3.3 Dynamic Strength Index (DSI)

The sports science team have started to regularly monitor the player's DSI to provide insights on the player's current strength and power profile. Regular monitoring of this index allowed continued adjustments to be made to the strength and conditioning programs for better training individualisation. The ratio is derived from the jump (i.e., peak force from countermovement jump) and strength (i.e., peak force from isometric midthigh pull) test performed on the force platform.

8.3.4 Protein Supplements

Protein supplements are now provided to all the senior players and juniors after their gym session, especially during periods of hypertrophy training (i.e., gaining muscle mass) or when the training volume was high. Recovery is important for the players, hence the supplement was provided ensure players hit their daily protein intake. Sports science staff concurrently educated the players about the importance of getting protein from natural food sources and to only use protein powder as a supplement when the daily requirements were not adequately met.

9 SPORTS MEDICINE

The demands of the modern game are so high that players are pushing themselves to the limit in every training session and competition. This increases the risk of injuries and without doubt, the role of our sports medicine team is crucial in preventing, diagnosing and treating injuries.

As some of our players (i.e. those in the Road to Gold and National Sports Council programs) are under the care of the National Sports Institute (NSI), our sports medicine team works closely with the NSI in monitoring the prevention and rehabilitation programs of these players.

Year 2023 saw the sports medicine team headed by Ooi Yu Hang, beefed up both in terms of personnel as well as equipment.

9.1 Personnel

Chang Han Shen (physiotherapist) and Muhammad Zharfan Muhammad Zailan (masseur) were added to the team, making the total headcount of 6 personnel in the sports medicine team:

- Head of Sports Medicine: Ooi Yu Hang
- Physiotherapists: Tan Hui Neng and Chang Han Shen
- Masseurs: Nurul Zakiah Abu Bakar, Muhammad Haqim Zainal and Muhammad Zharfan Muhammad Zailan

9.2 New Equipment

9.2.1 Shockwave Machine

This machine allows for high frequency impact towards to injured muscles and joints which in turn helps to accelerate the healing process through improved flexibility of the tendon (e.g: tendinitis, tendon tear, stiffness of tendon). Thus, allowing the injured players to recover from their injury quicker.



9.2.2 Ultrasound & Electro Combi Machine

Through the use of this machine, player experienced improved blood circulation & healing process though soundwave penetrating into the affected tissues. This helps to address musculature imbalances/impair observed during the treatment session, allowing a better functional pattern to enhance performance.

9.2.3 Game Ready Machine

The compression and cold temperature made possible via the game ready machine helps to promote blood circulation for faster recovery and reduce inflammation/overuse in both muscles & joints respectively. The device was also brought on-site to competitions to facilitate recovery in between games.

Game ready is able to be used for treatment on the ankle, knees, shoulders, back, etc.

9.3 New Practices

9.3.1 Functional Movement Screening & Y Balance test

The sports medicine team had, in the year 2023, started to conduct Functional Movement Screening (FMS) & Y Balance test for senior players. Data collected through this screening helped identify areas of movement compensations (i.e., lack of mobility/stability) which may lead to injury. The data is also shared with the sports science team to highlight players' physical condition.

9.3.2 Increased Massage Session

With the additional personnel, players in the senior squad are now able to use massage services twice a week as opposed to the previously once a week session. This allowed for the players to have more recovery sessions during week, and therefore better recuperation after training. The additional manpower also made it possible for more massage services to be available during competitions on-site.







2.1 Upgrading Course Accredited by BAM, Leading to BAM Certification

The upgrading course was successfully conducted in conjunction with the PETRONAS National U-18 Championships 2023 in Kedah, with the theory sessions held from 31 July to 1 August, followed by practical sessions from 2-6 August.

A total of 16 candidates underwent assessment by Mr. Teo Kian Joo and Mr. David Teo, with 12 candidates passing and receiving recognition as BAM Certified by BAM TOC.

2.2 BAM Accredited Umpire Theory Exam

720 out of 769 registered participants from all states (except for Putrajaya and Terengganu) took the BAM Accredited Umpire Theory Exam. It was conducted simultaneously at respective State BA venues on 23 September 2023. Out of these 720 candidates, 521 (72%) successfully passed the exam and are scheduled to undergo practical assessment in 2024.

2.3 BAM Accredited Referee Course

Fourteen participants from all states attended the BAM Accredited Umpire Theory Exam held in Penang from 28-30 November, in conjunction with the 100PLUS National Under 12 & 16 Team Championships 2023. After the exam, the results were finalized, with 13 candidates passing and 1 not succeeding in the course.






2 ACTIVITIES

- 2.1 Building on the success of previous daily vlog series produced by the department, we continued to provide behind the scenes footage of the Badminton Asia Mixed Team Championships 2023 in Dubai and the Sudirman Cup 2023 in Suzhou with the aim to engage badminton masses, highlight the good work done behind the scenes to ensure the functionality of the national team and eliminate the notion of 'partial treatment' towards professional players. It garnered a combined total of **910K views**.
- 2.2 With the Association taking complete control of the PERODUA Malaysia Masters 2023 presented by Daihatsu tournament organization, the department worked extensively on the promotion of the tournament with the objective of driving up ticket sales.

A three-pronged strategy was used to promote the tournament through **digital boards** covering Klang Valley area, **ASTRO Radio** covering all languages – Malay, English, Chinese, Tamil and **BAM social media platforms**.

The Association managed to record an unprecedented profit from the organization of the Super 500 tournament. Our four-court livestream throughout a four day operation garnered **632K views**.



- 2.3 The department assisted with the creation of branding collaterals led by Senior Multimedia Executive, promotion and invites that include both media together with the fans for the Sudirman Cup 2023 simulation, the President's Cup on 7 May at the Stadium Juara in Bukit Kiara. We also worked with Astro Arena to ensure live TV broadcast of the event.

Fans came in droves to fill the stadium with a reported attendance of 2,200 to provide a realistic tournament atmosphere for the national team.



These videos showcased ABM's commitment to high technology and high-performance culture, including injury prevention methods, the recovery process for national players, the usage of a brand new sandpit and the confidence restoration of the post-Asian Junior Championships squad through psychiatric support.

In an exciting move, the department is gearing up to launch the sales of official merchandise at the PETRONAS Malaysia Open 2024 in Axiata Arena led by Media Executive. This strategic move aims to fortify engagement with the fans, offering them a tangible way to connect with the Association.

1 PABM Building Update as of 31st December 2023

Any defects to PABM will be managed by BAM except for major defects such as structural failure, roofing defect and internal plumbing defect which need to be referred to Perbadanan Stadium Malaysia (PSM) and Kementerian Belia dan Sukan (KBS).

One of the key defects from 2022 has been rectified. The defect was:

- 1.1.1 leaking ABM court roof
- 1.1.2 damaged building rooftop.

External contractors were engaged by PBAM to rectify these defects although it is under the jurisdiction of PSM as the defects were serious.



After rectification of the damaged roof.

1.1.3 The leakage issues in the badminton court roofing were due to design flaws, resulting in significant leaks onto the courts. We have addressed this by contracting a reasonably priced contractor to repair the damage. The identified leaking spots have been repaired and are currently being monitored for further assessment.



1.1.4 Another significant breakdown we encountered was the failure of CWP Pump #2. To address this issue, we replaced the damaged bearings and upgraded to flexible coupling to better withstand the vibration damage to the CWP Pump.



2 Agreement Between Perbadanan Stadium Malaysia (PSM) and Badminton Association of Malaysia (BAM) on Akademi Badminton Malaysia (ABM)

- i. BAM has sent a letter to the Minister of Youth & Sports, YB Hannah Yeoh requesting assistance on the below after discussion with the Minister during her visit to PABM on 10 February 2023:
 - Request waiver on the monthly rental for PABM
 - BAM is given the sole rights for the use of Stadium Juara for National Junior Training Center
 - Solar installation for PABM
- ii. A meeting was held with the CEO of PSM on the 27 February 2023 to discuss on BAM request to YB Minister of Youth & Sports.
- iii. Another meeting was convened with the Chairman of PSM on August 8, 2023, to discuss BAM's request to the Minister of Sports and Youth. The PSM Chairman provided assurance that BAM's request would be considered and indicated that it would be brought up at the PSM Board Meeting in October 2023.
- iv. On 9 September 2023, BAM dispatched a letter to PSM inquiring about the status of its request regarding rental and other related matters. A copy of the letter was also sent to the Minister's office. Currently awaiting a response from PSM, BAM is planning to schedule a meeting with the Sports Minister to further address this matter.
- v. PSM had a board meeting on the 6 December 2023 to discuss BAM's request. The decision will be made known to BAM.

3 PABM Building & Facilities

All major maintenance activities covering air condition units, WCPU chiller system, fire, lift, security, building cleanliness, court maintenance, electrical panels in MSB room and calibration of protection relays were carried out by PABM Facility Team and Contractors for the year 2023.

- Grease trap servicing and maintenance was carried accordingly in 2023.





- Replaced 10 sets of court mats on 7 September 2023 and another 8 set Yonex court mats on 24 October 23.




- A new wing for Sports Science Department was constructed. The construction was completed on the 1st Dec 2023.

 - MOU signing ceremony BAM and Astro Kasih




- BAM management decided to rent out the 18 courts when not used for training to the public after 7pm every weekday and after 4pm on weekends. The cost from the rental to public is used to pay off the utility and maintenance cost for PABM. The rental of the courts is managed by Courtsite.

- There is a 32% increase in utilisation revenue from Year 2022 to Year 2023
- The revenue from vending machine for the year 2023 is shown below:

- The revenue from the vending machine averages approximately RM 4856. This amount is shared between BAM and Courseite.
- Changed 36 units of 1000W HID Spot Light to 36 units of 400 W LED lights which will give more:
 - Electricity savings
 - Energy saving and less heat generated
 - 5 years warranty for the led lights
 - Current 1000 W spot lights is becoming obsolete and difficult to get spare parts and expensive
 - LED lights are more reliable and less maintenance required.
 - ROI is expected within 6 months.
