TAN SRI NORZA'S LEGACY: TRANSFORMING MALAYSIAN BADMINTON FROM 2017 TO 2024

Tan Sri Dato' Sri (Dr.) Mohamad Norza Zakaria began his tenure as President of the Badminton Association of Malaysia (BAM) in 2017, ushering in a new era for Malaysian badminton. Over the course of his presidency until 2024, he led transformative reforms and pioneering initiatives that redefined BAM's structure, nurtured a new generation of talent and re-established Malaysia's resurgence on the global badminton stage.

Pioneering Structural and Developmental Changes

Tan Sri Norza's leadership was marked by visionary changes within BAM's structure. One of the first significant moves was the introduction of Employees Provident Fund (EPF) and Social Security Organization (SOCSO) benefits for national players in 2017 - six years ahead of its adoption as a national safety net standard. This initiative highlighted BAM's commitment to ensuring financial security and social welfare for its athletes.

Another milestone was the relocation of players and officials to the state-of-the-art PETRONAS Akademi Badminton Malaysia (ABM) in 2017. This world-class facility, equipped with 18 badminton courts, a gym, and a rehabilitation center, now serves as home to 120 players, half of whom are athletes under 18. The move was a game-changer in Malaysia's youth development system, not only allowing juniors to access the same high-performance environment as elite players but also saw BAM transitioned from the traditional schooling system at Bukit Jalil Sports School (BJSS) to a private IGCSE education model at ABM.

This shift enabled athletes to train, study, and reside in one location, fostering a more balanced approach to both academics and sports. The tailored education program provided players with a flexible schedule, ensuring their academic aspirations were not compromised while they pursued sporting excellence.

A Progressive Approach to Player Development

Tan Sri Norza's tenure also saw a paradigm shift in BAM's talent development strategy. Moving away from rigid age-based categorization, BAM implemented a performance-driven approach centered around world rankings and merit-based selection. This initiative accelerated the growth of young players, fostering healthy competition and enhancing Malaysia's competitiveness on the global stage.

Additionally, BAM nurtured a two-pronged development structure that supported both BAM-backed athletes and independent shuttlers. This inclusive model ensured that the best Malaysian talents—whether within BAM or outside - were given equal opportunities to thrive, thereby strengthening the national badminton ecosystem. Additionally, the rise of Lee Zii Jia, a product of the esteemed ABM, further underscored the effectiveness of BAM's developmental programs in producing world-class athletes.

Historic Milestones in Malaysian Badminton

One of the most defining moments of Tan Sri Norza's tenure was when Aaron Chia and Soh Wooi Yik made history by becoming Malaysia's first badminton world champions after a 45-year wait. Their triumph at the BWF World Championships in 2022 marked a watershed moment in the nation's sporting history. In addition, the pair became the first Malaysians to successfully defend the Olympic bronze medal they won in Tokyo 2020 by securing another bronze at the Paris 2024 Olympics, underlining their consistency and elite status on the world stage.

Pearly Tan and Thinaah Muralitharan also etched their names in history by securing the French Open women's doubles title, ending a 109-year wait for Malaysia in that category.

He also helped propel Chen Tang Jie and Toh Ee Wei to world No. 3 in the mixed doubles world ranking.

Malaysia clinched the Badminton Asia Team Championships (Men's Team) title in 2022 for the first time - marking a historic regional triumph.

During his tenure as BAM President, national players clinched an impressive 36 BWF titles, reinforcing the nation's status as a dominant force in international badminton.

Securing Unprecedented Sponsorships and Financial Stability

During his presidency, Tan Sri Norza led BAM through financially challenging times, successfully securing record-breaking sponsorship deals. His tenure saw landmark agreements with PETRONAS, YONEX, AFFIN Bank amounting to RM58.5 million. These partnerships not only reinforced BAM's financial stability but also demonstrated global recognition of Malaysia's stature in world badminton.

Strengthening Grassroots Development and Stakeholder Engagement

Recognizing the need for a robust grassroots system, BAM introduced an *'Accreditation System for Clubs'* - a pioneering initiative aimed at fostering stronger ties with local communities and clubs. Inspired by European models, this system provided BAM-accredited clubs with official recognition and certification, creating a more structured and inclusive badminton development framework across Malaysia.

A Legacy of Progress and Excellence

Tan Sri Norza's leadership has left an indelible mark on Malaysian badminton. His tenure from 2017 to 2024 was characterized by ground-breaking reforms, historic achievements, and a long-term vision for the sport's sustainable growth. Through his unwavering commitment, BAM has evolved into a more dynamic, well-structured, and athlete-centric organization, ensuring Malaysia continues to be a powerhouse in world badminton for years to come.

Article 9 ii a)

The current Article 9 ii) a) reads "The Vice-Presidents shall elect one from among themselves to serve in the Council as Deputy President for a term of four years only unless re-elected and provided he remains a President of an affiliate."

It was unanimously approved that the new Article 9 ii) a) shall read **"The AGM shall elect Deputy President I, amongst the Vice Presidents to serve as Deputy President 1 in the BAM Council. He / she shall hold the position for a term of four (4) years."**

Further, an additional article, to be Article 9 ii) b) was unanimously approved by the Council as **“The AGM shall elect a Deputy President II from either amongst the Vice Presidents or any person deemed fit to hold the position of Deputy President II in the BAM Council. He / she shall hold the position for a term of four years only.”**

Tan Sri Dato’ Sri (Dr.) Mohamad Norza Zakaria and YH Dato’ Kenny Goh Chee Keong confirmed that while the amendment clarified the definition of Deputy President I and Deputy President II, the amendment does not reflect that Deputy President I is more powerful than Deputy President II. Both have the same level of authority.

Article 9 iii

The current Article 9 iii) reads “Honorary President”.

The Council unanimously approved for the new Article 9 iii) to be **“Honorary Life President”**.

Article 9 iii) a)

The current Article 9 iii) a) reads “The Annual General Meeting may appoint distinguished persons to be Honorary Presidents of the BAM.”

The proposed new wording for Article 9 iii) a) are “The President in consultation of the BAM Council, may appoint an Honorary Life President.” Council members agreed that only those who have previously served as BAM President are entitled to be appointed as an Honorary Life President.

As such, Council unanimously agreed for the new Article 9 iii) to read as **“The President, in consultation with the BAM Council, may appoint, an ex-BAM President to become an Honorary Life President”**.

In response to YBhg. Dato’ Sri Khairudin Samad’s question on how many Honorary Life Presidents can BAM have, YH Dato’ Kenny Goh Chee Keong responded that Article 9 iii) “Honorary Life President” is singular. Therefore, there can be only one “Honorary Life President”.

Article 9 iii) b)

The current Article 9 iii) b) reads “Honorary President shall serve in that capacity for a term not exceeding four years and not less than one year.”

The Council unanimously agreed that **Article 9 iii) b) shall be deleted.**

Article 9 iii) c)

The current Article 9 iii) c) reads “Honorary President may attend and participate in the General and Council Meetings of the BAM but shall have no vote.”

The Council unanimously approved for the new Article 9 iii) b) to read **“The Honorary Life President is an advisory position, and the person shall be invited to all Council and General Meetings but without voting rights.”**

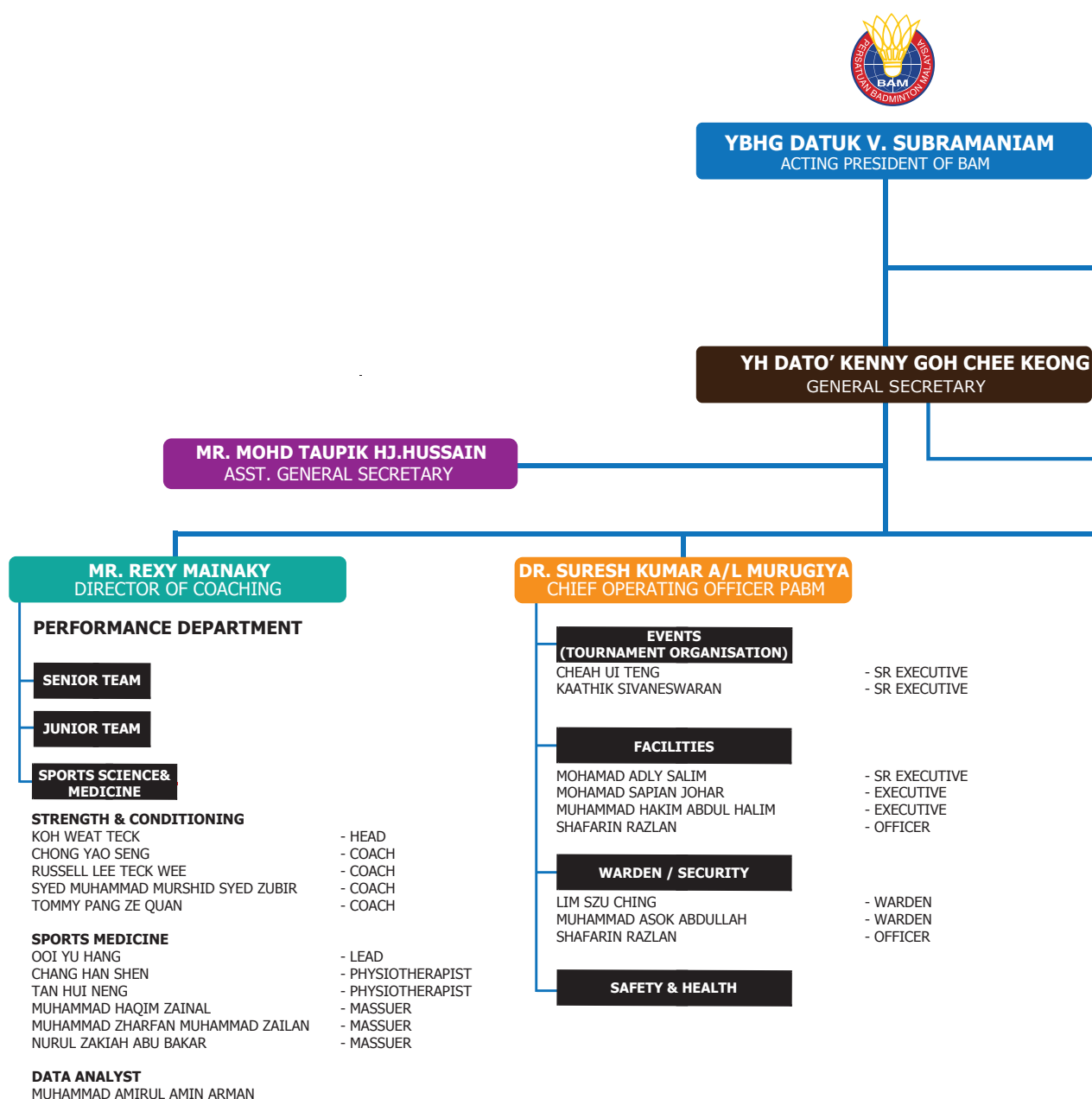

3 ACTIVITY REPORT

3.1 COMMERCIAL PARTNERSHIP

3.1.1 Institut Jantung Negara (IJN)



On 20 May 2024, BAM and the nation's premier cardiovascular and thoracic center, Institut Jantung Negara (IJN) agreed to collaborate for the next three years in an agreement that will not only see BAM players undergoing health checks at IJN but also the presence of IJN's ambulance and medical personnel at events organized by BAM.

3.1.2 AFFIN Group



AFFIN Group renewed its partnership with BAM on 29 November 2024 for 3 years, reaffirming its role as BAM's Official Bank Partner. This renewed collaboration underscores AFFIN's commitment to elevating Malaysia's national sport while inspiring a new generation of badminton enthusiasts and fostering unity and sportsmanship across the nation.

As part of the partnership, AFFIN remains a joint title sponsor for BAM's flagship junior development programme, AFFIN 100 Plus Junior Elite Tour, which will feature tournaments nationwide. This initiative aims to nurture emerging talent and instill a spirit of excellence in young players. In addition, the AFFIN logo will be prominently displayed on the national team's tournament shorts and training jerseys, symbolising steadfast support for Malaysian badminton.

3.1.3 YONEX-SUNRISE



In a glittering event held at the W Hotel in Kuala Lumpur, the BAM extended its partnership with globally renowned badminton equipment brand YONEX until 2028.

This new agreement builds upon the successful collaboration that began in 2021. Initially set to end in 2026, the partnership has been extended ahead of its original expiry, reflecting YONEX's faith in BAM and a shared commitment to ensuring uninterrupted preparations for the Los Angeles 2028 Olympics.

Under the renewed partnership, YONEX will continue to provide equipment to national players and will serve as the Official Equipment Supplier for the PETRONAS Malaysia Open (BWF World Tour 1000), PERODUA Malaysia Masters, and other BAM-organized tournaments.

3.2 TRANSFORMATION EXERCISE WITH PEMANDU

On 21 June 2024, BAM announced a strategic collaboration with PEMANDU Associates to enhance BAM's operations, strengthen the local badminton ecosystem, and fast-track improvements to meet future challenges and claim Malaysia's spot in the top three nations in badminton in the lead-up to the LA2028 Olympic games.

Through this collaboration, PEMANDU Associates conducted a thorough review of BAM's core operational areas, including the Technical Department, Player Development and Management, Financial Management, Governance, and Performance Management. The three-part process involved Diagnostic Analysis, Strategic Workshops, Problem-Solving and Lab sessions, where stakeholders met to provide their thoughts and input.

After 20 Lab Sessions and engagements with 24 staff and 131 coaches and players, PEMANDU's final 399-page report was presented to the Acting President, Datuk V. Subramaniam and General Secretary, Dato' Kenny Goh. Presentation to the BAM Council is set for January 2025.

3.3 ASIAN HIGH PERFORMANCE BADMINTON CENTRE

Acknowledging its status as a premier badminton training hub, the ABM was selected by the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) as its Asian High-Performance Badminton Centre on 9 September 2024. As an Asian High-Performance Centre, the BAM will assist OCA in elevating badminton development across Asia by offering elite training to players, coaches, and umpires, particularly from developing National Olympic Committees.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Persatuan Badminton Malaysia ("the Association"), which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31st December 2024, the statement of comprehensive income and statement of changes in fund balance and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, as set out on pages 6 to 20.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Association as at 31st December 2024, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in Malaysia.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with approved standards on auditing in Malaysia and International Standards on Auditing. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the By-Laws (on Professional Ethics, Conduct and Practice) of the Malaysian Institute of Accountants ("By-Laws") and the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' International Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (including International Independence Standards) ("IESBA Code"), and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the By-Laws and the IESBA Code.

Responsibilities of the Council Members for the Financial Statements



NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2024

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The Persatuan Badminton Malaysia (“Association”) is a non-profit organisation dedicated to encourage, promote and control the game of Badminton in Malaysia.

The Association is registered under the Sports Development Act 1997.

The registered office and principal place of operation is:-

2. COMPLIANCE WITH FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS AND THE COMPANIES ACT

The financial statements of the Association have been prepared in compliance with the Malaysian Private Entities Reporting Standard (“MPERS”) issued by the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board (“MASB”).

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of Preparation

The measurement bases applied in the preparation of the financial statements include cost, amortised cost, recoverable value and realisable value as indicated in the accounting policies set out below. Accounting estimates are used in measuring these values.

The financial statements are presented in Ringgit Malaysia (“RM”), which is the functional currency of the Association.

b) Property, Plant and Equipment and Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Depreciation of property, plant and equipment is provided on a straight line basis to write off the cost of each asset to its residual value over the estimated useful life at the following annual rates:-

Building	2%
Long leasehold land	Remaining lease period
Furniture, fittings and office equipment	20%
Sport equipment	20%
Renovation	20%

The carrying values of property, plant and equipment are reviewed for impairment when there is an indication that the assets might be impaired. Impairment is measured by comparing the carrying values of the assets with their recoverable amounts. An impairment loss is charged to the statement of comprehensive income immediately.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. The difference between the net disposal proceeds, if any and the net carrying amount is recognised in profit or loss and the unutilised portion of the revaluation surplus on that item is taken directly to general fund.

c) Financial instruments

i) Initial Recognition and Measurement

The Association recognises a financial asset or a financial liability (including derivative instruments) in the statement of financial position when, and only when, it becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at fair value, which is generally the transaction price, plus transaction costs if the financial asset or financial liability is not measured at fair value through profit or loss. For instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss, transaction costs are expensed to profit or loss when incurred.

ii) Derecognition of Financial Instruments

A financial asset is derecognised when, and only when, the contractual rights to receive the cash flows from the financial asset expire, or when the Association transfers the contractual rights to receive cash flows of the financial asset, including circumstances when the Association acts only as a collecting agent of the transferee, and retains no significant risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset or no continuing involvement in the control of the financial asset transferred.

A financial liability is derecognised when, and only when, it is legally extinguished, which is either when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged or cancelled or expires. A substantial modification of the terms of an existing financial liability is accounted for as an extinguished of the original financial liability and the recognition of a new financial liability. For this purpose, the Association considers a modification as substantial if the present value of the revised cash flows of the modified terms discounted at the original effective interest rate differs by 10% or more when compared with the carrying amount of the original liability.

- iii) **Subsequent Measurement of Financial Assets**
 For the purpose of subsequent measurement, the Association classifies financial assets into two categories, namely:
- financial assets at fair value through profit or loss, and
 - financial assets at amortised cost.
- Other than financial assets measured at fair value through profit or loss, all other financial assets are subject to review for impairment.
- iv) **Subsequent measurement of Financial Liabilities**
 After initial recognition, all financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.
- v) **Fair Value Measurement of Financial Instruments**
 The fair value of a financial asset or a financial liability is determined by reference to the quoted market price in an active market, and in the absence of an observable market price, by a valuation technique using reasonable and supportable assumptions.
- vi) **Recognition of Gains and Losses**
 Fair value changes of financial assets and liabilities classified as at fair value through profit or loss are recognised in profit or loss when they arise.
- For financial assets and financial liabilities carried at amortised cost, a gain or loss is recognised in profit or loss only when the financial asset or financial liability is derecognised or impaired and through the amortisation process of the instrument.
- vii) **Impairment and Uncollectibility of Financial Assets**
 At the end of each reporting period, the Association examines whether there is any objective evidence that a financial asset or a group of financial assets is impaired. Evidences of trigger loss events include:
- Significant financial difficulty of the issuer or obligor;
 - a breach of contract, such as default or delinquency in interest or principal payments;
 - granting exceptional concession to a customer;
 - it is probable that a customer will enter bankruptcy or other financial reorganisation;
 - the disappearance of an active market for that financial asset because of financial difficulties; or
 - any observable market data indicating that there may be a measurable decrease in the estimated future cash flows from a group of financial assets.

For short-term receivables, where the effect of discounting is immaterial, impairment loss is tested for each individually significant receivable wherever there is any indication of impairment. Individually significant receivables for which no impairment loss is recognised are grouped together with all other receivables by classes based on credit risk characteristics and aged according to their past due periods. A collective allowance is estimated for a class group based on the Association's experience of loss ratio in each class, taking into consideration current market conditions.

d) Government Grants

The Association does not recognise government grants, including non-monetary grants at fair value, until there is reasonable assurance that the Association will comply with the conditions attaching to the grants and the grants will be received.

All government grants are recognised as income in profit or loss on a systematic basis over the periods in which the Association recognises as expenses the related costs for which the grants are intended to compensate. Any balance amount received not yet recognised in profit or loss is treated as a deferred income i.e. a liability in the statement of financial position.

e) Finance and operating leases

The Association recognises a lease whenever there is an agreement, whether explicitly stated as a lease or otherwise, whereby the lessor conveys to the lessee in return for a payment or series of payments the right to use an asset for an agreed period of time. A lease is classified as a finance lease if it transfers substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership. Title may or may not eventually be transferred. All other leases that do not meet this criteria are classified as operating leases.

f) Foreign Currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies during the financial year are converted to Ringgit Malaysia at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the statement of financial position date are translated to Ringgit Malaysia at the closing rates. Foreign exchange differences arising on translation are recognised in the income statement. Non-monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated to Ringgit Malaysia at rates of exchange ruling at the date of transactions.

g) Income Recognition

Income is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Association and when the revenue can be measured reliably, on the following bases:

- (i) Income from sponsorship, subsidies and grants are recognised on an accrual basis when the Association's right to receive payment is established.

Unrestricted sponsorships, subsidies and grants received are credited in full to the statement of comprehensive income as an income item. Restricted sponsorships, subsidies and grants received are offset against the related expenditure item, except for grants for capital expenditure which are credited to a capital fund statement.

- (ii) Income from rental of property is recognised on a time proportion basis over the lease term.

- (iii) Interest income from fixed deposits is recognised on an accrual basis.

h) Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

An impairment loss arises when the carrying amount of a Association's asset exceeds its recoverable amount.

At the end of each reporting date, the Association assesses whether there is any indication that a stand-alone asset or a cash-generating unit may be impaired by using external and internal sources of information. If any such indication exists, the Association estimates the recoverable amount of the asset or cash-generating unit.

If an individual asset generates independent cash inflows, it is tested for impairment as a stand-alone asset. If an asset does not generate independent cash inflows, it is tested for impairment together with other assets in a cash-generating unit, at the lowest level in which independent cash inflows are generated and monitored for internal management purposes.

The recoverable amount of an asset or cash-generating unit is the higher of its fair value less costs to sell and the value in use. The Association determines the fair value less costs to sell of an asset or a cash-generating unit in a hierarchy based on:

- (i) price in a binding sale agreement;
- (ii) market price traded in an active market; and
- (iii) estimate of market price using the best available information.

The value in use is estimated by discounting the net cash inflows (by an appropriate discount rate) of the asset or unit, using reasonable and supportable management's budgets and forecasts of five years and extrapolation of cash inflows for periods beyond the five-year forecast or budget.

For an asset measured on a cost-based model, any impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

For a cash-generating unit, any impairment loss is allocated to the assets of the unit pro rata based on the relative carrying amounts of the assets.

The Association reassesses the recoverable amount of an impaired asset or a cash-generating unit if there is any indication that an impairment loss recognised previously may have reversed. Any reversal of impairment loss for an asset carried at a cost-based model is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income, subject to the limit that the revised carrying amount does not exceed the amount that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised previously.

Subsequent increase in the recoverable amount of an asset is treated as reversal of the previous impairment loss and is recognised to the extent of the carrying amount of the asset that would have been determined (net of amortisation and depreciation) had no impairment loss been recognised. The reversal is recognised in the income statement immediately, unless the asset is carried at revalued amount. A reversal of an impairment loss on a revalued asset is credited directly to revaluation surplus.

However, to the extent that an impairment loss on the same revalued asset was previously recognised as an expense in the income statement, a reversal of that impairment loss is recognised as income in the income statement.

i) Employees Benefits

(i) Short term benefits

Wages, salaries, paid leave, paid sick leave, bonuses and non-monetary benefits are recognised as an expense in the period in which the associated services are rendered by employees.

Non-monetary benefits such as medical care and other staff related expenses are charged to the income statement as and when incurred.

(ii) Defined contribution plans

As required by law, companies in Malaysia make contributions to the Employees Provident Fund ("EPF"). Such contributions are recognised as an expense in the income statement in the financial year to which they relate.

j) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents represent cash and bank balances, bank overdraft, short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

4. CRITICAL JUDGEMENTS AND ESTIMATION UNCERTAINTIES

a) Judgements and Assumptions Applied

In the process of applying the Association's accounting policies, the management is not aware of any judgments that have significant effects on the amounts recognised in the financial statements.

b) Estimation Uncertainties

The measurement of some assets and liabilities requires management to use estimates based on various observable inputs and other assumptions. The areas or items that are subject to significant estimation uncertainties of the Association are in measuring:

- Determining the Value-in-Use

In determining the value-in-use of a stand-alone asset or a cash-generating unit, management uses reasonable and supportable inputs about sales, costs of sales and other expenses based upon past experiences, current events and reasonably possible future developments. Cash flows are projected based on those inputs and discounted at an appropriate discount rate(s). The actual outcome or event may not coincide with the inputs or assumptions and the discount rate applied in the measurement, and this may have a significant effect on the Association's financial position and results.

- Loss Allowances of Financial Assets

The Association recognises impairment losses for loans and receivables using the incurred loss model. Individually significant loans and receivables are tested for impairment separately by estimating the cash flows expected to be recoverable. All other loans and receivables are categorised into credit risk classes and tested for impairment collectively, using the Association's past experiences of loss statistics, ageing of past due amounts and current economic trends. The actual eventual losses may be different from the allowances made and these may affect the Association's financial position and results.

- Depreciation of Property, Plant and Equipment

The cost of an item of property, plant and equipment is depreciated on the straight-line method or another systematic method that reflects the consumption of the economic benefits of the asset over its useful life. Estimates are applied in the selection of the depreciation method, the useful lives and the residual values. The actual consumption of the economic benefits of the property, plant and equipment may differ from the estimates applied and this may lead to a gain or loss on an eventual disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment.

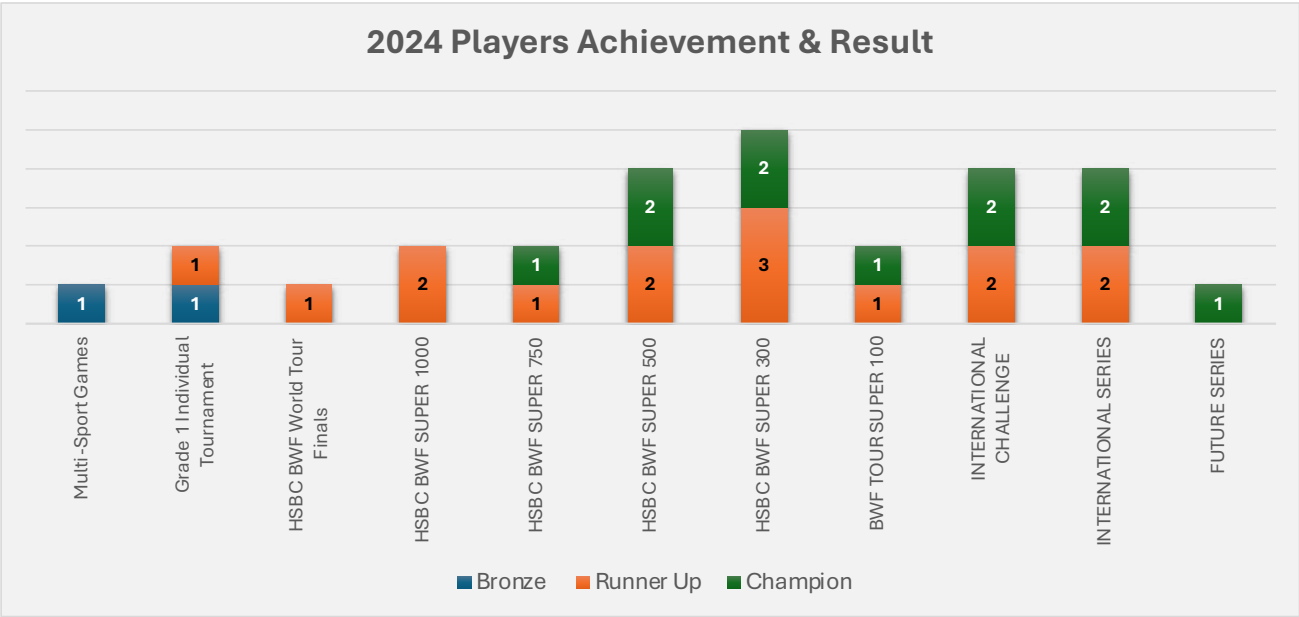

HIGH PERFORMANCE

1 NATIONAL SENIOR TEAM

1.1 Summary of Performances

As the start of a new Olympic cycle, 2024 was a year of both notable successes and significant challenges for Malaysian badminton. Among the highlights were our players’ achievements at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games and the rise of backup players and young pairs, signaling a promising future for the sport.

2 TOP PERFORMERS

In 2024, identifying the top performers in badminton has been challenging, as many players and pairs have showcased their individual highlights throughout the year. Notably, Malaysia’s only World Champions, Aaron Chia and Soh Wooi Yik, reaffirmed their status on the world stage by successfully defending their Bronze Olympic medal mirroring from their achievement at the Tokyo 2020 Games. While their primary goal was to secure gold, their remarkable comeback from a 16-20 deficit in the final game left a lasting impression on Malaysian fans.



Equally impressive were Pearly Tan and Thinaah Muralitharan, who made history as the first Malaysian women's doubles team to reach the semifinals at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. This achievement marked a significant milestone in their careers. Following the Olympics, they continued to excel, capturing a title at the LI-NING Hong Kong Open 2024 and finishing as runners-up at both the Korea Open 2024 and the CLASH ROYALE Arctic Open 2024, powered by YONEX.

Meanwhile, Chen Tang Jie and Toh Ee Wei continued their rapid rise in just their second year as a pair. Breaking into the top 10 rankings, they secured their spot at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, where they topped their group with a key victory over China's second-ranked pair. Their momentum carried them to a Korea Open 2024 title, as well as runner-up finishes at the PRINCESS SIRIVANNAVARI Thailand Masters 2024 and the YONEX Swiss Open 2024. Their breakthrough year reached another high when they became the first Malaysians to reach the final of the HSBC World Tour Finals since its rebranding from the BWF Super Series Finals. Towards the end of 2024, they achieved yet another milestone, reaching a career-high ranking of world No. 5 in mixed doubles.

i. Men's Team

The Thomas Uber Cup campaign for the men's team saw them placed in Group D, where they faced formidable opponents, including the second-seeded Denmark. A victory against both Hong Kong and Algeria was sufficient for Malaysia to secure a spot in the quarterfinals, despite a narrow 2-3 defeat to Denmark in their final group stage match.



Finishing second in the group positioned Malaysia to compete against the winner of another group, leading to a rematch with Japan. This encounter was particularly significant as it followed their previous meeting in the semi-finals of the Badminton Asia Team Championship in February. Points contributions from Lee Zii Jia, Leong Jun Hao, and Goh Sze Fei-Nur Izzuddin Rumsani ensured Malaysia's advancement to the semi-finals for the first time since 2016.

In the semi-finals, Malaysia faced the host nation, China, but unfortunately succumbed to a 1-3 defeat. Notably, the players who lost in this match were also the ones who had previously secured points for Malaysia in the quarterfinals. Despite the loss, Malaysia celebrated a significant achievement by earning their first Thomas Cup medals since 2016.

ii. Women's Team

The Malaysia women's team at the 2024 Thomas & Uber Cup Finals in Chengdu had a mixed performance. They were placed in Group B alongside Thailand, Chinese Taipei, and Australia. The women's team lost their opening match to Chinese Taipei 1-4. This was a significant challenge as they faced strong opposition.

The team continued to struggle, suffering a comprehensive 0-5 defeat against Thailand. These results hindered their ability to make a meaningful impact within the group, ultimately leading to their failure to advance to the knockout stages.

The performance raised concerns regarding the prospects of female athletes in the sport as it has been nearly 14 years since the Malaysia women's team last progressed beyond the group stage of the Uber Cup.

3 DEPARTMENT REVIEW

3.1 Men's Singles

At the end of year 2023, it was announced that the group of Men's Singles was divided into two groups, Team A and Team B. This division aimed to categorize players according to their skill levels and capabilities, as well as to allocate the number of tournaments each player would participate in based on their respective group.

Team A comprises Ng Tze Yong, Leong Jun Hao, Justin Hoh, Aidil Sholeh, and Eugene Ewe, with an emphasis on competing in higher-level tournaments and receiving a greater number of tournament opportunities. In contrast, Team B includes Kok Jing Hong, Shaqeeem Shahyar, Ong Ken Yon, Ong Zhen Yi and Chua Kim Sheng, who will primarily focus on lower-tier tournaments, with participation largely limited to the Southeast Asia region.

3.1.1 Highlights

In pursuit of his inaugural Olympic appearance, Ng Tze Yong's remarkable performance in 2023 raised hopes for Malaysia to secure two spots in Men's Singles, alongside his independent compatriot, Lee Zii Jia, for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. However, Ng faced a significant setback when he sustained a serious back injury during his first tournament of 2024 on home soil, which sidelined him for the entire year. Throughout 2024, Ng Tze Yong participated in only two tournaments due to his injury, ultimately missing the opportunity to qualify for the Olympics. He finished the qualification race ranked 17, just one position shy of securing a second men's singles spot. Additionally, his world ranking plummeted from a high of 14 to 202 by the end of the year, compounding the disappointment of his missed Olympic chance.

In the wake of Ng Tze Yong's absence, Leong Jun Hao stepped up as the primary men's singles player for BAM. The 2017 Asian Junior champion experienced a sluggish start to 2024, leading to scepticism among fans. However, after carrying the burden as the second Men's Singles representative for the Badminton Asia Team Championship in Shah Alam and the Thomas and Uber Cup in Chengdu, his performance significantly improved throughout the year. In 2024, Leong achieved 15 victories against higher-ranked opponents, including three wins over top 10 players.

He also reached the quarterfinals in consecutive SUPER 1000 and SUPER 750 events in Singapore and Indonesia, marking his debut in these competitions. Notably, his remarkable year culminated in a final appearance at the Kumamoto Masters in Japan, where he triumphed over notable players such as Lakshya Sen, Koki Watanabe, Kodai Naraoka and Jonatan Christie before narrowly losing to Li Shi Feng. These accomplishments have solidified his position within the Top 32 of men's singles, securing his eligibility for higher-level tournaments in 2025.

After a bittersweet end to 2023, Justin Hoh began his 2024 season in March at the Vietnam International Challenge. Though he started in a lower-tier tournament, that did not hinder his progress. From May to September, he clinched two titles at the I FEEL SLOVENIA LI-NING Open 2024 and the DOVE Saipan International 2024, along with a runner-up finish at the CROWNE PLAZA Northern Marianas Open 2024, helping him break into the Top 50.

Justin was also selected for Malaysia's Thomas & Uber Cup squad, where he played as the third men's singles representative in a crucial group-stage match against Denmark. In a tense showdown to determine the group winner, Malaysia fell 2-3, with Justin narrowly losing to the experienced Rasmus Gemke in three games. Despite the defeat, his progress throughout the year marked an important step in his development.

3.2.2 Highlights

In 2024, Letshanaa Karupathevan and Wong Ling Ching, as the oldest players of the group, faced challenges and setbacks while competing in higher-level tournaments compared to the previous year. From January to September, they collectively advanced to only one quarter-final across more than ten tournaments. However, following the appointment of Jeffer Rosobin as the new women's singles coach, who previously excelled in developing top players like Gregoria Mariska Tunjung during her junior career, noticeable improvements began to emerge. In his second tournament overseeing the department, Letshanaa securing a runner-up position at the WONDR by BNI Indonesia Masters II 2024, while both players reached the semi-finals at the WONDR by BNI Indonesia International Challenge 2024 in Surabaya.

The year 2024 also saw Siti Zulaikha Azmi had a notable year marked by several key achievements. Prior to her second tournament of the year, Siti Zulaikha finished as runner-up at the Sri Lanka International Series 2024, where she showcased her potential by defeating notable opponents like Chiara Marvella Handoyo, the World Junior Championships 2023 runner-up, in the semifinal. Siti earned bronze medal at Asia Junior Championships 2024 but then missing the World Junior Championships 2024 due to a heel injury. Siti Zulaikha then made a strong comeback. She captured her first senior international title at the

PETRONAS Malaysia International Series 2024 in Johor, marking a significant milestone in her career. Additionally, Siti Nurshuhaini Azman also earn her first title of the career by winning the RSL Lithuanian International 2024.

- Choong Hon Jian-Muhammad Haikal Nazri: Orleans Masters Badminton presented by VICTOR 2024 champion
- Arif Junaidi-Yap Roy King: Madrid Spain Masters 2024 by IBERDROLA runner up
- Aaron Tai-Kang Khai Xing: TOYOTA International Challenge 2024 champion

Malaysia's top men's doubles pair, Aaron Chia-Soh Wooi Yik, continued to shine on the international stage, securing a bronze medal at the 2024 Paris Olympics and claiming their second BWF World Tour title at the Korea Masters 2024. Meanwhile, Goh Sze Fei-Nur Izzuddin Rumsani made their mark with a silver medal at the Badminton Asia Championships (BAC) and a victory at the DAIHATSU Japan Open 2024 before their departure from the Akademi Badminton Malaysia (ABM) in August. Man Wei Chong-Tee Kai Wun also demonstrated significant improvement, reaching their first-ever Super 1000 final at the KAPAL API Indonesia Open 2024, marking a breakthrough year for the pair.

Beyond the consistent performances of the senior men's doubles pairs, the future appears promising as emerging and younger pairs continue to enhance their results. Choong Hon Jian-Muhammad Haikal Nazri maintained their impressive form from 2023, capturing their third title together at the Orleans Masters Badminton presented by VICTOR 2024. Similarly, Arif Junaidi and Yap Roy King also made their mark by securing a runner-up position at the Madrid Spain Masters 2024, just a week later.

Aaron Tai-Kang Khai Xing had a notable year for their last year in junior level. Early in the year, they clinched their first senior title at TOYOTA International Challenge 2024 by defeating the second seed Thai pair. They then showcased their prowess by earning the silver medal of the Asia Junior Championships in Yogyakarta and made history by winning the gold medal at the 2024 World Junior Badminton Championships in Nanchang, China which ended Malaysia's 13-year drought in the boys' doubles category at this prestigious event. By the end of the year, the pair managed to break in the top 60 of the BWF World Ranking.

Other backup players also had their standout moments. Newly formed pair, Bryan Jeremy Goonting-Muhammad Fazriq Razif made a solid debut, finishing as runners-up at the LI NING Sri Lanka International Challenge 2024. Their performance propelled them into the Top 70 rankings by the end of the year. Meanwhile, young duo Lok Hong Quan-Muhammad Faiq Haziq Masawi finished their year with a runner up finish at FELET Vietnam International Series 2024.

3.4.1 Highlights

Pearly Tan-Thinaah Muralitharan had a rejuvenated year compared to the previous one. With a minimal number of injuries, they participated in a total of 20 tournaments and delivered commendable performances. Their historic debut in Paris saw them secure victories over strong pairs, before losing to China's Chen Qing Chen-Jia Yi Fan in the semi-finals and then to Japan's Nami Matsuyama-Chiharu Shida in the bronze medal playoff. Notably, they claimed a title at the LI-NING Hong Kong Open 2024 and finished as runners-up at both the Korea Open 2024 and the CLASH ROYALE Arctic Open 2024, powered by YONEX, marking the highest number of podiums finishes in a single year throughout their BWF World Tour career.

The year 2024 also marked the resurgence of the partnership between Go Pei Kee-Teoh Mei Xing, following Anna Cheong's injury that prevented her return to the court. Their partnership began at TotalEnergies BWF Thomas & Uber Cup Finals 2024 versus Chinese Taipei with a brilliant win against No. 24 pair. Following their performance in Chengdu, it was decided that they will permanently combine. The pair then had up and downs in their partnership, before winning their first ever title at BAM Malaysia Super 100, upsetting the top-seeded pair from Chinese Taipei.

Additional backup players showcased their talents, notably the newly established duo of Cheng Su Hui-Lee Xin Jie, who began their partnership in August and secured a runner-up position at the PETRONAS Malaysia International Series 2024.

The departments also saw coaches experimented with different partnerships due to a lack of results. Towards the end of the year, no players were released from the squad following the appointment of Rosman Razak as the new head coach for the Women's Doubles in November 2024, with the aim of evaluating each player's potential within the national team.

3.5.1 Highlights

Chen Tang Jie-Toh Ee Wei continued to shine in the mixed doubles department, building on their strong form from 2023. A major highlight of their season was qualifying for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, where they topped their group with a memorable win over the second-seeded Chinese pair. They also clinched their maiden Super 500 title at the Korea Open 2024 and recorded two runner-up finishes at the PRINCESS SIRIVANNAVARI Thailand Masters and the YONEX Swiss Open.

Meanwhile, Hoo Pang Ron-Cheng Su Yin enjoyed a breakthrough year, rising from World No. 92 in January to break into the top 20 by year-end. Their standout performances included semi-final finishes at the Orleans Masters presented by VICTOR and the Sands China Ltd. Macau Open, as well as a runner-up finish at the LI-NING China Masters 2024. In their first-ever Super 750 final, they pushed the World No. 1 pair to three games in a thrilling contest.

In contrast to the encouraging results of 2023, the performance of the backup squad in 2024 fell short of expectations. While the top two pairs continued to deliver solid results, the backup team struggled to make an impact, failing to reach the finals in any of their tournament appearances. The situation was further compounded by major injuries to key players — Valeree Siow sustained an ACL rupture, while Low

Han Chen suffered ruptures to both the ATFL and CFL — sidelining both athletes for the remainder of the year. The department also saw a reshuffle in partnerships, most notably with Choong Hon Jian shifting his focus solely to men's doubles.

SPORTS SCIENCE

1 OPERATIONAL EXCELLENCE

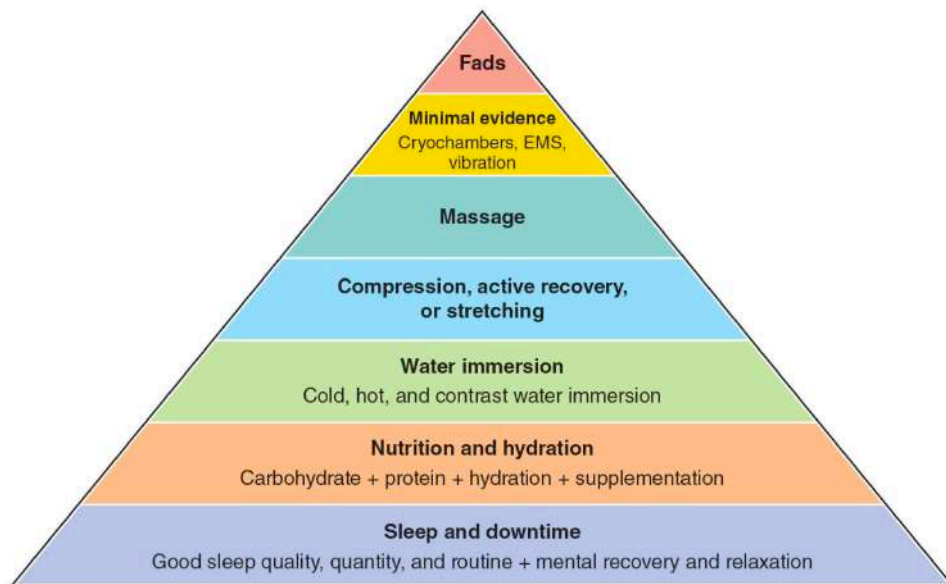


Figure 1. Pyramid delineating evidence-based training and recovery modalities

Since the establishment of the Sports Science and Medicine unit at the Badminton Association of Malaysia (BAM) in 2017, national players have benefitted from a comprehensive support system encompassing both training and recovery. The framework is specifically designed to meet the high-performance demands of elite badminton athletes (Figure 1).

Key components of this support include:

- A dedicated team of 11 full-time sports science, medical professionals and 1 part-time strength & conditioning staff (Table 1).
- A fully equipped strength and conditioning gym, alongside a dedicated recovery area, to adequately support training and regeneration.
- Nutritionally balanced meals provided at the canteen to fuel training and enhance recovery.
- On-site dormitories that offer players an optimal sleep environment for effective rest and recuperation.
- A newly expanded physiotherapy clinic with enhanced equipment, enabling effective in-house treatment and rehabilitation for player injuries.

Following a recent RM88,000 investment to enhance sports science capabilities at BAM, significant strides have been made in developing structured performance plans, implementing data-driven training management, conducting regular performance reviews, and refining coaching strategies. A notable advancement has been the integration of athlete management software, which serves as a centralised platform for recording physical test results and injury data. This system facilitates efficient communication and coordination between administrators, coaches, and the sports science and medical team.

In preparation for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, a dedicated sports science team from the National Sports Institute (ISN) has been assigned to support Olympic-bound players under the Road to Gold (RTG) programme. These practitioners are embedded in the athletes' daily training environment and travel with them to overseas competitions to ensure consistent, high-quality support is delivered at every stage of their Olympic journey.

2 KEY INSIGHTS & CHALLENGES

2.1 Injury Prevention

- The rising incidence of injuries during both training and competition highlights the urgent need for a comprehensive review of current athlete monitoring practices (Table 2).
- Existing methodologies—including wellness questionnaires and training load tracking—require reassessment to ensure consistent implementation and to deliver actionable insights that can guide adjustments to both court-based and physical training programmes.
- It is essential to plan and execute training loads using a periodised approach, one that promotes gradual performance improvements while minimising the risk of injury.

2.2 Training Environment

- A positive training environment fosters a culture of motivation, discipline, and accountability.
- According to BAM's newly appointed psychology consultant, Mr. Frederick Tan, there is a need to reinforce a performance-oriented culture and cultivate an environment that strengthens players' character, inspiring dedication and commitment to training. (Figure 2)
- The physical surroundings—including court, gym, and physiotherapy spaces—play a vital role in building team spirit and camaraderie, forming a strong foundation for success both on and off the court.

2.3 Training Plans

- Current training programmes lack a structured approach to periodisation, which is critical for long-term athlete development.
- The implementation of a comprehensive annual plan provides a strategic framework to reverse-engineer training intensity and volume across both on-court and physical conditioning sessions. (Table 3)
- Coaches and players must understand how training load management directly impacts performance gains and injury prevention—underscoring the adage, “The best ability is availability.”
- By aligning training cycles with the competitive calendar, this approach ensures athletes reach peak performance at key moments throughout the season.

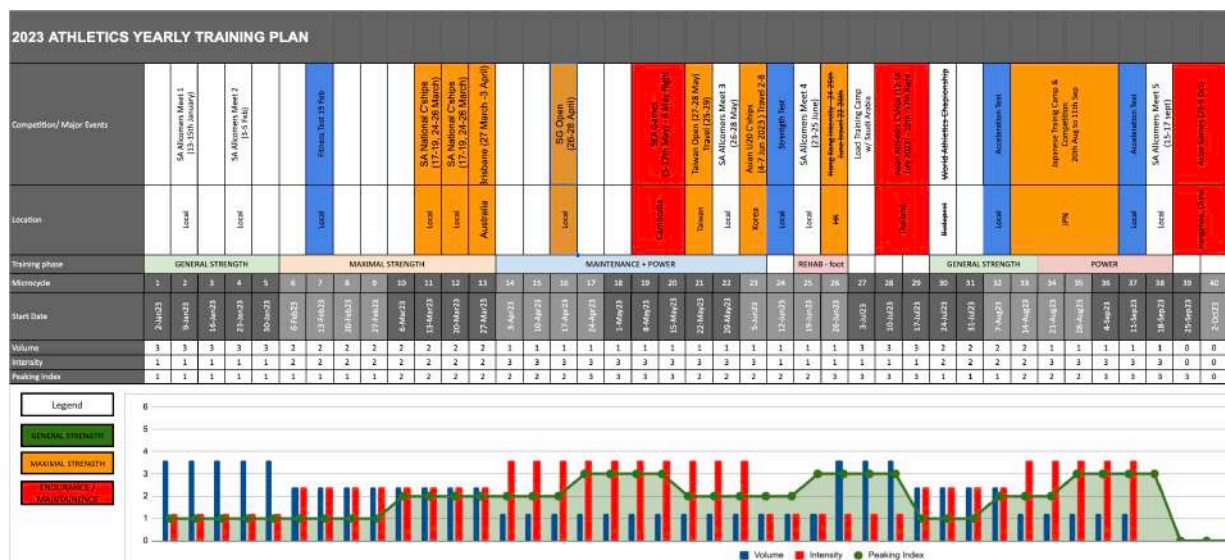

3 FUTURE OUTLOOK & STRATEGIC DIRECTION

Future efforts will focus on building upon the strong foundations already in place by advancing training methodologies and monitoring practices. The goal is to adopt a more holistic and integrated approach to sports science and medicine within BAM's high-performance environment.

3.1 Invisible Monitoring

- While both objective and subjective testing are useful in assessing an athlete's condition, they may add unnecessary physical and mental stress to already demanding training and competition schedules.
- Invisible monitoring refers to the unobtrusive collection of data during routine training or matches, providing performance insights without disrupting the athlete's workflow.
- A prominent example is the use of Global Positioning System (GPS) technology in sports such as football and rugby to monitor distance covered, speed, acceleration, and deceleration during performance.

3.1.1 Implementation in Badminton

- Recent technological advancements—particularly in performance analytics—have enabled the application of Local Positioning Systems (LPS) in indoor environments like badminton.
- The acquisition of the Catapult Vector Pro now enables the integration of heart rate data (internal load) and accelerometry data (external load) on a single platform, enhanced with video context.
- This allows coaches and sports science staff to extract meaningful insights into player workload, performance patterns, and tactical development. (Table 4)

3.2 Using Catapult to Guide Return-to-Play Progression

- The Catapult system has also been utilised to monitor the external load of a player undergoing a two-week return-to-training protocol.
- After one week of data collection, the player was found to be tolerating only half the intended training load (548 volume, 3.7 intensity) compared to her peers (819 volume, 6.1 intensity), accompanied by a reported pain score of 3–4/10 the following morning.
- Based on this analysis, the medical and coaching team concluded that the player is not yet ready to return to competitive tournaments.

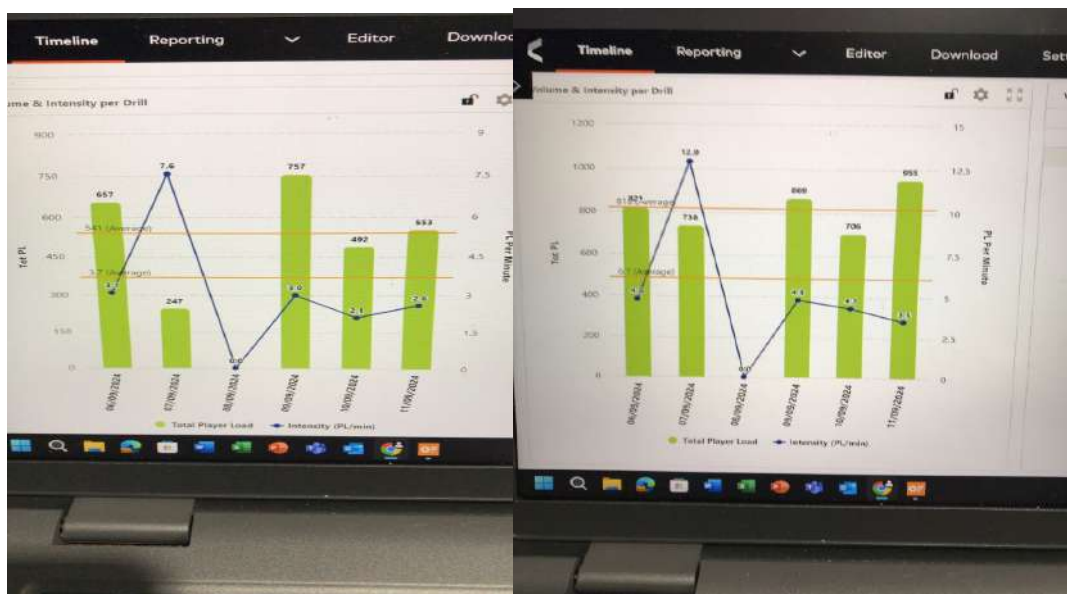


Figure 3. Training load and intensity data from Catapult

3.3 Tracking Training Readiness

- Assessing training readiness provides objective insights into an athlete's physical and psychological state, allowing for early identification of performance barriers or injury risks.
- Longitudinal tracking of physiological, psychological, and performance-related indicators supports evidence-based decision-making in training planning and load management.
- Key monitoring tools—such as Sleep Quality and Quantity, Session Rating of Perceived Exertion (sRPE), and Physical Readiness Assessments—help coaches optimise the balance between training intensity and recovery, ultimately enhancing performance and minimising overtraining or injury risk.

3.4 Implementations in Badminton

3.4.1 Wellness Questionnaire

- A daily wellness questionnaire, covering sleep quality, general well-being, and muscle soreness levels, is currently administered to players.
- However, player participation and consistency in completing the questionnaire have been suboptimal.
- A revised monitoring and feedback workflow is recommended to improve engagement and provide coaches and sports science staff with more reliable and timely insights into athletes' responses to training loads.

3.4.2 Session Rating of Perceived Exertion (sRPE)

- Training loads during both court and physical training sessions are indirectly monitored using sRPE.
- This method supports the management of athlete workloads, allows individualization of training programs, and promotes effective feedback loops between coaches and players.

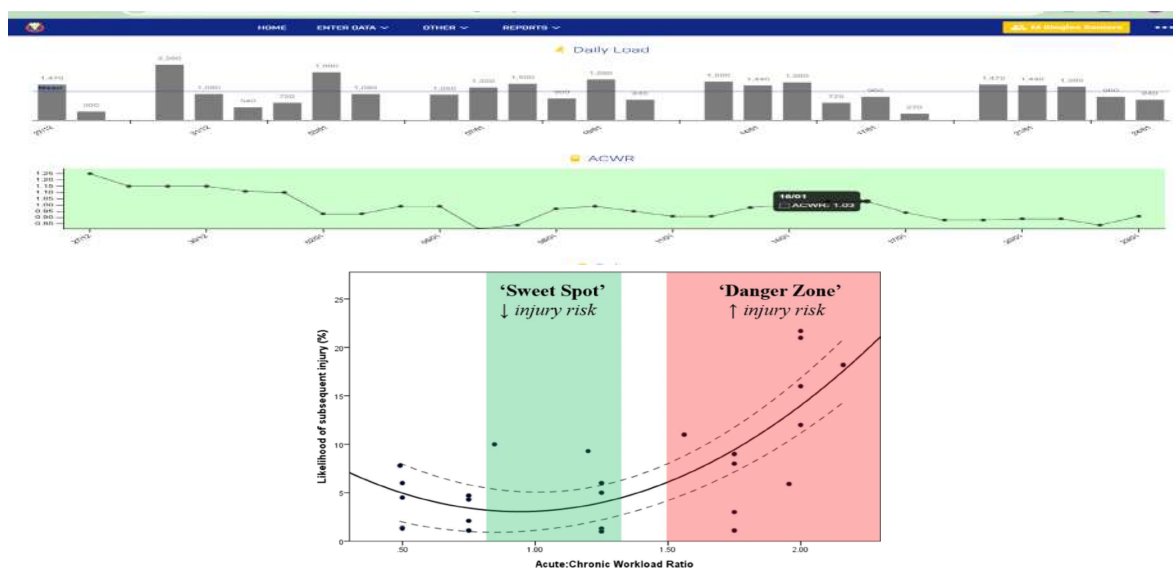


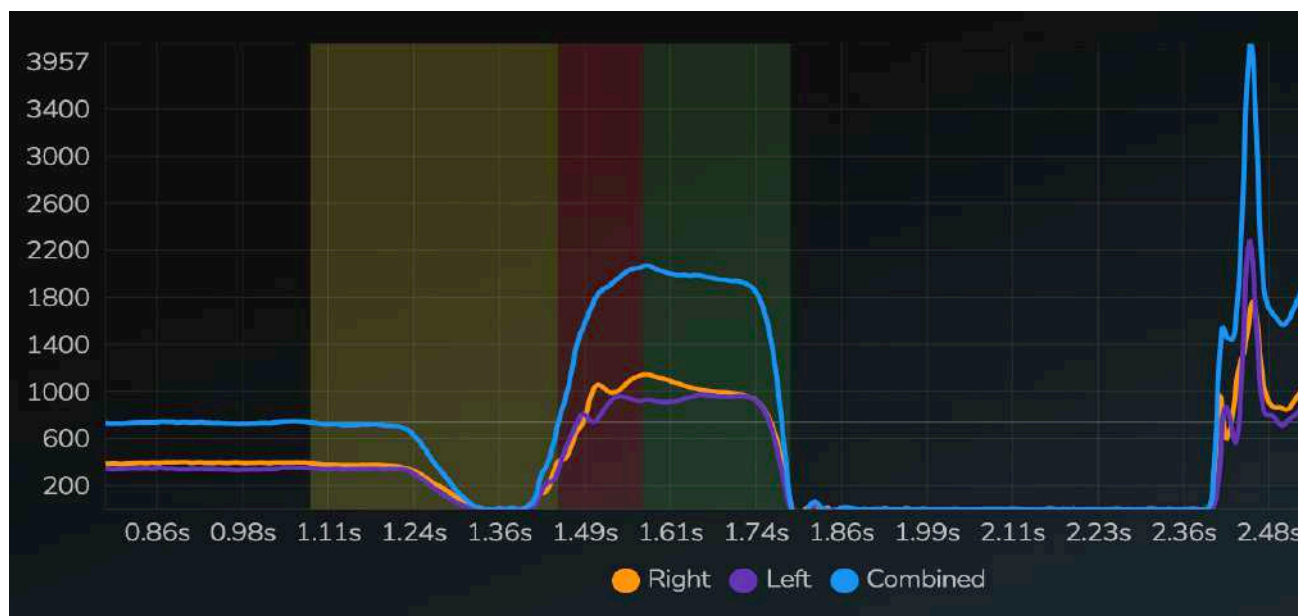
Figure 5. ACWR training load

- The recommended “safe zone” for the Acute:Chronic Workload Ratio is between 0.8 and 1.3, minimizing the risk of overtraining while promoting performance gains. (Figure 5)

3.4.3 Countermovement Jump (Force Plate Assessment)

- The countermovement jump (CMJ) test provides detailed metrics on ground reaction forces to evaluate jump performance.
- Key indicators such as peak force, rate of force development, and limb asymmetry offer insights into neuromuscular efficiency, explosive power, and potential injury risks.
- This enables the identification of deficits in takeoff or landing mechanics and informs targeted interventions to optimise player readiness and resilience.

3.4.4 Isometric Squat (Force Plate Assessment)

- This test measures the peak force output during a 3-second maximal effort isometric squat against an immovable bar.
- It replaces the traditional 5-repetition half squat to reduce injury risk during testing while maintaining the ability to compare strength metrics across athletes, including juniors and seniors.
- The isometric assessment provides a safer, consistent, and scalable method to monitor longitudinal strength development.

3.5 Sharing Sessions with Junior Athletes

- A monthly sharing session is conducted by the Sports Science team with junior athletes, focusing on critical elite lifestyle habits such as sleep hygiene, nutrition, and rehydration strategies.
- Moving forward, the Sports Medicine team will also contribute to these sessions, providing holistic guidance and fostering a culture of knowledge-sharing across performance disciplines.



3.6 Athlete Management System (AMS) Transition: From Edge10 to Teamworks

- After evaluating several Athlete Management System vendors, the Sports Science staff and Data Analyst have decided to transition from Edge10 to Teamworks.
- Key reasons for the switch include:
 - Multi-platform access: Accessible via web browsers, tablets, and mobile apps.
 - Robust integrations: Over 100+ integrations with other tools and platforms.
 - Scalability: Unlimited number of athlete and staff users allowed, supporting BAM's expanding operations.

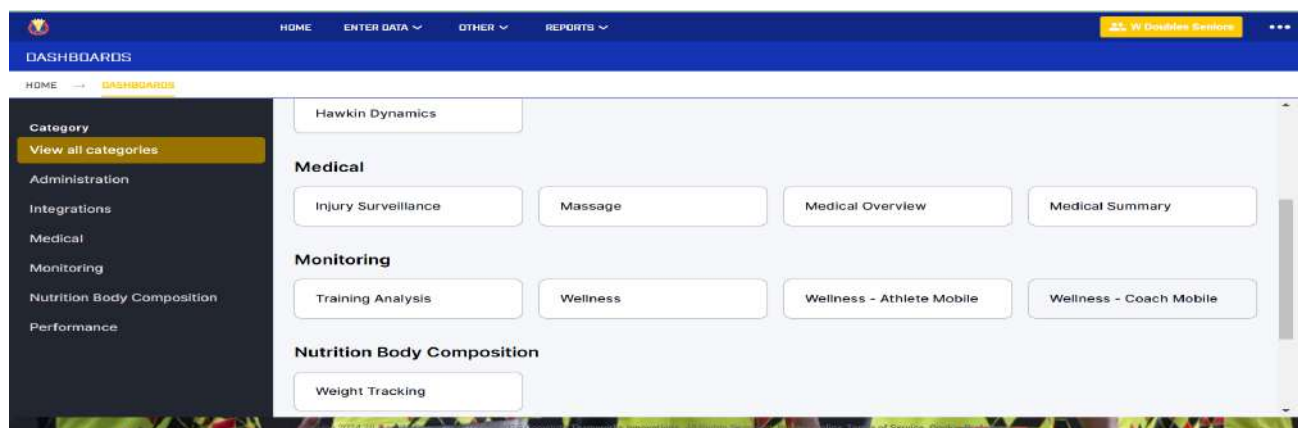


Figure 10. Teamworks AMS dashboard

3.7 Establishing Physical Testing Norms for Grassroots Talent

- In September, BAM's Data Analyst launched a publicly accessible scouting and performance resource site: <https://sites.google.com/view/bam-national-baseline-physical>
- The platform aims to:
 - Provide a benchmarking system for grassroots players to compare their scores with BAM juniors.
 - Offer training guidelines aligned with Long-Term Athlete Development (LTAD) principles.
 - Support talent identification and development through structured physical performance standards.

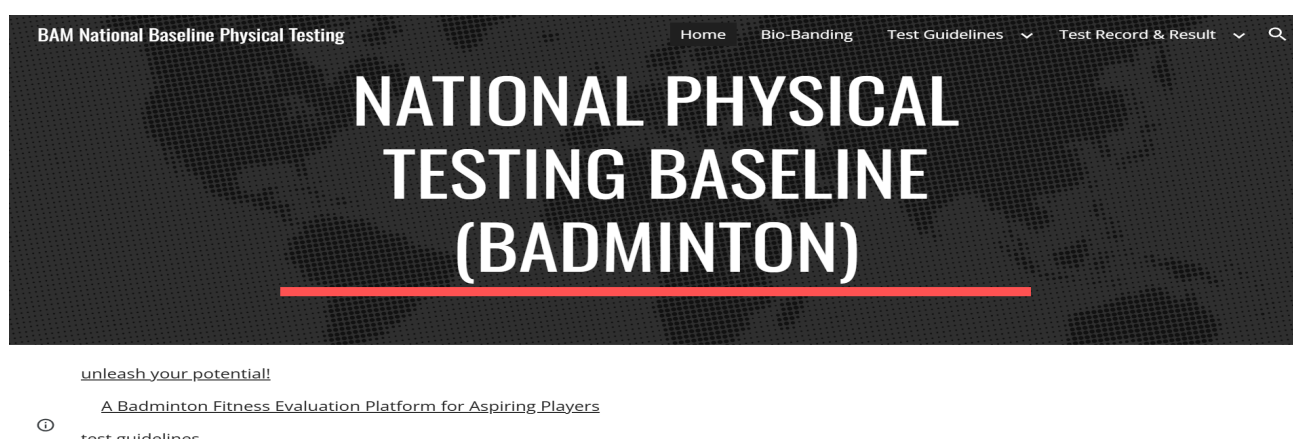


Figure 11. Website page

3.8 Development of a Return to Performance (RTP) Protocol

- A collaborative initiative between the Sports Science and Sports Medicine teams was launched in December to formalize a Return to Performance (RTP) protocol.
- Benefits of the RTP protocol include:
 - Enhancing communication across coaches, medical staff, and athletes by clearly defining injury recovery progressions.
 - Supporting informed decision-making regarding competition readiness.
 - Serving as a motivational tool by outlining specific recovery targets during each rehabilitation phase.

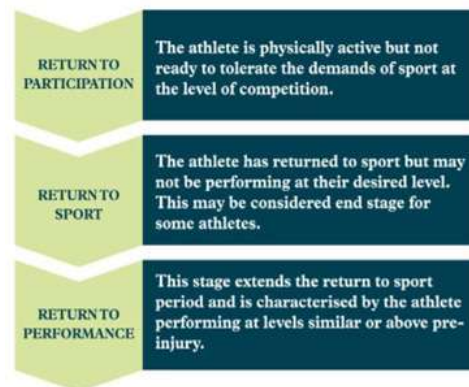


Figure 12. RTP Protocol

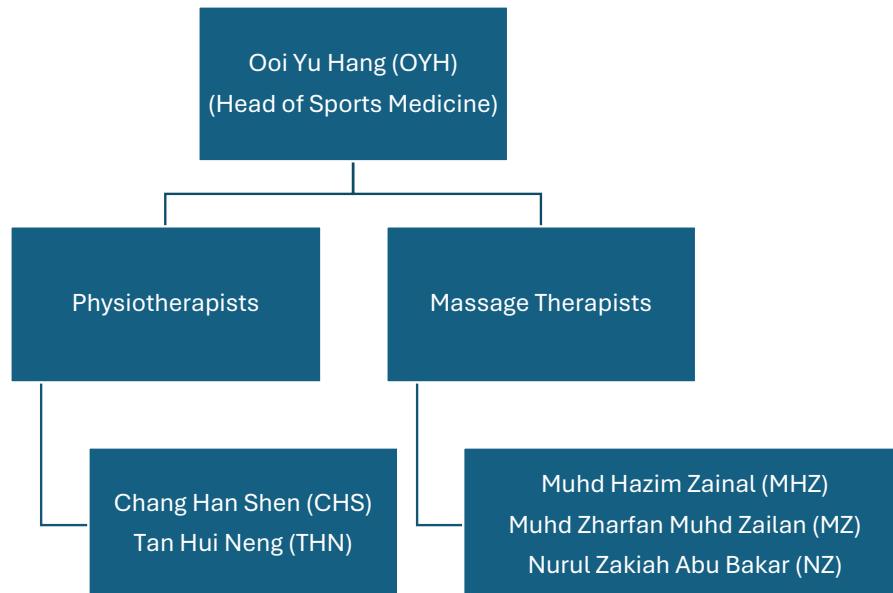

SPORTS MEDICINE

1 PERSONNEL

The Department consists of physiotherapists and massage therapists whose main role is to assist players in regaining their physical condition for peak on-court performance.



Physiotherapist plays a role in assisting the player recover from injuries, manages the chronic conditions and optimizes player performance. Amongst the tasks that a physiotherapist does are:

- **Assessment**
 - Thoroughly evaluate players' medical history, current condition, and limitations
 - Conduct physical examinations, including range of motion (ROM) tests, strength assessments, functional assessments, and gait analysis.
 - Identify underlying causes of pain, injuries, weakness or dysfunction.
- **Treatment Planning**
 - Develop an individualized treatment plan based on player needs and goals.
 - Utilize a variety of techniques, including:
 - i. Manual therapy (myofascial release, joint mobilization, dry needling)
 - ii. Electrotherapy (ultrasound, electrical stimulation, shockwave, laser therapy)
 - iii. Therapeutic exercises (rehabilitation, stretching, flexibility, mobility, strength training, balance exercises)
 - iv. Player education
- **Treatment Implementation**
 - Guide the player through prescribed exercises and treatment modalities.
 - Monitor player progress and adjust treatment plan as needed.
 - Provide ongoing support and encouragement to player throughout their recovery period.
 - Conduct assessments for player to ensure the player return to sport safely.
- **Player Education**
 - Educate player on proper body mechanics, injury prevention strategies, and self-management techniques.
 - Educate players how to perform therapeutic exercises with correct technique and form of exercises.

- **Collaboration**
 - Work closely with multidisciplinary team, including physical trainer, nutritionist, exercise physiologist, psychologist, coaches and administration staffs.
 - Participate in team meeting to discuss player progress and treatment plan for complicated condition.
- **Documentation**
 - Documenting accurate and detailed records of player injury history, treatment plans and progression in the system.
 - Prepare injuries reports or medical history for management or coaches.
- **Continuing Education**
 - Participate in professional development courses, workshops and conferences to enhance skills and knowledge.
 - Stay current with the latest research and advancements in professional practice.

Massage therapist providing relaxation or treating body pain, tightness or discomfort through physical touch and mobilizing player's muscles or joints. Amongst the tasks that a massage therapist does are:



- **Needs Assessment:**
 - Evaluating the player's physical condition, and identify areas of tension, pain or injury.
 - Determine the appropriate massage techniques and pressure levels based on the player's needs and preferences.
- **Massage Techniques:**
 - Apply various massage technique, such as deep tissue release, myofascial release, cupping, hot pack or other modalities.
 - Use a variety of strokes and pressures to manipulate muscles, tendons, and connective tissues.
 - Modify massage techniques based on the player's feedback and change their needs during the session.
- **Continuing Education:**
 - Stay updated on the latest massage techniques, modalities and treatment plans through continuing education courses or workshops.

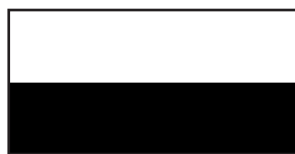

3 HIGHLIGHTS

As with any other year, the focus tournaments for the juniors remain the Badminton Asia Junior Championships and the BWF World Junior Championships.

3.1 World Junior Championships

The World Junior Championships took place in Nanchang, China, from September 30-October 13, 2024. We sent a delegation of 22 players and 5 coaches, led by Head of Junior, Jeffer Rosobin.

The team reached the finals in two events: Boys' Doubles and Girls' Doubles. Our Boys' Doubles pair, Aaron Tai and Kang Khai Xing, made history by ending a 13-year wait to claim the gold medal. Additionally, we secured a bronze medal in the Mixed Team event.

Strong performances in these tournaments saw our junior players hold their own in the BWF World Junior rankings. Aaron Tai and Kang Khai Xing are currently ranked No. 1 in the world in Boys' Doubles.

1 BAM SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORMS

BAM's online presence continued to grow steadily, reaching a total following of 691,324 across key platforms by December 31, 2024. This included Facebook (329,152), Instagram (180,241), Twitter (55,510), and Youtube (126,421).

2 ACTIVITIES

2.1 Tournaments, Fan Engagement & Merchandising

The department executed a three-pronged marketing strategy for the PETRONAS Malaysia Open (PMO) 2024 and PERODUA Malaysia Masters (PMM) 2024 to maximize reach and engagement. Content creation was a key focus, with the production of engaging videos featuring national players in collaboration with the creative teams from PETRONAS and PERODUA. Media partnerships with ASTRO Radio (ERA, Hitz, Sinar, MY, Raaga, Melody) amplified promotional reach, while strategic digital billboards were deployed at high-traffic Klang Valley locations, including Jalan Sultan Ismail, Federal Highway, Jalan Brickfields, Jalan TAR and Jalan Klang Lama. These efforts contributed to strong ticket sales for the Malaysia Open, while livestreaming accumulated 814K views (Malaysia Open) and 810K views (Malaysia Masters). Additionally, the department co-organized press conferences for both tournaments at PETRONAS ABM.



For mid-level and developmental tournaments, pre-tournament promotions, match highlights, and post-match interviews were conducted for the BAM Malaysia Super 100 2024 and PETRONAS Malaysia International Challenge 2024. The Selangor Badminton Asia Team Championships 2024 saw the production of a daily vlog series documenting the team's title defence bid, accumulating 892K views, while Court 3 matches were livestreamed in collaboration with Majlis Sukan Negeri Selangor.

2.2 National Team Campaigns & International Events

The Thomas & Uber Cup 2024 campaign was strengthened through various promotional efforts, including a flag-handing ceremony on April 22 at PETRONAS ABM, a motivational audio track in collaboration with psychologist Frederick Tan, and a daily vlog series that chronicled Malaysia's first podium finish in eight years, achieving 991K views.

For the Paris 2024 Olympic Campaign, a handover ceremony was successfully organized on July 9 in partnership with YONEX-Sunrise, followed by a pre-tournament press conference on July 11, which featured prominent national players such as Aaron Chia-Soh Wooi Yik, Pearly Tan-M. Thinaah, and Chen Tang Jie-Toh Ee Wei. A daily vlog series provided fans with behind-the-scenes coverage of the final preparations and training camp in Aire-Sur-La-Lys, garnering 969K views.

For the Asia Junior Mixed Team Championships 2024 and World Junior Championships 2024, the department produced daily vlogs covering training camps and matches, accumulating 980K and 621K views, respectively. To enhance media visibility, the team organized a send-off ceremony on September 27 at PETRONAS ABM and worked alongside the National Sports Council (MSN) to coordinate the homecoming event on October 15 at KLIA.

2.3 Corporate & Strategic Initiatives

In alignment with BAM's corporate objectives, the department created concise videos that provided an inside look into BAM's high-performance culture at PETRONAS ABM, as well as the dedicated efforts of coaches and staff. Sponsorship and ROI-driven media strategies were also implemented, leveraging viewership metrics to justify investments in livestreaming tournaments, while integrating fan engagement strategies to optimize event promotions.

Additionally, the department led the Geran Padanan Sukan (GPS) and Kumpulan Amanah Wang Sukan Negara (KWASN) application processes for the BAM Malaysia SUPER 100 2024 and PMM 2025 respectively, successfully securing financial support for tournament hosting. These efforts reinforce the department's role in securing financial support and ensuring continued growth for BAM events.

2.4 Merchandising

Recognizing the potential of official merchandise, BAM's merchandising efforts were introduced in 2024 to enhance fan engagement, strengthen brand identity and establish a new revenue stream. This initiative was a collective effort involving colleagues across various departments, including human resources, logistics, junior development and finance, ensuring smooth execution.



To maximize visibility and accessibility, merchandise booths were set up at key tournaments, including the PMO 2024, PMM 2024, and BAM Malaysia SUPER 100 2024. The positive reception has laid a strong foundation for future expansion, with plans to broaden the product range and explore new collaborations. Moving forward, BAM aims to leverage PETRONAS' expertise in branding and commercial strategies to further enhance its merchandising efforts, ensuring a stronger market presence and increased appeal to fans.

PETRONAS AKADEMI BADMINTON MALAYSIA (ABM)



1 MAINTENANCE & OPERATIONS

The maintenance and operations of ABM are fully managed by the Badminton Association of Malaysia (BAM) Facilities team. BAM is responsible for handling all defects, except for major structural issues such as structural failure, roofing defects, and internal plumbing defects, which must be referred to Malaysian Stadium Corporation (PSM) and Youth & Sports Ministry (KBS).

1.1 Cleanliness Management

BAM have appointed JEP Cleaning Services Sdn Bhd as the company managing the cleaning services of PABM. It consists of 8 personals including one supervisor. They manage the overall cleaning of the PABM facility under the supervision of the Facility Department.

1.2 Security Services Management

The security management of PABM is handled by Watchman Security Sdn Bhd consisting of 4 personals. They work on two 12 hrs shift and they are monitored by BAM Security Officer.

1.3 Pest Control Management

The pest control is managed by Rentokil with monthly monitoring. This consists of pest control inside and outside of the building and fogging services.



1.4 Maintenance Works

Indah Kota Engineering Sdn Bhd is the contractor managing the maintenance of the grease traps in the Café. The maintenance includes one main tank of grease system and 3 units of grease septic tanks.



The damaged grease piping in the Café was replaced.



Shinyou Elevator MFG Sdn Bhd is responsible for the maintenance of the three lifts in PABM. Maintenance is carried out monthly. The maintenance includes the DOSH safety inspection and certificate issuance.



The maintenance of 93 units of wallmounted ACSU is carried out by the facilities team consisting of general maintenance, gas filling up and chemical wash on a quarterly basis.

Chemical servicing and cleaning of 16 units of AC at ground floor and first and second floor was carried out by contractors. The units located at gymnasium, control room, ict room , vvip auditorium room and office.

Witco Chemicals were appointed to carry out the maintenance on the air cooling tower. The maintenance was carried out twice per month.



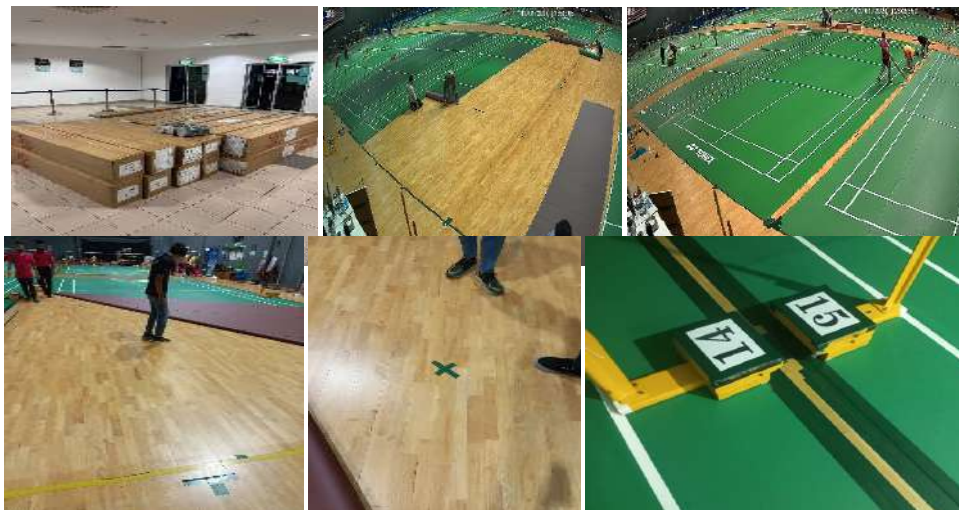
Program Engineering Sdn Bhd was appointed to maintain the Fire Fighting System and Natamas Sdn Bhd to maintain the fire fighting extinguishers.



Maintenance of the 18 badminton courts were carried out by the facility maintenance team. The badminton courts wall were repainted at worn out areas and labelling done. Inspection and repair of the court flooring were done. As some areas need panel replacement the vendor was notified.



BAM replaced all 18 court mats to Yonex Court Mats.



The damaged pump bearing of the cooling tower pumps were replaced and reallignment carried out.



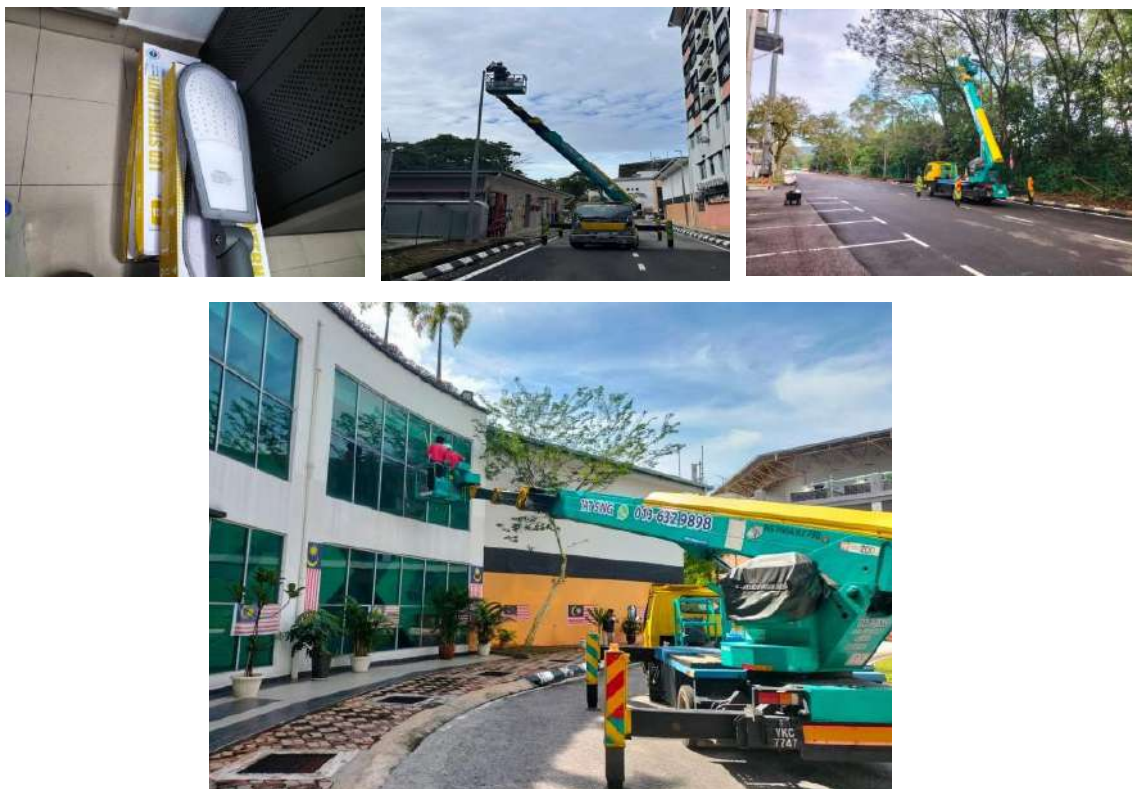

The maintenance of the jacuzzi was done as per schedule.

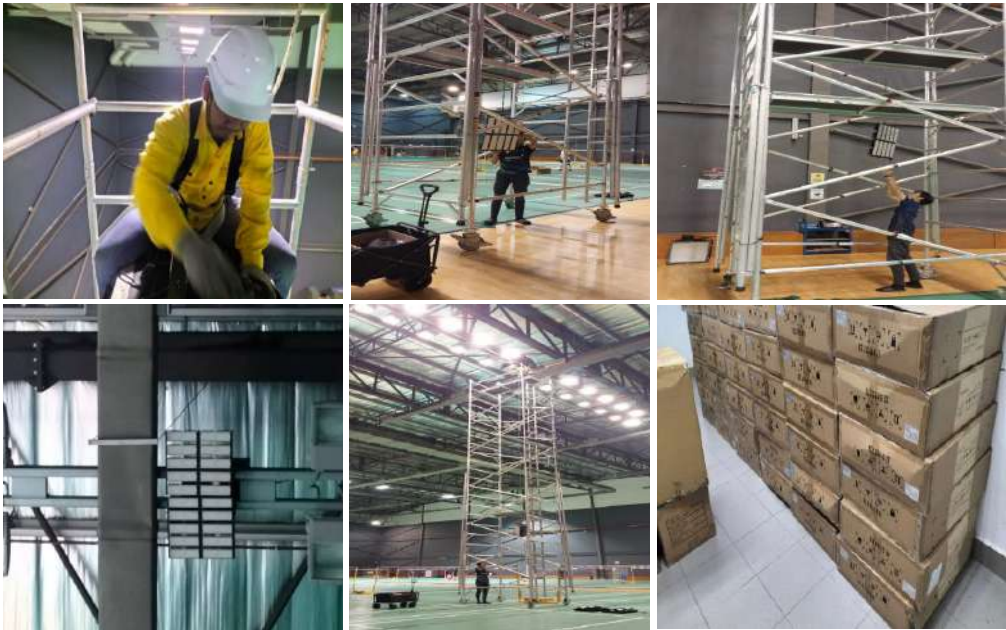


Damaged street lighting was replaced, and cleaning of the building window panels were carried out. Tree trimming was also done.

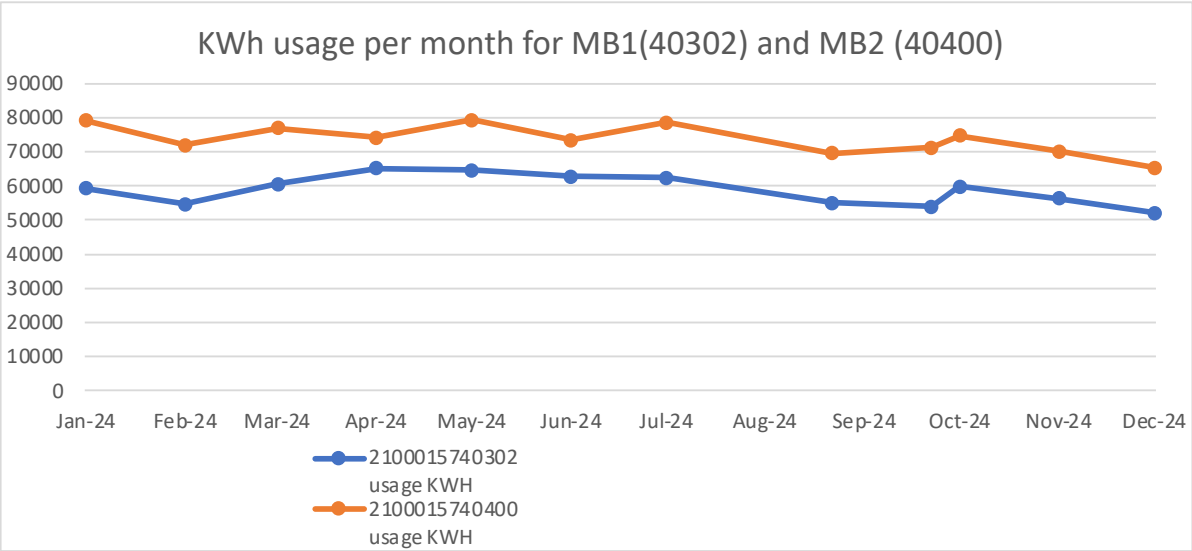
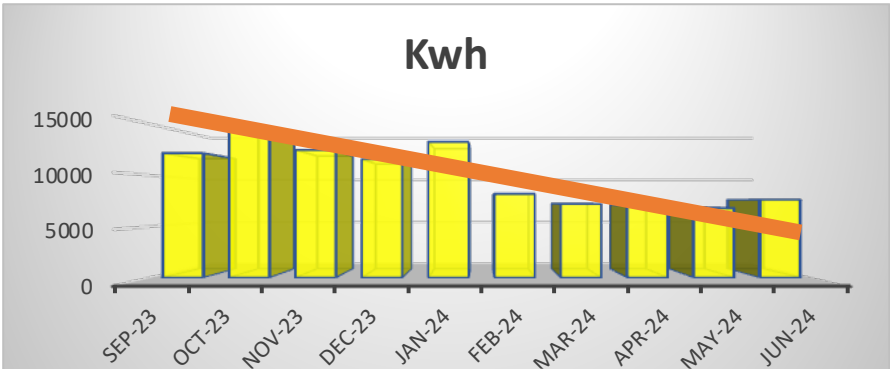


2 ELECTRICITY USAGE

2.1 Overall Electricity Usage for 2024



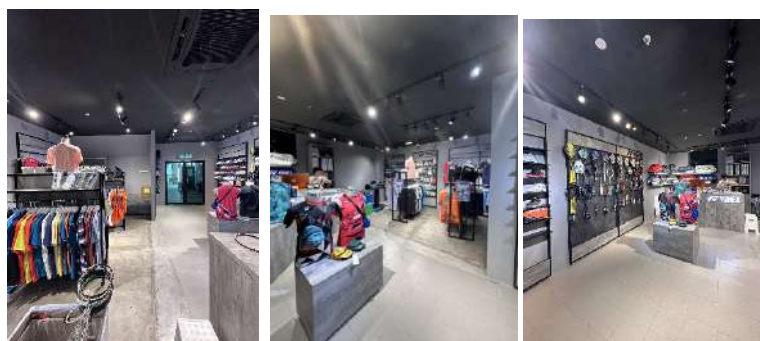
3 ABM NEW WING: SPORTS MEDICINE

1.4 Paralympic Paris 2024

1.4.1 Paralympic Paris 2024 Qualification

The National Paralympic Council (MPM), through MSN/BAM, successfully submitted the name of Muhammad Fareez Anuar (SU5) for the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games under an invitation from the Badminton World Federation (BWF) Bipartite Commission, in collaboration with the International Paralympic Committee (IPC).

The Bipartite Commission Invitation is a qualification pathway open to all nations with players on the Race to Paris Ranking List who meet the eligibility criteria, including classification requirements.

1.4.2 About the Bipartite Commission

While the primary qualification for the Paralympic Games is based on rankings and competition performance, the IPC and BWF have established the Bipartite Commission Invitation Allocation Method to grant discretionary qualification slots.

1.4.3 Allocation Principles

The commission considers the following factors when awarding invitations:

- Ensuring the participation of top athletes who may not have formally qualified through other methods.
- Supporting the representation of athletes with high support needs.
- Maintaining sufficient athlete representation in medal events for competition viability.
- Promoting balanced gender representation in para badminton.
