MINUTES OF MEETING / MINIT MESYUARAT

1. **CHAIRMAN'S WELCOME ADDRESS / UCAPAN ALUAN PENERUSI**

Datuk V. Subramaniam started the meeting with the roll call and welcomed all members to the 80th BAM Annual General Meeting. He reminded members that as badminton continues to command national attention, BAM remains one of the most closely watched national sports association. As such, we need to constantly work to improve.

Reflecting on the year 2024, Datuk V. Subramaniam recalled that BAM has had a successful year on and off the court. While the 2024 Olympic Games Paris did not produce the a gold medal, Aaron Chia and Soh Wooi Yik did the nation proud by defending their bronze medal. Datuk V. Subramaniam thanked the Ministry of Youth & Sports, the Olympic Council of Malaysia, the National Sports Council and the National Sports Institute for their support.

Other notable successes include the semi-final showing at the Thomas Cup in Chengdu, China and the boys doubles gold medal at the World Junior Championship through Aaron Tai and Kang Khai Xing.

Off the court, Datuk V. Subramaniam highlighted BAM's continued partnership with the following commercial partners:

DVS also expressed BAM's appreciation in the fans' support demonstrated by their record-breaking turnout at the PETRONAS Malaysia Open 2024 and PERODUA Malaysia Masters 2024. The success of the two tournaments were made possible through the collective efforts of the Secretariat, tournament officials, media and commercial partners.

In closing, DVS thanked the Honorary Life President, Tan Sri Dato' Sri (Dr.) Norza Zakaria, for his trust and confidence in appointing him as the Acting President. He also conveyed his appreciation to all Council members for their unwavering support during his tenure as Acting President. That he declared the 80th Annual General Meeting opened.

With that Tan Sri Dato' Sri (Dr.) Norza Zakaria announced YB Senator Tengku Datuk Seri Utama Zafrul Tengku Abdul Aziz as the BAM President for the term 2025 – 2029.

With that Tan Sri Dato' Sri (Dr.) Norza Zakaria announced Dato' Sri Dr. Jahaberdeen YM Mohd Yunoos as the BAM Deputy President II for the term 2025 – 2029.

8. **REMARKS FROM PRESIDENT / KATA-KATA AMANAT DARI PRESIDEN**

He is honored and touched by the opportunity given to serve as the President of BAM. It is not something that he will take lightly and vouched to give his best based on his experiences not only in the government but also previously in the corporate sector.

He also took the opportunity to congratulate Datuk V. Subramaniam and Dato' Sri Dr. Jahaberdeen YM Mohd Yunoos on their re-election today. He thanked Tan Sri Dato' Sri (Dr.) Norza Zakaria for his support and assured continuity of Tan Sri's work and legacy.

YB Senator Tengku Datuk Seri Utama Zafrul Tengku Abdul Aziz requested members to give him 100 days. During these 100 days, he will meet with members and all other stakeholders – players, coaches, ex-players, sponsors, etc. Thereafter, he will present his plan, vision and action plan for BAM. He urged members to continue their work but also requested for support as the President of BAM.

We have audited the financial statements of Persatuan Badminton Malaysia (“the Association”), which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31st December 2025, the statement of comprehensive income and statement of changes in fund balance and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, as set out on pages 6 to 21.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Association as at 31st December 2025, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in Malaysia.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with approved standards on auditing in Malaysia and International Standards on Auditing. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors’ Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Independence and Other Ethical Responsibilities

We are independent of the Company in accordance with the By-Laws (on Professional Ethics, Conduct and Practice) of the Malaysian Institute of Accountants (“By-Laws”) and the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants’ International Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (including International Independence Standards) (“IESBA Code”), and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the By-Laws and the IESBA Code.

Responsibilities of the Council Members for the Financial Statements



**NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2025**

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The Persatuan Badminton Malaysia (“Association”) is a non-profit organisation dedicated to encourage, promote and control the game of Badminton in Malaysia.

The Association is registered under the Sports Development Act 1997.

The registered office and principal place of operation is:-

2. COMPLIANCE WITH FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS AND THE COMPANIES ACT

The financial statements of the Association have been prepared in compliance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in Malaysia

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of Preparation

The measurement bases applied in the preparation of the financial statements include cost, amortised cost, recoverable value and realisable value as indicated in the accounting policies set out below. Accounting estimates are used in measuring these values.

The financial statements are presented in Ringgit Malaysia (“RM”), which is the functional currency of the Association.

b) Property, Plant and Equipment and Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Depreciation of property, plant and equipment is provided on a straight line basis to write off the cost of each asset to its residual value over the estimated useful life at the following annual rates:-

Furniture, fittings and office equipment	20%
Sport equipment	20%
Renovation	20%
Motor vehicle	10%

The carrying values of property, plant and equipment are reviewed for impairment when there is an indication that the assets might be impaired. Impairment is measured by comparing the carrying values of the assets with their recoverable amounts. An impairment loss is charged to the statement of comprehensive income immediately.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. The difference between the net disposal proceeds, if any and the net carrying amount is recognised in profit or loss and the unutilised portion of the revaluation surplus on that item is taken directly to general fund.

c) Investment property

Investment property is property which is held either to earn rental income or for capital appreciation or for both. Such properties are measured at cost, less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment loss.

Depreciation of investment property is provided on a straight line basis to write off the cost of leasehold land and building to its residual value over the remaining lease period.

Investment property is derecognised when either they have been disposed or when the investment properties is permanently withdrawn from use and no future economic benefit is expected from its disposal. Any gains or losses on the retirement or disposal of an investment property are recognised in profit or loss in the year in which they arise.

d) Financial instruments

i) Initial Recognition and Measurement

The Association recognises a financial asset or a financial liability (including derivative instruments) in the statement of financial position when, and only when, it becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at fair value, which is generally the transaction price, plus transaction costs if the financial asset or financial liability is not measured at fair value through profit or loss. For instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss, transaction costs are expensed to profit or loss when incurred.

- ii) **Derecognition of Financial Instruments**
A financial asset is derecognised when, and only when, the contractual rights to receive the cash flows from the financial asset expire, or when the Association transfers the contractual rights to receive cash flows of the financial asset, including circumstances when the Association acts only as a collecting agent of the transferee, and retains no significant risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset or no continuing involvement in the control of the financial asset transferred.

A financial liability is derecognised when, and only when, it is legally extinguished, which is either when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged or cancelled or expires. A substantial modification of the terms of an existing financial liability is accounted for as an extinguished of the original financial liability and the recognition of a new financial liability. For this purpose, the Association considers a modification as substantial if the present value of the revised cash flows of the modified terms discounted at the original effective interest rate differs by 10% or more when compared with the carrying amount of the original liability.

- iii) **Subsequent Measurement of Financial Assets**
For the purpose of subsequent measurement, the Association classifies financial assets into two categories, namely:
- financial assets at fair value through profit or loss, and
 - financial assets at amortised cost.
- Other than financial assets measured at fair value through profit or loss, all other financial assets are subject to review for impairment.
- iv) **Subsequent measurement of Financial Liabilities**
After initial recognition, all financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.
- v) **Fair Value Measurement of Financial Instruments**
The fair value of a financial asset or a financial liability is determined by reference to the quoted market price in an active market, and in the absence of an observable market price, by a valuation technique using reasonable and supportable assumptions.
- vi) **Recognition of Gains and Losses**
Fair value changes of financial assets and liabilities classified as at fair value through profit or loss are recognised in profit or loss when they arise.

For financial assets and financial liabilities carried at amortised cost, a gain or loss is recognised in profit or loss only when the financial asset or financial liability is derecognised or impaired and through the amortisation process of the instrument.

vii) Impairment and Uncollectibility of Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the Association examines whether there is any objective evidence that a financial asset or a group of financial assets is impaired. Evidences of trigger loss events include:

- Significant financial difficulty of the issuer or obligor;
- a breach of contract, such as default or delinquency in interest or principal payments;
- granting exceptional concession to a customer;
- it is probable that a customer will enter bankruptcy or other financial reorganisation;
- the disappearance of an active market for that financial asset because of financial difficulties; or
- any observable market data indicating that there may be a measurable decrease in the estimated future cash flows from a group of financial assets.

For short-term receivables, where the effect of discounting is immaterial, impairment loss is tested for each individually significant receivable wherever there is any indication of impairment. Individually significant receivables for which no impairment loss is recognised are grouped together with all other receivables by classes based on credit risk characteristics and aged according to their past due periods. A collective allowance is estimated for a class group based on the Association's experience of loss ratio in each class, taking into consideration current market conditions.

e) Government Grants

The Association does not recognise government grants, including non-monetary grants at fair value, until there is reasonable assurance that the Association will comply with the conditions attaching to the grants and the grants will be received.

All government grants are recognised as income in profit or loss on a systematic basis over the periods in which the Association recognises as expenses the related costs for which the grants are intended to compensate. Any balance amount received not yet recognised in profit or loss is treated as a deferred income i.e. a liability in the statement of financial position.

f) Finance and operating leases

The Association recognises a lease whenever there is an agreement, whether explicitly stated as a lease or otherwise, whereby the lessor conveys to the lessee in return for a payment or series of payments the right to use an asset for an agreed period of time. A lease is classified as a finance lease if it transfers substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership. Title may or may not eventually be transferred. All other leases that do not meet this criteria are classified as operating leases.

g) Foreign Currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies during the financial year are converted to Ringgit Malaysia at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at the statement of financial position date are translated to Ringgit Malaysia at the closing rates. Foreign exchange differences arising on translation are recognised in the income statement. Non-monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated to Ringgit Malaysia at rates of exchange ruling at the date of transactions.

h) Income Recognition

Income is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Association and when the revenue can be measured reliably, on the following bases:

- (i) Income from sponsorship, subsidies and grants are recognised on an accrual basis when the Association's right to receive payment is established.

Unrestricted sponsorships, subsidies and grants received are credited in full to the statement of comprehensive income as an income item. Restricted sponsorships, subsidies and grants received are offset against the related expenditure item, except for grants for capital expenditure which are credited to a capital fund statement.

- (ii) Income from rental of property is recognised on a time proportion basis over the lease term.

- (iii) Interest income from fixed deposits is recognised on an accrual basis.

i) Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

An impairment loss arises when the carrying amount of a Association's asset exceeds its recoverable amount.

At the end of each reporting date, the Association assesses whether there is any indication that a stand-alone asset or a cash-generating unit may be impaired by using external and internal sources of information. If any such indication exists, the Association estimates the recoverable amount of the asset or cash-generating unit.

If an individual asset generates independent cash inflows, it is tested for impairment as a stand-alone asset. If an asset does not generate independent cash inflows, it is tested for impairment together with other assets in a cash-generating unit, at the lowest level in which independent cash inflows are generated and monitored for internal management purposes.

The recoverable amount of an asset or cash-generating unit is the higher of its fair value less costs to sell and the value in use. The Association determines the fair value less costs to sell of an asset or a cash-generating unit in a hierarchy based on:

- (i) price in a binding sale agreement;
- (ii) market price traded in an active market; and
- (iii) estimate of market price using the best available information.

The value in use is estimated by discounting the net cash inflows (by an appropriate discount rate) of the asset or unit, using reasonable and supportable management's budgets and forecasts of five years and extrapolation of cash inflows for periods beyond the five-year forecast or budget.

For an asset measured on a cost-based model, any impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

For a cash-generating unit, any impairment loss is allocated to the assets of the unit pro rata based on the relative carrying amounts of the assets.

The Association reassesses the recoverable amount of an impaired asset or a cash-generating unit if there is any indication that an impairment loss recognised previously may have reversed. Any reversal of impairment loss for an asset carried at a cost-based model is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income, subject to the limit that the revised carrying amount does not exceed the amount that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised previously.

Subsequent increase in the recoverable amount of an asset is treated as reversal of the previous impairment loss and is recognised to the extent of the carrying amount of the asset that would have been determined (net of amortisation and depreciation) had no impairment loss been recognised. The reversal is recognised in the income statement immediately, unless the asset is carried at revalued amount. A reversal of an impairment loss on a revalued asset is credited directly to revaluation surplus.

However, to the extent that an impairment loss on the same revalued asset was previously recognised as an expense in the income statement, a reversal of that impairment loss is recognised as income in the income statement.

j) Employees Benefits

- (i) Short term benefits
Wages, salaries, paid leave, paid sick leave, bonuses and non-monetary benefits are recognised as an expense in the period in which the associated services are rendered by employees.

Non-monetary benefits such as medical care and other staff related expenses are charged to the income statement as and when incurred.

- (ii) **Defined contribution plans**
As required by law, companies in Malaysia make contributions to the Employees Provident Fund (“EPF”). Such contributions are recognised as an expense in the income statement in the financial year to which they relate.

k) **Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents represent cash and bank balances, bank overdraft, short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

4. **CRITICAL JUDGEMENTS AND ESTIMATION UNCERTAINTIES**

a) **Judgements and Assumptions Applied**

In the selection of accounting policies for the Association, the areas that require significant judgements and assumptions is in:

- **Classification of Investment Property**
Certain property comprises of a portion that is held to earn rental income or capital appreciation, or for both, whilst the remaining portion is held for use in the production or supply of goods and services or for administrative purposes. If the portion held for rental and/or capital appreciation could be sold separately (or leased out separately as a finance lease), the Company accounts for that portion as an investment property. If the portion held for rental and/or capital appreciation could not be sold or leased out separately, it is classified as an investment property only if an insignificant portion of the property is held for use in the production or supply of goods and services or for administrative purposes. Management uses its judgement to determine whether any ancillary services are of such significance that a property does not qualify as an investment property.

b) **Estimation Uncertainties**

The measurement of some assets and liabilities requires management to use estimates based on various observable inputs and other assumptions. The areas or items that are subject to significant estimation uncertainties of the Association are in measuring:

- **Depreciation of Property, Plant and Equipment and Investment Property**
The cost of an item of property, plant and equipment and investment property is depreciated on the straight-line method or another systematic method that reflects the consumption of the economic benefits of the asset over its useful life. Estimates are applied in the selection of the depreciation method, the useful lives and the residual values. The actual consumption of the economic benefits of the property, plant and equipment and investment property may differ from the estimates applied and this may lead to a gain or loss on an eventual disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment and investment property.

- **Determining the Value-in-Use**
In determining the value-in-use of a stand-alone asset or a cash-generating unit, management uses reasonable and supportable inputs about sales, costs of sales and other expenses based upon past experiences, current events and reasonably possible future developments. Cash flows are projected based on those inputs and discounted at an appropriate discount rate(s). The actual outcome or event may not coincide with the inputs or assumptions and the discount rate applied in the measurement, and this may have a significant effect on the Association's financial position and results.
- **Loss Allowances of Financial Assets**
The Association recognises impairment losses for loans and receivables using the incurred loss model. Individually significant loans and receivables are tested for impairment separately by estimating the cash flows expected to be recoverable. All other loans and receivables are categorised into credit risk classes and tested for impairment collectively, using the Association's past experiences of loss statistics, ageing of past due amounts and current economic trends. The actual eventual losses may be different from the allowances made and these may affect the Association's financial position and results.

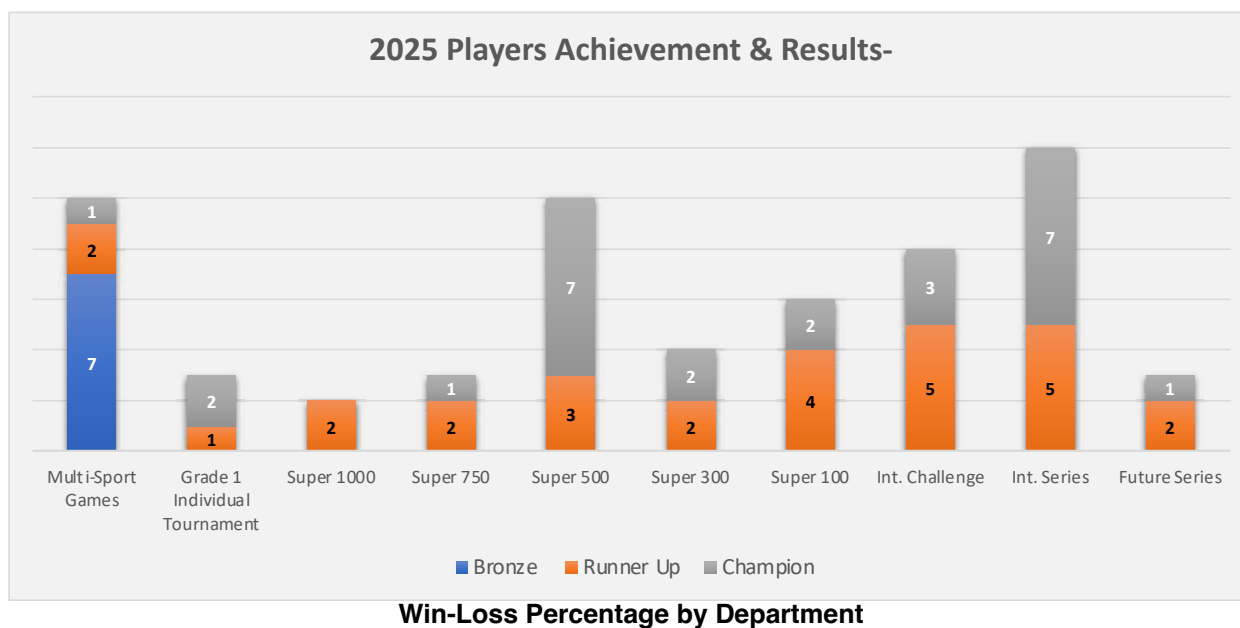

Their year was packed with major achievements: becoming the **first Malaysian women’s doubles pair** to reach (and medal at) the BWF World Championships final in Paris — securing silver after

a thrilling battle against China’s Liu Shengshu/Tan Ning — and making history by advancing to their **first Super 1000 final**. They also captured their debut **SEA Games gold medal** in women’s doubles at the 2025 Thailand SEA Games, defeating Indonesia’s Febriana Dwipuji Kusuma/Meilysa Trias Puspitasari in a hard-fought three-game final.

Aaron Chia / Soh Wooi Yik — The former world champions continued to anchor Malaysia’s men’s doubles strength with another reliable and high-impact season. The world No. 6 pair reached **five finals** on the World Tour event and delivered a breakthrough by winning their **first** in Ningbo, **ending Malaysia’s 18-year drought** in the men’s doubles event at the continental championships with a dominant straight-games victory over nation host pair, China’s Chen Bo Yang/Liu Yi (21-19, 21-17). Their ability to perform under pressure in key tournaments reinforced their status as one of Malaysia’s most dependable elite pairs.

“MALAYSIA’S FIRST-EVER MIXED DOUBLES WORLD TITLE



Chen Tang Jie / Toh Ee Wei — The mixed doubles duo produced one of the most inspiring stories of the year through sheer resilience and a dramatic turnaround. Despite a tough start — marked by early struggles and a temporary partnership split — they reunited with renewed determination and chemistry. Their unforgettable achievement came at the BWF World Championships in Paris, where they clinched **Malaysia’s first-ever mixed doubles world title** defeating the current World No. 2 from China’s in the final on Malaysia’s National Day. This historic triumph, combined with strong showings elsewhere, made their comeback one of the defining highlights of Malaysian badminton in 2025.

HSBC BWF WORLD TOUR FINALS FOR THE FIRST TIME



Man Wei Chong / Tee Kai Wun — The rising men’s doubles pair enjoyed a breakout season of rapid ascent and maturity. Starting the year at world No. 14, they surged to a career-high world No. 5 (and briefly No. 4) ranking by late 2025. Their progress was highlighted by two Super 500 titles, impressive consistency across major events, and earning qualification for the HSBC BWF World Tour Finals for the first time — a significant milestone that underscored their growing presence among the global elite.

2.1. SEA Games 2025, 07 – 14 December 2025

2.1.1 Men's Team

The SEA Games 2025 campaign for the Malaysian men's team saw a composed and convincing performance as they advanced through the knockout stages. In the quarterfinals, Malaysia faced the Philippines and delivered a dominant 3–0 victory, securing a place in the semi-finals and, at the same time, confirming a medal for the men's team event.

In the semi-final, Malaysia faced the nation host, Thailand. Points contributions from Aaron Chia-Soh Wooi Yik, Justin Hoh, and Man Wei Chong-Tee Kai Wun ensured Malaysia's advancement to the semi-finals. This victory marked a significant milestone, as it saw Malaysia advance to the men's team final for the fifth consecutive SEA Games edition since 2015.

Despite being fielded with elite players and established pairs such as Aaron Chia – Soh Wooi Yik and Man Wei Chong – Tee Kai Wun, the men's team ultimately concluded their SEA Games 2025 campaign with a silver medal, falling just short of their gold medal target in the final.



2.1.2 Women's Team

The Malaysian women's team recorded a commendable performance at the SEA Games 2025, demonstrating clear progress compared to the previous edition. In the quarterfinals, Malaysia faced Vietnam and secured a 3–1 victory, with valuable points contributed by Wong Ling Ching, Pearly Tan-Thinaah Muralitharan, and Siti Zulaikha. This win booked Malaysia's place in the semi-finals and secured the medals for women's team.

In the semi-finals, Malaysia encountered long-time rivals Indonesia in a closely contested tie. Despite a strong showing, the team narrowly lost 2–3. Points were again delivered by Wong Ling Ching and Pearly Tan and Thinaah Muralitharan, reflecting their importance within the squad. Wong Ling Ching produced an impressive performance by defeating Gregoria Mariska Tunjung, the Paris Olympic 2024 Bronze Medalist.

3. DEPARTMENT REVIEW

3.1 Men's Singles

Compared to the previous year, the Men's Singles department entered the 2025 season with a significantly leaner squad. The department began the year with seven players, following the release of four senior players from BAM in October, marking a major transition phase within the programme.

At the beginning of the year, Faiq made the decision to switch disciplines and pursue a career in doubles, following his personal aspirations and long-term development goals. This further reduced the number of active players within the Men's Singles setup.

3.1.1 Highlights

Leong Jun Hao endured a difficult season as he continued to adjust to the consistently high intensity of top-tier tournaments. Across the year, he exited in the early rounds on 17 occasions, often facing higher-ranked opponents. Despite the results, each loss reflected Leong's ability to sustain rallies and challenge elite players. He also recorded three victories over top-10 opponents, underscoring his potential at the highest level. He concluded his season on a positive note by securing his second bronze medal at the SEA Games 2025.

Justin Hoh experienced a season that mirrored a similar trajectory. After a slow start, he gradually improved his match performances, although consistency remained an area for development. Justin came close to breaking into the Top 32, which would have secured automatic qualification for Super 750 and Super 1000 tournaments. A major highlight of his year was reaching his **first World Tour Super 300 final at the Macau Open**, marking a significant milestone in his senior career. He also ended the season with a bronze medal at the SEA Games and achieved a **new career-high world ranking of No. 36**, reflecting steady upward progress.

Eogene Ewe continued his development phase, demonstrating gradual improvement throughout the year. By the end of the season, Eogene reached a **world ranking of No. 86** and **captured two international titles**, winning the Malaysia International Challenge and the Slovenia Open.

Ng Tze Yong made his long-awaited return to competition in April at the Badminton Asia Championships (BAC) after an extended injury layoff. Although match fitness was still a work in progress, he showed clear improvement with each appearance and positive signs early losses. Unfortunately, his comeback was cut short when he suffered an ACL injury while competing at the Malaysia Masters. As a result, Ng was limited to only four matches for the year before being sidelined again, bringing an abrupt end to his season.

3.2.2 Highlights

In 2025, **Letshanaa Karupathevan** and **Wong Ling Ching**, as the oldest players of the group continue to lead the group as they set to compete in higher-level tournaments compared to the previous year.

Letshanaa endured a difficult season from the beginning of the year. frequently competing against higher-ranked opponents, which highlighted areas requiring further development. Her best results of the year were reaching the quarter final of Super 300 event on two occasions in 2025.

Wong Ling Ching experienced a season largely in line with that of her teammates, with several notable achievements marking significant progress. The major highlight of her year was securing **her maiden senior title at the Slovenia Open** and reaching her first World Tour final at the Malaysia Super 100 in Johor. She concluded the season strongly by winning a **bronze medal at the SEA Games** and achieving a career-high world ranking of No. 42, representing an important milestone in her senior career.

The upcoming players from junior level also delivered highly encouraging performances throughout 2025, both in domestic competitions and on the international stage. All 18 years old players respectively have reached at least on finals in 2025, **Lim Zhi Shin** (National U21 Champion & Bangladesh IS Runner Up), **Oo Shan Zi** (Vietnam IS Runner Up), **Eng Ler Qi** (National U18 Champion), and **Shaneesa Shahidi** (National Championships Champion).

The 20 podium finishes in 2025 highlighted the depth of the department, with achievements coming from a strong mix of elite and back-up players.

The elite men's doubles pair of this department, **Aaron Chia and Soh Wooi Yik**, had an outstanding 2025 season. They secured a gold medal at the Badminton Asia Championships, completing the collection of medals for the tournament. The pair also captured their second BWF World Tour Super 750 title at the Singapore Open, following a remarkable run of **three consecutive finals in as three weeks**—winning the Thailand Open, finishing as runner-up at the Malaysia Masters, and then triumphing in Singapore. Aaron and Soh then concluded the year with a silver medal at the 2025 SEA Games.

The next men's doubles pair, **Man Wei Chong-Tee Kai Wun**, showed significant improvement compared to the previous year. They captured their first-ever BWF World Tour Super 500 title at the Indonesia Masters 2025, defeating the host pair on their home ground in January, and followed this with another Super 500 victory at the Malaysia Masters in May, overcoming their teammates in the final. The pair achieved a career-high world ranking of No. 5 and secured qualification for the World Tour Finals for the first time in their careers, marking a major milestone in their development.

Aaron Tai-Kang Khai Xing experienced a challenging transition from junior to senior level in 2025,

with the pair failing to reach a quarterfinal between January and September. However, they regained their form later in the season, capturing their first World Tour title at the Malaysia Super 100 in Johor. Building on this momentum, the pair demonstrated remarkable consistency in December at the India tournaments, reaching three consecutive finals and winning two of them.

Other backup players had their highlight such as **Lok Hong Quan - Muhammad Faiq** captured their first senior title at the Malaysia International Series and followed up with a runner-up finish at the Malaysia International Challenge. Their strong performances throughout the year propelled them into the Top 70 of the world rankings by year-end.

3.4.1 Highlights

The year 2025 will forever stand as the most successful and historic season in the careers of Malaysian women's doubles stars **Pearly Tan - Thinaah Muralitharan**. The world No. 2 pair delivered an extraordinary campaign filled with consistency, breakthroughs, and landmark achievements that elevated Malaysian women's doubles to new heights on the global stage.

The crowning glory came at the BWF World Championships in Paris in August 2025. Pearly and Thinaah etched their names into Malaysian badminton history by becoming the **first-ever Malaysian women's doubles pair to win a medal at the World Championships**. After a commanding run, they faced China's formidable duo Liu Shengshu and Tan Ning in a thrilling three-game battle, ultimately falling 14–21, 22–20, 17–21 to claim the silver medal. This silver not only marked a monumental first for Malaysia in women's doubles at the worlds but also contributed to one of the nation's strongest-ever World Championships performances alongside other successes.

Their dominance extended across the BWF World Tour, where they achieved the highest number of podium finishes in a single season of their career. Pearly and Thinaah contested an impressive **eight finals** in 2025 alone, which they emerged victorious in four titles. Adding to their golden haul, they delivered a historic performance at the 2025 SEA Games in Thailand. Pearly and Thinaah captured the **women's doubles gold medal**, Malaysia's first in the discipline at the SEA Games since 2016. This triumph ended a long drought and boosted national pride on home-regional soil.

Ong Xin Yee-Carmen Ting experienced same challenging transition from junior to senior level in 2025. As young talents stepping up to the World Tour, they struggled to compete consistently against established top pairs. The season started with numerous early exits and tough losses that tested their resilience and adaptation to the top-level intensity. However, the duo showed remarkable improvement and regained momentum toward the end of the year

In December 2025, they delivered a strong showing in Indian tournaments, **reaching back-to-back finals at Super 100-level events**. Though they finished as runner-up in both, these achievements marked a significant breakthrough, confidence, and ability to compete at a higher level. By the close of 2025, Ong and Carmen climbed to a **career-high world ranking of World No. 25**. This ranking ensured their direct entry into premier Super 1000 and Super 750 events in the upcoming season, positioning them well to challenge elite pairs moving forward.

Other younger pairs also recorded notable achievements. **Low Zi Yu-Dania Sofea** captured their first senior title at their debut tournament in Slovakia, defeating their teammates Noraqilah Maisarah-Nur Aina Maisarah in the final. **Tan Zhing Hui and Gan Min Yee** staged an encouraging comeback after overcoming injury setbacks that forced them to miss several tournaments over a two-month period, returning strongly with resilient performances and securing back-to-back runner-up finishes in Bangladesh in December.

Following the appointment of Rosman Razak as head coach of the women's doubles department in late 2024, the Malaysian women's doubles squad showed remarkable progress throughout 2025. Under his guidance, the discipline achieved a strong finish to the year, **with three Malaysian pairs breaking into the global top 30** which include, **seven pairs break into the top 100**.

3.4.1 Highlights

2025 unfolded like a captivating fairy tale for Malaysian mixed doubles pair **Chen Tang Jie and Toh Ee Wei** — a season filled with highs, lows, heartbreak, reconciliation, and ultimate triumph. The year kicked off promisingly, with the duo delivering strong performances right from the start. They reached the semi-finals in back-to-back tournaments at the Malaysia Open and India Open. However, challenges soon emerged. Following a disappointing early exit at the All England Open in March, tensions and irreconcilable differences surfaced within the partnership. The Badminton Association of Malaysia (BAM) confirmed their split, leading the World No. 4 (at the time) pair to temporarily part ways. They even competed with different partners in subsequent events, raising doubts about their future together.

Yet, after a brief period of separation and self-reflection — lasting just a few weeks — Chen and Toh chose to reunite in April 2025. Their reconciliation proved transformative, reigniting their chemistry and making them even more formidable on court. The defining chapter arrived in August 2025 at the BWF World Championships in Paris. Seeded fourth, Chen Tang Jie and Toh Ee Wei delivered an extraordinary run. On Malaysia’s National Day (August 31), they stormed into the mixed doubles final and clinched a historic victory over China’s second-seeded pair Jiang Zhenbang and Wei Yaxin in straight games, 21-15, 21-14. This triumph crowned them Malaysia’s first-ever mixed doubles world champions — and only the second world title in Malaysian badminton history (following the men’s doubles gold in 2022).

In contrast to 2024, the performance of Malaysia’s mixed doubles backup squad in 2025 showed substantial improvement and greater depth compared to previous years, reflecting positive development among the younger talents. While the elite frontline pairs continued to dominate at the highest levels, the backup pairs still faced challenges in breaking into the upper echelons. Notably, no backup pair managed to reach a final in any major BWF World Tour events (Super 300 and above) across the year.

Despite these limitations, the year was filled with encouraging bright spots and clear signs of progress from the emerging younger backup pairs. Many of these talents stepped up impressively at lower-tier tournaments, securing multiple titles and building valuable match experience:

- **Wee Yee Hern / Chan Wen Tse** captured their first career mixed doubles title together at the Thailand International Series.
- **Loh Ziheng / Noraqilah Maisarah** delivered consistent performances, also winning their first title at the Vietnam International Series.
- **Tan Zhi Yang / Nicole Tan** winning their maiden title at the PETRONAS Malaysia International Challenge.
- **Datu Anif / Clarissa San** stood out prominently, clinching the two title at the back-to-back final in Bangladesh.

4 COACHES

The coaching structure in BAM underwent significant changes throughout the 2025 season, particularly with the arrival of several high-profile international coaches who brought fresh expertise and a renewed strategic direction to the national program.

4. Tournament Highlights of The Year 2025

As in previous years, the BWF World Junior Championships in Guwahati, India remained the key focus tournaments for the junior programme in 2025.

The BWF World Junior Championships Team Event were held from 6 to 11 October 2025, where the team delivered a commendable performance by reaching the Quarter Finals, reflecting continued progress and competitiveness at the world level.

The BWF World Junior Championships Individual Events, conducted from 13 to 19 October 2025, saw encouraging results from our junior shuttlers. In the Mixed Doubles (XD) event, Loh Ziheng and Noraqilah Maisarah secured a bronze medal, while in the Women's Doubles (WD) event, Low Zi Yu and Noraqilah Maisarah achieved a silver medal.

These results underscore the steady development of our junior athletes and highlight the effectiveness of the high-performance pathway in producing consistent podium finishes at major international junior championships.

SPORTS SCIENCE & SPORTS MEDICINE

1. Lila wearable resistance

The Sports Science team acquired the Lila wearable resistance system in April 2025. What set Lila's wearable resistance apart from other commercial wearable resistance devices was its unique design and comfort. Unlike traditional resistance gear, the Lila system was designed to feel like an extension of the body. It conformed to the natural movements of the wearer, allowing for greater mobility and less restriction during training. This made it an excellent choice for athletes who required fluid movement while performing high-intensity activities such as badminton. The wearable resistance system was trialed within the Women's Singles department, specifically to evaluate its effectiveness in improving change of direction (COD) ability. The system was tested by having players perform a four-corners change of direction test before beginning wearable resistance training. After a 12 weeks training period, the same COD test was repeated to assess improvements in agility and court speed. The objective of implementing the Lila wearable resistance system was to bridge gym-based strength with on-court speed. The picture below illustrates the improvements in COD test performance among the players after 12 weeks of implementation.

3. Continuous education

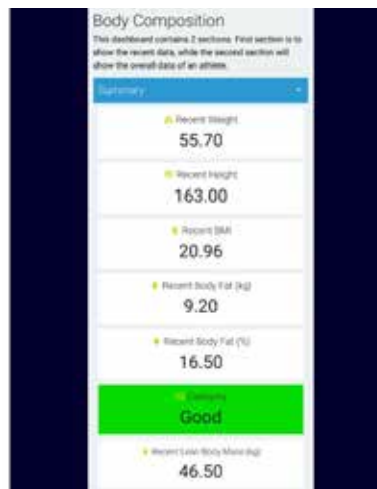
To align with the proposed plan for continuous education among the junior players, the Sports Science Department conducted a workshop titled *“Health-Related & Skill-Related Components: A Reflection & Feedback Session”* on 25th February 2025. The following week, the Sports Medicine Department conducted a workshop focused on stretching techniques.

4. Nutrition dashboard

After discussions with the nutritionist and data analyst, the data analyst successfully created a body composition dashboard in Athlete Management System (AMS). This dashboard allowed both players and staff to access athlete body composition data in a clear and organized manner, along with their longitudinal data for better tracking and analysis over time. By visualizing trends and changes in body composition, the dashboard helped support informed decision-making related to training load, nutrition planning, and overall athlete health. This tool also improved communication between coaches, nutritionists, and athletes by providing easy access to relevant information.

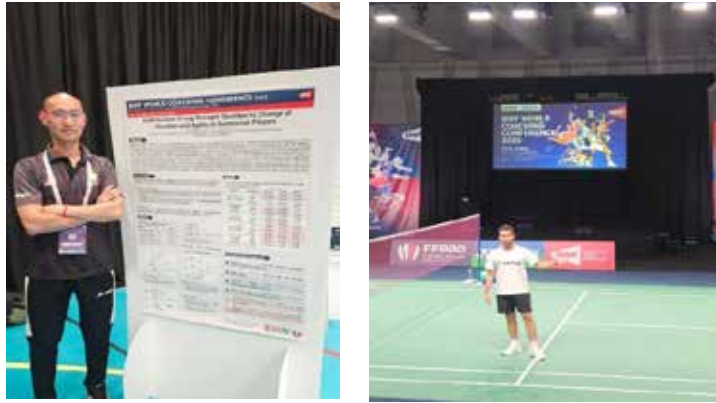


Picture 4: Nutrition dashboard in AMS

5. Poster presentation at BWF coaching conference

The BAM part-time strength and conditioning coach and consultant presented a poster research project at the BWF World Coaching Conference, in collaboration with BWF and Tunku Abdul Rahman University of

Management and Technology (TARUMT). The study, conducted with BAM players as subjects, explored key contributors to change of direction and agility performance in badminton. The conference also featured a session by Cristian Luque (former China S&C coach), who shared strategies for monitoring training load, managing fatigue, and optimizing athlete performance.

6. Altitude training for world junior players

As part of their preparation for upcoming international competitions, the World Junior single players participated in altitude training using a hypoxic tent from 8/9/2025, aiming for at least six sessions of altitude training before departing for India. This special tent simulated the conditions of training at high altitude by reducing the amount of oxygen in the air. Training in a low-oxygen environment forced the body to adapt by working more efficiently to deliver oxygen to the muscles. Over time, this helped improve muscle endurance, stamina, and recovery, which were important qualities for badminton athletes. By doing cycling and other cardio exercises inside the tent, players gained the benefits of high-altitude training without having to leave the country. This method was commonly used by elite athletes around the world to gain a competitive edge.

7. Sports science and medicine staff giving support services during tournaments

During last year's national and international tournaments, the Sports Science and Medicine team provided comprehensive on-site support services to athletes to support performance and overall well-being. These services included strength and conditioning guidance, physiotherapy treatment, post-match massage, and various recovery interventions such as stretching, compression boots and mobility work to help athletes maintain physical readiness throughout the competitions. The team also worked closely with coaches and players to monitor athlete readiness, manage injuries, and implement individualized recovery and rehabilitation strategies when needed. Through continuous communication and on-site assessments, the Sports Science and Medicine team played an important role in minimizing injury risk, promoting faster recovery, and ensuring athletes were able to perform at their best during both national and international tournaments.

8. Tensiomyography (TMG) test for RTG athletes

This assessment was a collaborative effort between ISN and BAM for the Road to Gold (RTG) athletes. Tensiomyography (TMG) was a non-invasive technique used to evaluate muscle stiffness and contractile properties, particularly by comparing the dominant and non-dominant sides. The procedure involved delivering a controlled electrical stimulus to the muscle belly to measure how quickly the muscle contracted and relaxed. The findings were then communicated to the Strength and Conditioning (S&C) coach to identify underactive or imbalanced muscle groups and to develop targeted training interventions aimed at improving muscular performance and reducing injury risk.

9. Physical profiling test for new juniors

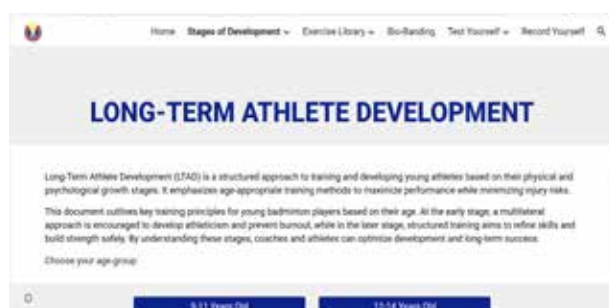
At the end of the year, physical profiling was conducted for the Talent Identification group, which included both singles and doubles junior players. Physical performance was one of the aspects coaches used to evaluate athletes, as it provided objective information to support training decisions and long-term development planning. As part of this assessment, a series of commonly administered tests were carried out to measure the players' physical capabilities across multiple performance domains. These tests included the 20 m sprint test to evaluate speed, the 4 Corners COD test to assess change-of-direction ability, the countermovement jump (CMJ) test to measure lower-body power, the multi-rebound test to examine reactive strength, and the 1.2 km running test to determine aerobic endurance. Collecting these baseline physical data points was important for potential junior players, as it provided a clear snapshot of their current physical status.

10. Publishing of Long Term Athlete Development (LTAD) website

The LTAD website was designed to provide coaches, parents, and athletes with a comprehensive resource. It included an exercise library based on the stages of growth in youth athletes, introduced the concept of biological age and its importance in talent identification, and outlined common pitfalls during youth development: such as inadequate caloric intake. These key concepts were important to understand when working with youth athletes, as fluctuations in biological profiles during puberty, combined with increased training loads associated with higher levels of performance, were all factors that increased the risk of injury. Through this website, users were provided with the necessary tools to help youth athletes progress in a sustainable manner.

11. Roadshow to different states

The Head of Sports Science and Medicine together with the single and doubles coach director visited several states (including Negeri Sembilan, Johor and Melaka) to share the concept of youth physical development and to introduce the details of the LTAD website published by BAM. During these sharing sessions, badminton coaches discussed the key qualities they look for in junior badminton athletes, including fundamental skills such as footwork and grip technique, which serve as essential foundational skill for long-term development. From the sports science perspective, the session was divided into theory and practical components. The theory section covered important topics such as the concept of stress–recovery–adaptation, biological age, and talent identification. Meanwhile, the practical session focused on fundamental unilateral bodyweight strength exercises, including the skater squat, as well as jump and landing techniques. Coaches were also guided on how to appropriately regress and progress each exercise to match the athlete’s developmental stage and physical readiness.

Each state able to send 4 singles & 3 doubles per event & take effect into 2nd half of 2025 calendar.



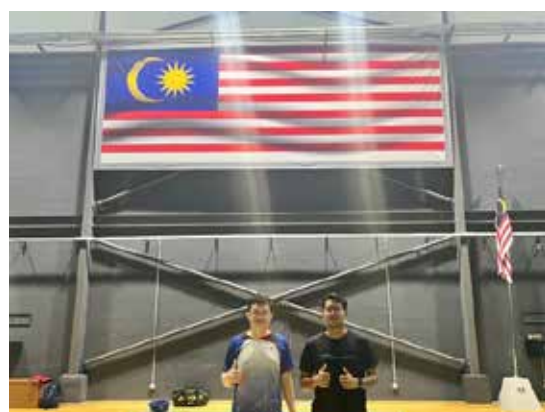
2. Development Program – State Coach attachment at BAM

3. Road Show

The **Badminton Roadshow** aims to promote the development of badminton at the grassroots level by engaging players, coaches, and parents through structured on-court activities and educational sessions. In addition, the programme seeks to enhance coaching standards through the application of sports science, identify young potential talent, and strengthen collaboration between State Coaches and parents.

The on-court component consists of structured training activities, during which Coaching Directors from the Badminton Association of Malaysia (BAM) Coach **Kenneth Jonassen (Singles)** and Coach **Rexy Mainaky (Doubles)** provided immediate technical feedback and guidance to both players and coaches.

The program was followed by sparring sessions across various age groups, allowing the Technical Directors to observe young players as they showcased their potential. After the sessions concluded, the Technical Directors engaged in two-way communication with State and Club coaches on key aspects on & off the court.

The educational sessions were led by **Mr Koh Weat Teck**, who introduced the **BAM Google Site**, a platform designed to streamline physical training while incorporating sports science elements. These sessions aimed to enhance understanding of key aspects of player development and performance, involving both coaches and parents.

Topics shared and discussed during the sessions included:

- Learning and growth spurts (LTAD)
- The importance of progression and regression in training
- Injury prevention strategies
- The critical role of rest in athlete development
- Utilisation of body weight exercises and correct technique execution

The sessions took 5.5 hours to complete & fostered a collaborative learning environment and helped align understanding among all stakeholders on best practices in athlete development.

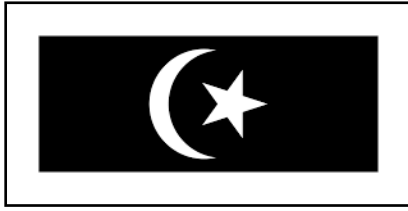

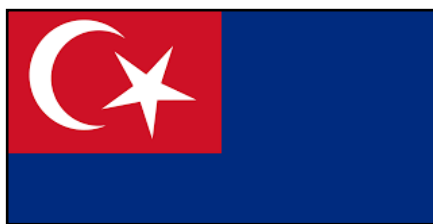

4. Re-working BAM Coaching content

BAM Level 2 & 3– Module discussion	19 – 22 June, 2025

The Coaching Education Panel (CEP), led by **YM Dr Tengku Fadilah Tengku Kamalden**, had discussions with relevant national coaches to review and rework the BAM Coaching Course Level 2 and Level 3 syllabus for implementation in 2026.

This initiative aims to ensure that the revised content meets the evolving demands of high-performance coaching and contributes to the development of more capable and knowledgeable coaches.

For 2026, the objective is to certify all local **National and State Coaches**, enabling them to apply updated training methods in their daily coaching practices.

The programme will be conducted over a **one-year period** for National Coaches, taking into account their tournament schedules. During this period, coaches will be required to complete assignment.



5. BAM Coaching Course Level 2 – Performance Analysis

The first topic delivered was **Performance Analysis (PA)**. **Dr. Tengku Fadilah** coordinated the session by arranging **speakers** from the **National Sports Institute (ISN)**, led by Mr Muhammad Hazwan Abd Rahman, along with Ms Lau Jia Yi and Ms Nur Zulbillah, who conducted the session and shared their expertise with the coaches.

The program utilized the coaches half-day schedule, with sessions held on **Wednesdays for Doubles** and **Thursdays for Singles**. The session lasted a total of **four (4) hours**.

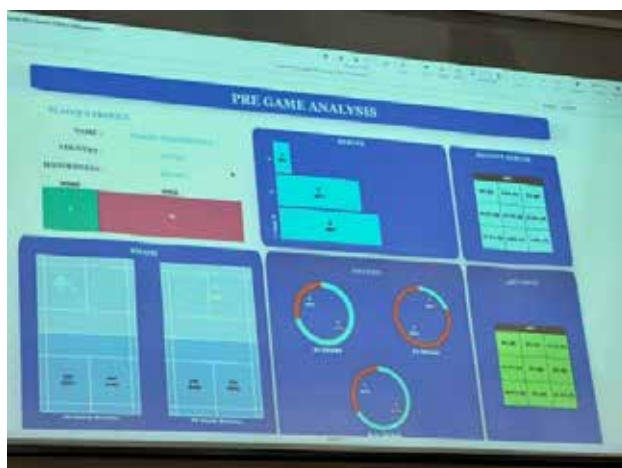
Two-way communication between the coaches and speakers throughout the program, allowing them to share wide range of ideas and viewpoints were discussed, providing valuable insights and promoting knowledge exchange among the coaches.

Towards the end of the course, national coaches were given assignments to complete. These assignments are intended to reinforce key learning points, encourage practical application of the concepts discussed, and support their continuous development.

Coaches are required to complete and submit the assignments within the given timeframe for further review and follow-up

This program highlight the following:

- Introduce video analysis tools to track technical and tactical patterns
- Record and interpret match statistics to identify performance gaps
- Analyse opponent tendencies and match trends
- Break down rallies to understand scoring opportunities and weaknesses
- Apply data-driven methods to design training sessions
- Provide clearer, more accurate feedback to athletes using match statistic
- Enhance long-term athlete development using measurable performance indicators.

1 BAM SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORMS

- 1.1 BAM's digital presence continued its upward trajectory throughout 2025. As at 31 December 2025, BAM recorded a combined following of 730,000 across its key platforms - Facebook, Instagram, X (Twitter) and YouTube.

2 ACTIVITIES

2.1 Strategic Communications

- 2.1.1 Throughout the year, the Committee continued to produce concise content highlighting BAM's high-performance environment at the PETRONAS Akademi Badminton Malaysia (ABM), as well as the contributions of coaches, athletes and support staff.

2.2 Tournaments, Marketing Campaigns & Fan Engagement

- 2.2.1 The Committee supported and executed integrated marketing and communications campaigns for BAM's major tournaments in 2025, including the PETRONAS Malaysia Open 2025 and PERODUA Malaysia Masters 2025 presented by Daihatsu. These campaigns combined digital content, media engagement and coordinated branding efforts to maximise reach and public awareness.

Promotional efforts contributed to ticket sales performances across both tournaments. Digital content, including match highlights, short-form videos and behind-the-scenes features, recorded 1.2 million of views cumulatively across BAM's platforms, reinforcing the effectiveness of digital media as a key engagement channel.

2.3 National Team Campaigns & International Events

- 2.3.1 The Committee continued to provide digital coverage of national team participation at major international tournaments. This included the production of daily vlog series, athlete features and behind-the-scenes content at events such as the Badminton Asia Mixed Team Championships 2025, Sudirman Cup, and junior international tournaments.

Content from these campaigns generated strong engagement, with selected series exceeding 2.7 million views, reflecting interest from fans in athlete journeys and competition narratives.

2.4 Media Relations & Stakeholder Engagement

2.4.1 Media relations and stakeholder engagement remained a core focus. The Committee coordinated media coverage for key milestones, including the homecoming of Malaysia's 2025 World Champions, and supported informal engagements between BAM leadership and members of the sports media.



In addition, the Committee supported partnership announcements and sponsor-related engagements, ensuring consistent messaging, branding alignment and media exposure for BAM and its partners.



2.5 Commercial Support, Grants & Revenue Generation

2.5.1 In line with its expanded mandate, the Committee played an active role in supporting BAM's commercial sustainability through grant facilitation and revenue-generating initiatives.

During the year, BAM successfully secured government funding from the Ministry of Youth & Sports (KBS) through the Geran Padanan Sukan (GPS) and from the Kumpulan Wang Amanah Sukan Negara (KWASN) to support tournament hosting and operational requirements.

From a commercial perspective, the Committee contributed to revenue generation through the monetisation of tournament assets, including the sale of in-venue advertising inventory and sponsorship placements at BAM-hosted tournaments. Collectively, these initiatives supported the securing of over RM710,000 in government grants and generated in excess of RM550,000 in commercial revenue.

2.6 Merchandising

2.6.1 Building on initial efforts in the previous year, the Committee led the continued rollout of official BAM and tournament merchandise in 2025. Merchandise initiatives were implemented at selected major tournaments, with a curated range of items introduced to enhance fan engagement and diversify revenue streams.

These initiatives recorded total merchandise sales of approximately RM47,000, surpassing the initial budget utilised for setup and production.



BUILDING AND FACILITIES

PETRONAS ACADEMY BADMINTON MALAYSIA



MANAGEMENT OF PABM

The Petronas Academy Badminton Malaysia (PABM) operations and maintenance is being fully managed by Badminton Association Malaysia (BAM) from 2017 till now. The building belongs to Kementerian Belia dan Sukan (KBS) and overseen by Perbadanan Stadium Malaysia (PSM). PSM has agreed to reduce the monthly rental of PABM building since BAM is maintaining the facility fully. BAM will be renewing the Tenancy Agreement with PSM for another 3 years term as the current Tenancy Agreement ends in December 2025.

1.1 MANAGEMENT OF PABM BUILDING CLEANLINESS AND SECURITY

The property maintenance cleaning in PABM is undertaken by JEP Cleaning Services Sdn Bhd. There are 8 cleaners provided by the supplier to manage the overall cleanliness and landscaping activities in PABM. Facility Department ensures that all cleaning activity is performed according to BAM requirements. The security management is undertaken by Watchman Security Sdn Bhd. There are four Nepalese guards stationed in PABM. They work on 12-hour shift managing the security of PABM with 2 people covering each shift.

1.2 FACILITY MAINTENANCE

1.2.1 PABM PEST CONTROL MANAGEMENT

Pest control activities are carried out by Rentokil. Basically, fogging and other pest control activities are carried out once a month and if the need arises Rentokil will come in to resolve any issues upon request.

1.2.2 PABM LIFT SERVICES MAINTENANCE

There are 3 lifts in service in PABM. One service and two passenger lifts. The maintenance of the lifts is undertaken by Shiyou Elevator MFG Sdn. Bhd. The maintenance is carried out monthly which includes DOSH safety inspection. For 2025 there were no incidences of lift failure.

1.2.3 PABM CAFE

- i) The food for the players is prepared in PABM Cafe kitchen. Breakfast, lunch and dinner are served to the players. Effective 15 September 2025, the operation of the café was undertaken by Salad Atelier from MSN Cafe. MSN Café has been operating the café in PABM since 2017 until September 2025.
- ii) The Café was repainted and interior lighting was changed to enhance the overall image. Motivational quotes were also hung on the wall, and the glass windows were tinted to ensure a cooling atmosphere.
- iii) The café maintenance for the grease trap system is maintained by Indah Kota Engineering Sdn Bhd where 12 services are carried out per annum. The maintenance includes servicing one main grease tank and 3 units of grease septic tanks.



1.2.4 PABM COURTS

There is total 18 courts in PABM. All the courts are full utilized by players training in the daytime and public at nighttime. As the courts are more than 8 years old the wear and tear on the courts are beginning to appear. Contractors and Facility Department inspected the courts from the 3rd of March 2025 till 6th March 2025, and six damaged courts were repaired. The courts repaired are Court # 1, Court # 11, Court # 15, Court # 16, Court # 17 and Court # 18. Further facility department undertook to paint worn out wall and inspection and labelling of the 18 courts were done.



1.2.5 PABM FIRE SYSTEM MAINTENANCE

The fire system in PABM is maintained by Facility Department together with Program Engineering Sdn. Bhd. every 2 months once. On the 18th of June 2025, the personnel from Taman Tun Fire Department carried out an inspection at PABM and all items were in order. They inspected:

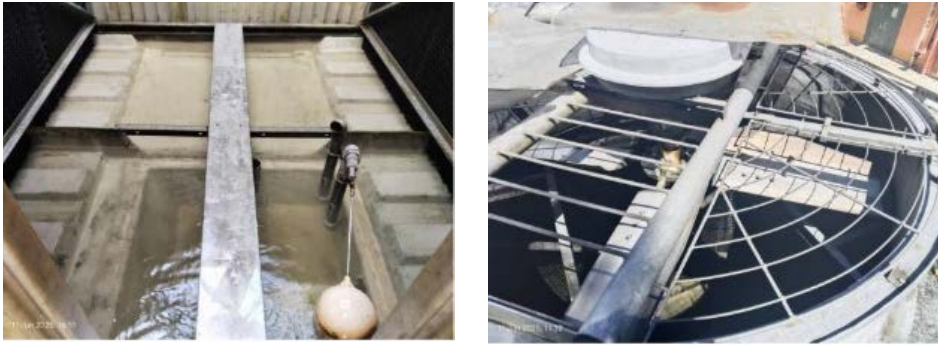
- Hydrants/Fire Hoses/Fire Access

1.2.6 PABM HVAC SYSTEM MAINTENANCE AND WATER TANK

The main water tank supplying water to PABM was cleaned by contractor under the supervision of facility department. It took 2 days for the system to be fully cleaned. Upon cleaning the water quality was tested and it met the requirements.

The maintenance of the cooling tower was undertaken by the facility department. The chillers maintenance was undertaken by Witco Chemicals as per schedule.



A major servicing and cleaning of all the AC units in PABM was undertaken from the 26th of November until 26th December 2025. Chemical cleaning for the AC's was carried out.

- All AC's from 3rd floor till 7th floor
- Gymnasium/Office/Control Room/Physiotherapy Room/Conference Room/Library
- All compressor rooms/Café/VIP dining room



1.2.7 PABM CIVIL WORKS

- i) The badminton court roof gutter was repaired.
- ii) Repair of damaged tiles in the hostel rooms and other areas of PABM.
- iii) Painting of Mechanical rooms door.
- iv) Repair of damaged drain at Level 2 of PABM.
- v) Monkey Ladder was added for easy access to badminton court roof.
- vi) Installation of parabolic mirror for safety at the road junctions leading to PABM.
- vii) Plant box repair at Level 2 PABM.
- viii) Replace new water meter at the water intake pipe.

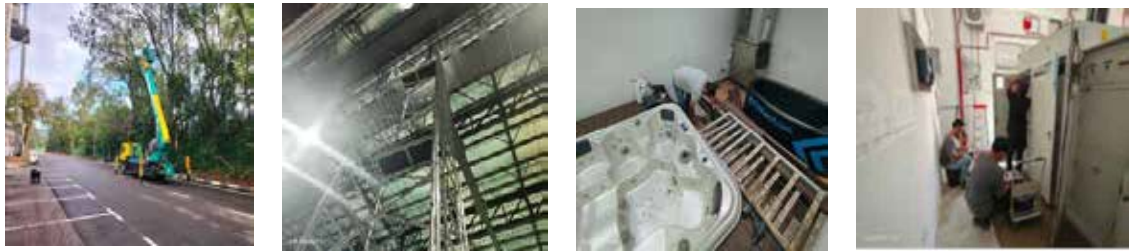
1.2.8 PABM ELECTRICAL WORKS AND USAGE

- i) To enhance the safety of the players and improve the overall safety management of the premises an access card system was implemented. All staff and players were given access cards to access the premises. Further several additional CCTV were added to the premises to further enhance the safety and security management of PABM. The access card control was installed in the ground floor, first floor and second floor consisting of 6 online locations and 7 stand alone units. The access card control system was implemented effective 2nd September 2025. Further additional 9 units of CCTV were installed in PABM in hostel corridors, gymnasium area and entrance of parking.



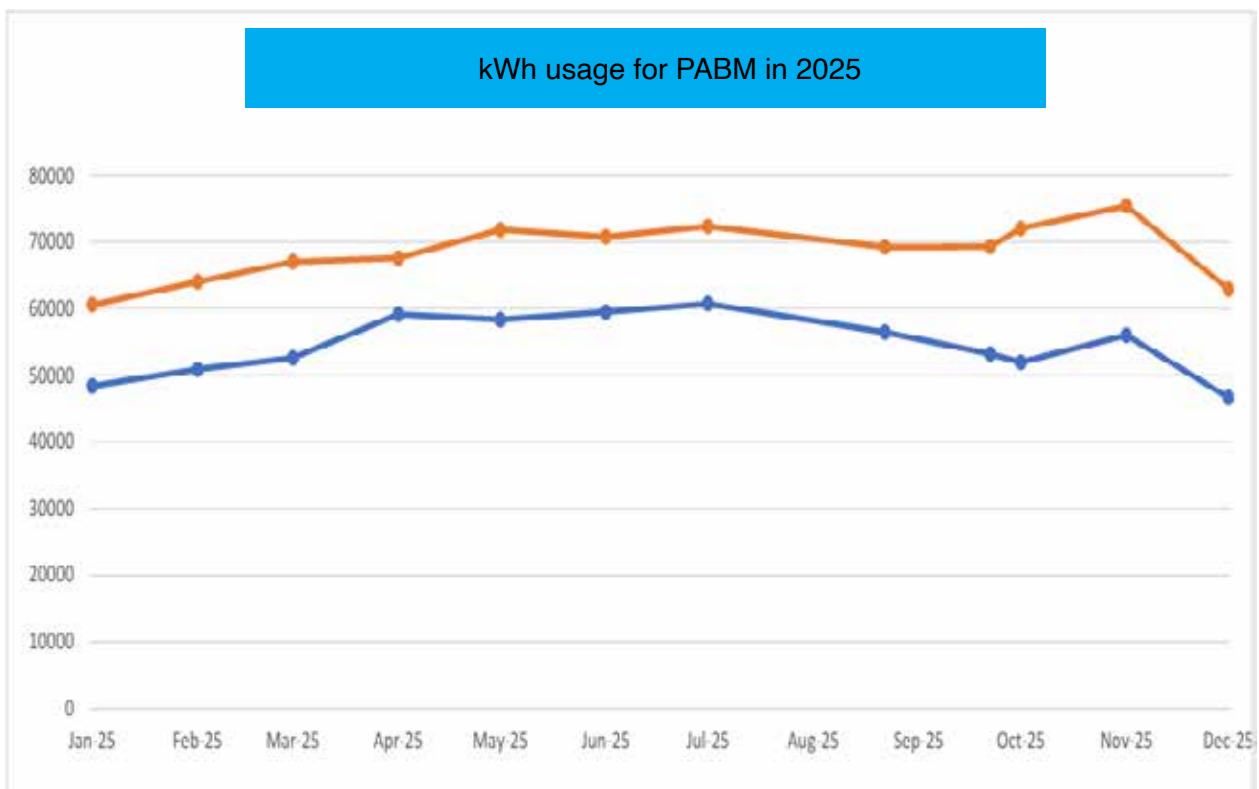
Access Cards Control System and CCTV installation.

- iii) The overall electrical usage in kWh for PABM for 2025 is as below for MB1 and MB2.

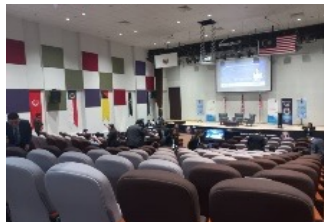
